

OUR LADY OF RANSOM





Lost, the stranger drove up to a deserted farmhouse to ask directions. He came across an elderly woman sitting in the entrance, and a man working in the yard, whistling. The whistling was loud, disjointed and out of tune. Aggravated by this whistling, he asked him why he whistled so. "See that lovely lady, that's my wife of 52 years, she's recently gone blind. It terrified her. So I thought, if I keep whistling, she'll know I'm around, it gives her the assurance she badly needs."

John the Baptist wants to offer us God's assurance. Not his own. So he points away from himself to Jesus, telling us he is not Him. His growing popularity could have seduced him to point to himself as great. But he knows the truth.

And knowing the truth, he is arguably and strangely abrasive, impatient, tactless, tunnel-visioned, and maybe not possessing the greatest verbal and relational skills. Confrontational, talk of retribution, justice and God's wrath. Possibly moralistic and harsh. But this 'out of tune whistling' points to Our Lord's assurance, not his. Maybe this is why Jesus says of him, "the least in heaven is greater than he."

John is not yet the reconciler, the healer, the lover, the man of compassion, tenderness, tolerance and patience. It can take later-life enlightenment to really take these energies on in a big way. This is where Jesus takes John's message forward, puts the whistling 'in tune'. John is right, as far as he goes. He clears the way for Jesus and "literally" exits. Now there is freedom for the bigger message.

Much of religion, sad to say, has followed in many of John's ways and not the ways taken forward by Jesus. Exclusivity, impatience, intolerance, too much focus on retribution and following "correct" rules with too little focus on life-giving relationships. Mercy can be severely lacking; too quick in defining who's in and out, up or down, who can receive and who can't, and so on. Honestly! As if we really know! Maybe that is why much religion is laughed at and frowned upon today. Maybe that is why in many places Christmas is losing the Christ.

Our religions are meant to heal, reconcile, demonstrate authentic compassion and God's endless mercy. That is why it is good news. Anything else is simply a lie.

Do we follow only the Baptist? Or are we finally and hopefully - "Christians"?


CHRISTMAS FLOWERS



ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.

RESIDENTS WARNED OF FAKE BT CALLS

Residents are warned to be alert to a spate of calls claiming to be BT outreach that result in a computer takeover by the criminals.

Essex Police is aware of reports by residents that have received a call claiming to be from BT and stating that there is either an issue with the broadband in the area, or that the residents internet access is due to be cut off unless they follow the callers instructions.

The criminals use this cover in order to request that the resident downloads a program that will allow them access to the computer—this will allow them to remotely control the computer, meaning they are able to change passwords and view banking information.

When dealing with companies over the phone remember to Take Five:

- Stop Taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- Challenge Could it be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you
- Protect Contact your bank immediately if you think you've fallen for a scam and report it to Action Fraud



If you want to check whether the call is genuine, remember to call back after five minutes or, if possible, on a different phone. **Always** use a trusted number, and not a number provided by the caller. A number of reports have stated that the caller has provided another fake number designed to continue the scam.



If you believe criminals have accessed your computer, take it to a trusted computer expert and explain the situation.



READINGS AT MASS – THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First reading – Isaiah 61:1-2,10-11

He has sent me to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, freedom to those in prison; to proclaim a year of favour from the Lord. 'I exult for joy in the Lord, my soul rejoices in my God, for he has clothed me in the garments of salvation, he has wrapped me in the cloak of integrity, like a bridegroom wearing his wreath, like a bride adorned in her jewels. 'For as the earth makes fresh things grow, as a garden makes seeds spring up, so will the Lord make both integrity and praise spring up in the sight of the nations.'

May you all be kept safe for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ

Be happy at all times; pray constantly; and for all things give thanks to God, because this is what God expects you to do in Christ Jesus. Never try to suppress the Spirit or treat the gift of prophecy with contempt; think before you do anything – hold on to what is good and avoid every form of evil. May the God of peace make you perfect and holy; and may you all be kept safe and blameless, spirit, soul and body, for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. God has called you and he will not fail you.

Gospel - John 1:6-8,19-28

'There stands among you the one coming after me'

A man came, sent by God. His name was John. He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him. He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness: Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.
