Ghosts! Do you believe in them? Some people do, often due to personal experience, quite happy with supernatural spirit-world explanations. Others do not, possibly with no such experience, saying it is simply not real, or, if they can't explain it now, that maybe science will sometime. Who knows?



Today we appear to have Jesus the ghost! The account presents some people with a dilemma. If Jesus is risen, and is spirit, what is he doing eating some grilled fish with them? Have you ever eaten a meal with a ghost? A spirit? On the other hand, if he is body, is he just a resuscitated corpse, much like the story of Lazarus?

It appears that Jesus is concerned to show his friends that he is real, he is body, he is embodied. At the same time, when we look at all the stories of Our Lord's Resurrection, we notice that the focus is not on a bodily resuscitation – but a new resurrected body. A new type of body. A body that is open to universal presence, to people everywhere, and at one in the same time. Jesus is the all-available Christ. Those who remember the old catechism may recall the expression the 'glorified body' Jesus is now the all-available Christ.

Have you ever met someone you knew quite well, that you haven't seen for many years? You can see it is them, yet at the same time, they may have changed quite dramatically. It is them, yet, in a strange way, it isn't! Yes and no at the same time. That's a way of appreciating how the disciples may have viewed Jesus.

So it is with Jesus' resurrection. Recognition, yet big difference. A glorified body. As it is with Jesus, so it will be for us. That's why we call it the 'resurrection of the body'. It waits for all of us. That's our faith. It should bring some joy.

Our present bodies have limited presence, if I'm here, I'm not there. But the new kind of resurrected body is a new kind of presence which is limitless. So we can eat 'grilled fish', yet be limitless at the same time. The dilemma is overcome in Jesus the Christ.

Ghosts? No. Resuscitated corpses? No. Something infinitely greater, all overcome in Jesus the Christ. Do we have that kind of faith?

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION. Please note and read carefully...

1. Through lockdown, our children have been absolutely phenomenal in patiently waiting for a year in order to make their First Holy Communion. All credit to them and their families.



- With this in mind, through May, June and July this year our children will be making their First Holy Communion <u>incorporated into</u> the
 5.30pm or 9.30am weekend Masses, or both. There will be between 3 and 5 children making their First Holy Communion at these Masses, although not every weekend.
- 3. For this reason, I will celebrate an additional 8am Mass on Sundays, throughout May June and July, whether or not there are children making their First Holy Communion that weekend. This will be reviewed after July.
- 4. Please give careful thought about whether you would prefer to come to an 8am Mass, or one of the weekday Masses. Remember the obligation for Sunday Mass is still suspended.
- 5. Bear in mind, we have to be strict with Covid restrictions in place at the moment so spreading ourselves out over the other Masses is important, even if we don't 'normally attend' a certain Mass. Numbers of relatives/friends of the children who might attend is always an unknown quantity. Also be prepared that your usual place may be taken at a Mass you normally come to.
- 6. There will be a notice in the newsletter the weekend before if children are making their First Holy Communion at one of the 2 Masses the following weekend. There will be no First Holy Communions at the 8am Masses (or weekdays). To give you a heads up, there are 4 children due to make their First Holy Communion at the 5.30pm Saturday evening Mass on May 1st.



FAST COVID-19 TESTING CENTRE IN RAYLEIGH

A fast testing centre, offering the fast Lateral Flow Tests and giving results in around 30 minutes, is open at The MegaCentre, 7 Brook Road, Rayleigh, Essex, SS6 7UT **for people who DO NOT have symptoms** of Covid-19.

Tests are by appointment only. Anyone booking should live in the Rochford area of Essex. Book online through the website (https://www.essex.gov.uk/getting-tested-for-covid-19/if-you-dont-have-symptoms)

If you're not able to book using the online form, you can call 0333 772 6144 to arrange an appointment. Lines are open from 8am to 8pm, every day including Saturday and Sunday. You can also email: booking.confirmation@nhs.net and a member of staff will contact you to arrange an appointment.

Anyone WITH symptoms should book a test on the NHS Test and Trace App or the gov.uk website.

ROYAL MAIL SCAMS — UNDELIVERED PARCEL TEXT MESSAGE


The public are being warned to stay alert to a new wave of scam text messages claiming to be from Royal Mail.



Criminals are taking advantage of the new reliance on online shopping and deliveries to obtain personal and banking details. This follows on from a similar scam where people would receive an email telling them that their parcel could not be delivered and they would have to pay a fee for it to be released.

The text messages come from a variety of different numbers but all will ask for a small payment which is accessed by clicking on a link in the message.

Royal Mail have stated that this is not a text that they would send out, they will only send text messages to those who have opted in to their SMS service.



Remember:

- Unexpected messages should be treated with caution
- Phone numbers can be easily spoofed by criminals—don't trust a number just because it appears to come from a genuine organisation
- Never click on links sent via email or SMS text message.

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.

READINGS AT MASS - 3rd Sunday of Easter

First reading – Acts 3:13-15,17-19

You killed the prince of life: God, however, raised him from the dead

Peter said to the people: 'You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses.

'Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had foretold, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out.'

Psalm 4 – Lift up the light of your face on us, O Lord.

Second reading - 1 John 2:1-5

Jesus Christ is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and the world's

I am writing this, my children, to stop you sinning; but if anyone should sin, we have our advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, who is just; he is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and not only ours, but the whole world's. We can be sure that we know God only by keeping his commandments. Anyone who says, 'I know him', and does not keep his commandments, is a liar, refusing to admit the truth. But when anyone does obey what he has said, God's love comes to perfection in him.

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, explain the Scriptures to us. Make our hearts burn within us as you talk to us. Alleluia!

Gospel - Luke 24:35-48

It is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they still could not believe it, and they stood there dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes. Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'
