OUR LADY OF RANSOM

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary – Year A – Divine Office Wk 4

15th / 16th August 2020



A group of pilgrims was flying home from Fatima carrying a beautiful statue of Our Lady of Fatima that they had bought there. They loved it. But the plane hit some frightening turbulence over the South of France. So they cried 'Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us'. Hmm! Surely there is only one 'Our Lady'.

But she does carry a huge number of titles. Very often seen as 'queen' of something. So, as queen, we put her on a pedestal, often with pious eyes looking up to heaven, and dress her in blue and white, processions etc.

This can all be very beautiful, but spiritually, quite dodgy. For by putting Mary on a pedestal (as with the Saints, even Our Lord Himself), we can distance her from ourselves. She is 'up there' while we are 'down here'. Yet the whole essence of Our Lady, is that she is the simple Nazarene peasant girl who struggled as we struggle. As her Son became one just like ourselves and struggled, she is already one like us, chosen by God for a task equal to none. It cannot possibly have been easy

Her struggles must identify with our own. This 'strange' pregnancy – how embarrassing! What humiliation would she face from the neighbours? The ensuing gossip. And execution though stoning with her hair being ripped out, for the pregnancy wasn't through Joseph, but another. The penalty is death. Yet despite all this, her tremendous faith allows her to be a woman of action and profound contemplative prayer, surrender and responsibility, grace and ownership, totally self-confident and self-assured. We witness this through the Gospels. And the extraordinary prayer we hear today, the Magnificat, surely shows why she is so extraordinary. Her struggles are our struggles. Political, social, economic and religious liberations proclaimed with total faith that God will triumph, she is a totally liberated woman, liberating all humanity.

So Mary is a woman of the world, struggling, yet completely open to grace. She struggles, yet lets <u>no</u> personal plans and needs get in the way between her and God's mission for her. Maybe that is why she is assumed into heaven first. So before we put her on a pedestal, let her struggles identify with ours, so we have an amazing example to follow, and we can know the same assumption waits for us.

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.



READINGS AT MASS – THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

First reading – Apocalypse 11:19,12:1-6,10

A great sign appeared in heaven: a woman adorned with the sun

The sanctuary of God in heaven opened and the ark of the covenant could be seen inside it. Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman, adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown. She was pregnant, and in labour, crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth. Then a second sign appeared in the sky, a huge red dragon which had seven heads and ten horns, and each of the seven heads crowned with a coronet. Its tail dragged a third of the stars from the sky and dropped them to the earth, and the dragon stopped in front of the woman as she was having the child, so that he could eat it as soon as it was born from its mother. The woman brought a male child into the world, the son who was to rule all the nations with an iron sceptre, and the child was taken straight up to God and to his throne, while the woman escaped into the desert, where God had made a place of safety ready.

Second reading - 1 Corinthians 15:20-26

Christ will be brought to life as the first-fruits and then those who belong to him

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death, for everything is to be put under his feet.

Gospel - Luke 1:39-56

The Almighty has done great things for me

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

And Mary said:

'My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord and my spirit exults in God my saviour; because he has looked upon his lowly handmaid.

Yes, from this day forward all generations will call me blessed,

for the Almighty has done great things for me.

Holy is his name,
