# **OUR LADY OF RANSOM**

22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the Year – Year A – Divine Office Wk 2 29<sup>th</sup> / 30<sup>th</sup> August 2020



I caught the fright of my life. The burial went as well as any burial can go. The family thanked me. I wished them well, turned around and...and shock. For the grave behind me was that of one of my students, Joel, his little picture of himself on the stone. I never knew he had died. I have asked around and no-one seems to know what happened. For I remember Joel with some affection and tinges of non-affection. He was mischievous, often the ring-leader if there was trouble and quite lippy when confronted. Despite all that, we got on quite well.

He had a difficult home life, but what I loved about him was that aside from his machismo, he loved looking after the smaller children. With them he was tender, kind, gentle, helpful, supportive, protective, and never worried about what his mates thought. He just did what was right by them. You would never have thought he was the same young man I describe above. But both are true. How? Why?

I suspect Joel had an inner voice which he knew was correct. The voice of God, conscience, vocation possibly. But being with his mates encouraged him to ignore that inner voice, maybe due to peer pressure, peer needs, in-fighting to be the top-man,... and so on. Jeremiah agonizes over this in the first reading.

Joel could change his way of thinking when he was with the smaller children to an arguably much more Godly way of being. If only he could have been more that way with his mates. Maybe human ways took over. May Joel rest in peace.

Jesus wants Peter to change his way of thinking, from that of a kind of machismo violent warrior, to appreciate the kingdom will come about, not through machismo and muscles, but through suffering, death and resurrection. Jesus' rebuke to Peter is a pretty blistering one...get behind me Satan. Peter obviously struggles, yet, we know he can go deep, as we saw earlier when he intuits Jesus as the Christ.

Jeremiah's mind-blowing dramatic words today say it all. Trouble happens when we ignore those deeper resonances. We don't always want them, but they are there forcing a struggle, sometimes between our human ideas, and God's. Never easy. How do we cope?



# ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

**Category 2** - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

**Category 3** - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.



# READINGS AT MASS - 22<sup>nd</sup> SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

# First reading – Jeremiah 20:7-9

## The word of the Lord has meant insult for me.

You have seduced me, Lord, and I have let myself be seduced; you have overpowered me: you were the stronger. I am a daily laughing-stock, everybody's butt. Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: "Violence and ruin!" The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long. I used to say, "I will not think about him, I will not speak in his name any more" Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones. The effort to restrain it wearied me, I could not bear it.

# Psalm 62

# For you my soul is thirsting, O Lord my God.

- O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting.
   My body pines for you like a dry, weary land without water. (R.)
- So I gaze on you in the sanctuary
   To see your strength and your glory
   For your love is better than life,
   My lips will speak of your praise. (R.)
- So I will bless you all my life,
   In your name I will lift up my hands.
   My soul shall be filled as with a banquet

# Second reading - Romans 12:1-2

# Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice.

# Gospel - Matthew 16:20-27

## 'Get behind me, Satan!'

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. "Heaven preserve you, Lord" he said. "This must not happen to you." But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's."

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life? "For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour."
