The Baptism of the Lord – Year B – Divine Office Wk 1 – 9th / 10th January 2021



Little Joey wanted £15 to go out for the day with his friends. Cinema, burger, sweets... How was he going to get the money? His friend suggested he give his mother a bill for 'jobs' he had done. So he wrote:

Mrs. Lee owes Joey Lee – 'for going to the shops 3 times - £5; for putting little Stevie to bed 3 times - £5; for cleaning the gas stove and floor - £5. Total, £15.

He put this bill by his mother's bed.

Next morning, Joey found the following note by his bed: Joey owes Mrs. Lee – for being loved to bits - £0.00; for working so very hard nursing Joey through sickness, cooking for, and clothing for 9 years - £0.00; for giving her life over and again for Joey's welfare - £0.00. Total, £0.00 Big tears came to Joey's eyes, he gave mum a big hug, she welled up too.

Like little Joey, it can be so hard to believe God's love and forgiveness are free. Free. Again – <u>free</u>. We still believe we have to earn, deserve or merit God's favour. Maybe because we live in a capitalist culture where nothing is free, we superimpose that thought onto our faith. Please don't. It makes a mockery of the faith and of our loving God. Jesus did not earn God's favour. He simply knew with one hundred percent conviction to be a true and full Son of God.

The same must be for us. But because we do not *really* believe it, sin creeps in. Jesus knew, so he was sinless. God wants to bestow his favour on all of us, but until we really experience this amazing free love as His true daughters and sons, nothing much will happen. We will keep doing things that are not of God, and keep repeating them. Experiencing this sonship or daughtership, this extraordinary love, means sins like stealing, gossiping, criticising, judging, or hurting anyone – they just make no sense anymore. God's love is experienced with authentic humility, letting go of pride and arrogance so God's love can fill us.

His love is free. Again – **free**. Jesus' baptism marks his free solidarity with us all, entering a sinful world, to freely redeem us from where we are. We too are called to try and experience real son or daughtership **now**, so God's favour can rest on us. How best can we strive to really experience being sons and daughters, such love? And so free.



ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.



Essex Police Fraud Alert System



BEWARE OF VACCINATION SCAMS

With the rollout of the Covid-19 vaccine beginning this week, residents are warned of criminals seeking to exploit the pandemic further.

11th December 2020

Fake Text Messages & Calls

Basildon has been one of the worst affected areas in Essex for Coronavirus and as a result, scammers have been targeting residents with fake text messages. Essex Trading Standards have warned that the messages ask residents to click a link in order to book their vaccination, before proceeding to take personal details and payment requests.

The Covid-19 vaccination is free and you will never be asked for payment.

In other parts of the country, people have also received phone calls to book non-existent 'vaccine appointments'. They are asked to confirm their booking by pressing a number on their phone which results in them being billed by their provider.

'VIP' vaccine tickets

Phishing scams continue to circulate, many now claiming to offer 'VIP' vaccination tickets that will allegedly put people at the head of the vaccination queue—for a price. Similar to the scams that have been seen throughout the pandemic, they will often ask you to click on a link or provide personal/banking details to pay for the ticket.



Remember—if it seems to good to be true, it probably is!

The vaccine is currently being offered to those most at risk, particularly the elderly.

Please pass this information on to anyone you think may be vulnerable to these scams.

READINGS AT MASS – The Baptism of the Lord

First reading – Isaiah 55:1-11

Come to me and your soul will live, and I will make an everlasting covenant with you

Thus says the Lord:

Oh, come to the water all you who are thirsty; though you have no money, come! Buy corn without money, and eat, and, at no cost, wine and milk. Why spend money on what is not bread, your wages on what fails to satisfy? Listen, listen to me, and you will have good things to eat and rich food to enjoy. Pay attention, come to me; listen, and your soul will live. With you I will make an everlasting covenant out of the favours promised to David. See, I have made of you a witness to the peoples, a leader and a master of the nations. See, you will summon a nation you never knew, those unknown will come hurrying to you, for the sake of the Lord your God, of the Holy One of Israel who will glorify you. Seek the Lord while he is still to be found, call to him while he is still near. Let the wicked man abandon his way, the evil man his thoughts. Let him turn back to the Lord who will take pity on him, to our God who is rich in forgiving; for my thoughts are not your thoughts, my ways not your ways – it is the Lord who speaks. Yes, the heavens are as high above earth as my ways are above your ways, my thoughts above your thoughts. Yes, as the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.

- O give the Lord you sons of God, give the Lord glory and power; give the Lord the glory of his name. Adore the Lord in his holy court. (R.)

Second reading - 1 John 5:1-9

Jesus Christ came by water and blood

Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ has been begotten by God; and whoever loves the Father that begot him loves the child whom he begets. We can be sure that we love God's children if we love God himself and do what he has commanded us; this is what loving God is – keeping his commandments; and his commandments are not difficult, because anyone who has been begotten by God has already overcome the world; this is the victory over the world – our faith. Who can overcome the world? Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God: Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only,

but with water and blood; with the Spirit as another witness – since the Spirit is the truth – so that there are three witnesses, the Spirit, the water and the blood, and all three of them agree. We accept the testimony of human witnesses, but God's testimony is much greater, and this is God's testimony, given as evidence for his Son.

Alleluia, alleluia!
The heavens opened and the Father's voice resounded:
"This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him."
Alleluia!



Gospel - Mark 1:7-11

'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you'

In the course of his preaching John the Baptist said:

'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

It was at this time that Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptised in the Jordan by John. No sooner had he come up out of the water than he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit, like a dove, descending on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you.'
