'Go to hell! What a charming expression! I find it interesting that in the entire history of our Catholic Church, not a single person has ever been declared to be in hell. Judas, Hitler, Hussein...whoever. You name them, people who did very evil things, yet not one has the church pronounced as being in hell. Why?

Possibly because we hold out for 'universal restoration', where God's love is so perfect, so victorious, so patient, that in fact He will finally win out in every single person's life. (The ancient word for universal restoration is apokatastasis - impress your friends with that one!) The wise men and women of the early church believed in it. Many may not like the idea, preferring a 'tit-for-tat' God. But Jesus' parables certainly teach it – the sinner getting to heaven before us, etc. Would God be that great if his love didn't win out eventually? Pretty lousy God otherwise! It may take an 'eternity', but God's love will eventually convince everyone to choose Him rather than the cold and darkness of anything else. This universal restoration must surely be the meaning of Our Lord's resurrection: that God will turn all our human agonies and crucifixions into resurrection joys. Everyone will 'eventually' choose the light. How long is 'eventually' or 'eternity'- who knows? Biblically, eternity is not forever and ever, but has deeper meanings, which can be explained another time.

So, no-one has been declared in hell. But yes, our Catholic Church canonizes saints, declaring them to be in heaven. As our models, we are called to imitate them, to follow their example. Not to leave them on pedestals, but to do as they did. We ask them to intercede through our efforts in following their examples.


Any Saint will confess that through profound faith and trust in Our Lord, totally honest and open about their dark sides – ie. sins, weaknesses, stupidities, their hells - healing happens. Tough, but liberating. Then, grace abounds. It leads to true wholeness, true holiness. That can be us too.

Can it be true that heaven and hell are separated by an act of consciousness?

In line with guidance issued by the Department for Health and Social Care, we will keep your details safely and in compliance with GDPR legislation for 21 days before securely disposing of or deleting them. We will only share your details with NHS Test and Trace, if asked, in the event that it is needed to help stop the spread of coronavirus. We will not use your details for any other purposes or pass them on to anyone else. They are totally confidential. Thank you for your understanding.

You will need to download the app on your mobile phone. QR posters are on the Church doors in the Entrance. You will need the App to access these. This allows for your personal details to be electronically sent to Test and Trace, without the need to write details on forms.

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into.

Category 1 - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

ROBOSCAMMERS

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM COLD CALLING

With more people now working from home than ever before, you may have recently become more aware of the number of nuisance calls to your landline or mobile phone.

Robocallers are likely to have increased during lockdown, as they do not rely on human call centres.



Many of these calls are computer generated making them cheap and difficult to trace. The pre-recorded messages are often designed to scare people into handing over money or personal details—this includes the Amazon Prime scam and HMRC scams. These calls will often ask you to "Press 1 to speak to someone".

HOW TO STOP UNWANTED CALLS

- BT: The free BT Call Protect service monitors nuisance calls and sends them straight to junk voicemail. BT says it blocks 99 per cent of pest calls.
- Sky: Free service Talk Shield stops fraudsters by insisting all callers provide a name.
- Talk Talk: CallSafe screens and blocks unwanted calls for free.
- Plusnet: Call Protect is free and blocks unwanted calls from a list that you can add to.
- EE: Landline customers can block up to ten numbers at a time using the free Choose to Refuse option, which bars the last call answered. Dial 14258 and press ** when asked to confirm.
- Virgin: You may be able to blacklist, silence or block calls, depending on your phone.
- Mobile phones: Download free apps such as Truecaller, Whoscall and Hiya to block dodgy calls and alert firms to possible scammers.

 Complain: By making a complaint about a robocall, you can help to stop them. Experts recommend directing complaints to three bodies: the ICO, by calling 0303 123 1113, visiting ico.org.uk/make-a-complaint, or writing to ICO, Wycliffe House, Water Lane, Wilmslow, Cheshire SK9 5AF; the Telephone Preference Service, by calling 0345 070 0707 or visiting tpsonline.org.uk/complaint, or Ofcom, by calling 0300 123 3333 or visiting ofcom.org.uk/complaints


