OUR LADY OF RANSOM

Our Lord Jesus Christ the King – Year A – Divine Office Wk 2 – 21st / 22nd November 2020



Sam was not a very nice person. He died and went to hell. He was missed by old friends. His work's manager went to hell to see if he could bring him back. He pleaded profusely, no luck. So his football captain went, he begged that he may play football for one more season. No joy. His parish priest went and declared that he wasn't that bad, so please give him another chance! Nothing. Many others did the same, begging Satan to *let him out*. Still no joy. Then his mother went. She spoke no word of his release. Quietly, and with a strange catch in her voice, she said to Satan, *let me in*. The doors opened, and immediately she found herself redeeming her son. Only love can penetrate the gates of hell and redeem the lost.

Perhaps this image may help us understand Jesus' own descent into hell, showing his refusal to accept our choice of personal destruction. Our God is <u>so</u> loving that he will wait for however much time it takes, he will suffer hell with us, until the final person has made a choice for Him. And yet we have words like "eternal" and "punishment". Is it really "eternal"? Is really "punishment"?

These are clearly mistranslations, maybe used to instil fear and control. The word eternal is the original word *aion*, (like our word eon), which can mean an indeterminate period of time, or an intensity of experience. Time goes quickly when we're happy, slowly when we're bored - intensity of experience. Quality of time, not quantity. The original word for punishment is the word *kolasis*, referring to the pruning of branches so a plant can flourish. It's also a therapeutic word connected with healing. So when Jesus refers to "eternal punishment", a better translation might be – *an unspecified time of pruning that involves an intense experience of correction and healing*. Maybe more akin to our purgatory. However much "time" it takes, it's God's time – not ours. God *will* bring healing in God's time – not our concept of time. The only occasions "forever" is mentioned in the Scriptures is when referring to God himself... makes sense.




We so need to understand our Scriptures and see the pattern of teaching that is going on, rather than take phrases out of context, and "think" we understand!

Our loving Christ is redeeming "everything" - everyone". Our prayers in the Mass declare it, our faith professes it. Surely that is why he is Christ the Kinq.



ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.



READINGS AT MASS – CHRIST THE KING

First reading – Ezekiel 34:11-12,15-17

The Lord will judge between sheep and sheep

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest – it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them.



As for you, my sheep, the Lord says this: I will judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and he-goats.

Second reading - 1 Corinthians 15:20-26,28

Christ will hand over the kingdom to God the Father; so that God may be all in all

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death, for everything is to be put under his feet. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

Alleluia, alleluia!

Blessings on the coming kingdom of our father David!

Gospel - Matthew 25: 31-46

I was naked and you clothed me; sick, and you visited me

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left.

Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me."

'Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me."
