OUR LADY OF RANSOM



2nd Sunday of Lent – Year B – Divine Office Wk 2 – 27th/28th February 2021

Do you feel special? Empowered? Chosen? I hope so, especially if your faith is authentic. God chooses many people, in the Bible and today. Are they more worthy? No. Or more superior? No. Or better? No. In fact "chosen" people, from the Bible, great Saints, our heroes, are all *flawed*, *ordinary* people – just like us.

Being chosen means to *communicate "chosenness" to everybody else*. To lead people to a depth to which you have been led. You can only lead others as far as you have gone. How can you communicate to someone that they are special until you know it strongly for yourself? Once you know it for yourself, (your own "quick egocentric fix"), then you stop worrying about being centre stage and give plenty of time and energy to promote other people's specialness or chosenness.

To be chosen implies big responsibility. God needs usable images of himself to pass himself on. The stuff of real faith. To know that you are a beloved child of God so you can pass on that belovedness to others. God calls Jesus *his beloved Son*. And Jesus beautifully passes on that belovedness to everyone else. Hence the cross. Nothing for himself, everything for everyone else, especially the "sinner".

To think He loves us (even more) in our own brokenness and sinfulness. Wow!

Such chosenness is always *inclusive* - or religion becomes smug and exclusionary - always excluding the apparent *non-chosen, unworthy* or *impure*. Does that need much proof? Religion becomes a belonging system, everything Jesus instructs us *not* to do, instead of good news, specialness or chosenness for the world.

The main difference between Jesus and ourselves is that Jesus knew his chosenness definitively. He knew his *beloved* status. And we hear God affirming that today and are told to listen to Him and Jesus beautifully communicates that to us all. We are *in fact* beloved Daughters and Sons of God too. But be honest. *Do we really believe that? Do we really recognise that truth? Do we really listen?* It would be life-transforming if we did. And then we help transform others.

Isn't that worth it?

People are instructed to press 1 on their phone which will connect them and allegedly fix the problem and even be given a new National Insurance Number. IT IS A SCAM. If you do, fraudsters can take control of your personal details leading to terrible consequences. PLEASE BE CAREFUL.



NEW FAST COVID-19 TESTING CENTRE IN RAYLEIGH

A new fast testing centre is now open at The MegaCentre, 7 Brook Road, Rayleigh, Essex, SS6 7UT for people who DO NOT have symptoms of Covid-19.

This testing centre, offering the fast Lateral Flow Tests, gives results in around 30 minutes. Tests are by appointment only. Anyone booking should live in the Rochford area of Essex.

You can <u>book a test if you don't have symptoms</u> (Booking online is the quickest and most effective option) through the website (https://www.essex.gov.uk/getting-tested-for-covid-19/if-you-dont-have-symptoms)

If you're not able to book using the online form, you can call 0333 772 6144 to arrange an appointment. Lines are open from 8am to 8pm, every day including Saturday and Sunday. You can also email: booking.confirmation@nhs.net and a member of staff will contact you to arrange an appointment.

Anyone WITH symptoms should book a test on the NHS Test and Trace App or the gov.uk website.

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.



FAKE NATIONAL INSURANCE CALLS

Following a surge in reporting to Action Fraud, Essex has also seen an increase in automated National Insurance scams.

Residents have reported receiving an automated telephone call telling them their "National Insurance number has been compromised" and in order to fix this and get a new number, the victim needs to "press 1 on their handset to be connected to the caller".

Once connected to the "caller", they are pressured into giving over their personal details in order to receive a new National Insurance number. In reality, they've been connected to a criminal who can now use their personal details to commit further frauds. Remember:

- STOP Taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- CHALLENGE Could it be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only
 criminals will try to rush or panic you.
- PROTECT If you have provided personal details to someone over the phone and you now believe this to be a scam, contact your bank, building society and credit card company immediately and report it to Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040.

COVID-19: VACCINE FRAUD

Criminals are using the COVID-19 vaccine as a way to target the public by tricking them to hand over cash or financial details. They are sending convincing-looking text messages letting people know they are eligible for the vaccine or phoning people directly pretending to be from the NHS, or local pharmacy.



PEOPLE ARE WARNED TO BE ALERT TO THESE SCAMS:

The NHS will:

- NEVER ask for payment the vaccine is free
- NEVER ask for your bank details
- NEVER arrive unannounced at your home to administer the vaccine
- NEVER ask you to prove your identity by sending copies of personal documents such as your passport

TOP 4 VACCINE SCAMS



TEXT MESSAGES

People are asked to press a number on their keypad or to send a text message to confirm they wish to receive the vaccine, doing so is likely to result in a charge being applied to their phone bill and fraudsters collecting personal information to use again.



PHONE CALLS

Victims receive a phone call from a fake caller offering the vaccine for a fee or asking for bank details



WEBSITES

Fake URL links to convincing-looking NHS vaccine booking forms, these look like official NHS forms and may contain some personal information already, at the end of the form it asks for their bank details.



IN PERSON

Fraudsters are calling unannounced at the homes of victims by pretending to be from the NHS to administer the vaccine there and then, in exchange for a cash payment.

READINGS AT MASS – 2nd Sunday of Lent

First reading – Genesis 22:1-2,9-13,15-18

The sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith

God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham' he called. 'Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.'

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son.

But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. Abraham took the ram and offered it as a burnt-offering in place of his son.



The angel of the Lord called Abraham a second time from heaven. 'I swear by my own self – it is the Lord who speaks – because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only son, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the stars of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants shall gain possession of the gates of their enemies. All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves by your descendants, as a reward for your obedience.'

Second reading - Romans 8:31-34

God did not spare his own Son

With God on our side who can be against us? Since God did not spare his own Son, but gave him up to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that he will not refuse anything he can give. Could anyone accuse those that God has chosen? When God acquits, could anyone condemn? Could Christ Jesus? No! He not only died for us — he rose from the dead, and there at God's right hand he stands and pleads for us.

Gospel - Mark 9:2-10

This is my Son, the Beloved

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus: 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
