OUR LADY OF RANSOM



Palm Sunday – Year B – Divine Office Wk 2 – 27th/28th March 2021

Typhus gripped young Annie in the concentration camp. "No point in struggling" her friends advised, "death comes to us all". But her faith urged her to live.

Delirium, she wandered around the camp, tripping over dead bodies. Her strength fast fading, she noticed a large mound in the misty distance. She felt a strange sensation. Something in that hill became a symbol for life. If she could only reach it, she just might survive, her guts told her. She felt compelled. Crawling on her hands and knees, after long excruciating hours, and managing to stagger to the top, she had reached her destination. Tears rolled down her cheek. Warm, human, real tears. "Daddy" she called, "please help me, I just can't go on." Suddenly a warm and gentle hand caressed her just as she had known years before when going to bed. She recognised the warmth of her daddy's comforting hands. Sobbing more loudly for help, daddy simply caressed her head as she remembered. No blessings, but a simple reply, "you will survive my darling, I still, and will always love you to bits, your liberation is close".

Four days later the war was over. Annie recovered from the typhus and returned to see the mound. She learned that the mound was a huge mass grave. Thousands of victims were buried there, among whom was her father, who had died months before that awful night she agonised there. Annie won her battle with death, and had wept over her father's grave.

Annie's daddy was in total solidarity with her, so she was transformed. She found life. Our crucified God is in total solidarity with every aspect of our human and painful condition. He caresses and loves us even more when we scream for help - he knows. Jesus dies in solidarity, not for our sins, but *with* our sins, failures, mistakes, lies, weaknesses and absurdities – and transforms them all. God suffers in and with his creation – us. Are we open enough to allow this transformation in us?

That is our liberation. It is Jesus, the Lamb of God, "taking away the sin / failure / weakness / lies / absurdity of the world". In a focussed moment of history, in Jesus of Nazareth, we see what is happening in all human history, and how God is transforming it. How is the crucified one transforming our souls? Do we find life through our faith in the crucified one?


IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL DRIVERS ATTENDING MASS... **CONSIDERATION PLEASE!**



FAST COVID-19 TESTING CENTRE IN RAYLEIGH

A fast testing centre, offering the fast Lateral Flow Tests and giving results in around 30 minutes, is open at The MegaCentre, 7 Brook Road, Rayleigh, Essex, SS6 7UT **for people who DO NOT have symptoms** of Covid-19.

Tests are by appointment only. Anyone booking should live in the Rochford area of Essex. Book online through the website (https://www.essex.gov.uk/getting-tested-for-covid-19/if-you-dont-have-symptoms)

If you're not able to book using the online form, you can call 0333 772 6144 to arrange an appointment. Lines are open from 8am to 8pm, every day including Saturday and Sunday. You can also email: booking.confirmation@nhs.net and a member of staff will contact you to arrange an appointment.

Anyone WITH symptoms should book a test on the NHS Test and Trace App or the gov.uk website.

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.
