Have you ever walked down any High Street and counted how many instant money and food outlets there are? Or at home, instant internet, face-book, photos, films, music, mail... the list goes on? It's all great and so immediate...

It seems if we're not careful, our need for the "instant" can erode away our patience, humility and faith. Is God necessarily "instant?" Years ago, peoples' lives tended to be integrally connected to the secret rhythms of the earth. Things were less rushed – if faith and patience were stronger then, might that be why?

Today, deadlines and timetables become our taskmasters. Never enough time. Always rushing. Can we release our tight grasp on time so it can become our gentle companion rather than a relentless enemy, possibly destroying the soul?

Gardeners among us will know that growth can never be rushed – or something important is lost. Flowers, crops, plants all need to be allowed to grow to maturity – naturally... in nature. Can't hurry mother-nature, or we pay a price. There needs to be a patient waiting. Faith. A humility. Not instant, like email, cash or food.

Our spiritual lives are similar. Better to co-operate with the seasons of the soul. Qualities and dreams are being formed within, these suffer if plucked too early. They need a safe environment of gestation where natural growth is allowed and protected. Wisdom and discernment allow us to recognise ripeness. Plucked too soon and we taste the sourness of impatience. Too late, and the anticipated fruit begins to perish.

Much of what is developing within us is happening secretly. Hidden. But happening, it is. God's spirit within is blossoming, maturing. Like the crops growing. We need to wait, patiently, with humility, with faith. We cannot rush things. Crops, flowers, nature are not instant. We see why Jesus uses nature to explain so much about healthy life-styles. That can and will never change.

Do we rush under so much illusion of having to get things done; or can we be patient and humble, leading to healthier and happier lives and a stronger faith?

Safe Spaces is a free, independent support service, providing a confidential, personal and safe space for anyone who has been abused by someone in the Church or as a result of their relationship with the Catholic Church of England and Wales, the Church of England, or the Church in Wales.

Who can we help?

Safe Spaces is open to people aged 18 or over, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the perpetrator is living or deceased. You do not have to have reported the incident to the Church authorities or the Police in order to access support.

You do not need to be a current active member of the Church to access support.

Our service is for people who have experienced any kind of abuse – this includes (but is not limited to) sexual violence, inappropriate sexual behaviour, physical abuse, financial abuse or exploitation, psychological abuse (including spiritual abuse), domestic abuse, coercive and controlling behaviour.



How we can help

Remote support is provided nationally through our FREE Helpline and Live Chat for as long as our clients feel they need it and it is deemed to be helpful.

We can help with advocating with authorities and other agencies, giving you emotional support, providing information (including information on church and police procedures), understanding your needs and working together on individual support plans. If face-to-face support is wanted local to where you live, we will try to make contact with appropriate agencies depending on need.

BE ONLINE SHOPPING SAVVY

IS THAT CAR REALLY FOR SALE?

In recent weeks, Essex Police has seen a increase in residents purchasing vehicles online and paying the full amount without ever having seen the car in person. When they arrive to collect the vehicle, it does not exist.



TOP TIPS

- Always view and test drive the car before buying arrange to view in the daylight, preferably when it's dry. Make sure you're insured and test drive the car for about 15 minutes on different types of road.
- Buy from an established firm or trusted seller you can look for a trade association sign or for sellers that have been inspected by an independent engineer or motoring organisation.
- Use secure method of payment don't pay anything until you have seen the car. Once you are satisfied with what you are buying, use a secure method of payment such as a credit card to ensure you are protected if something goes wrong.

BOGUS BANK TRANSFERS

Essex Police have also received reports of residents selling electronic items online such as mobiles and laptops to suspects who attend the address and request to pay by bank transfer. They will pay on the doorstep claiming that it can take up to 2-3 hours for the payment to go through. The payment never arrives by which time the suspect has already left with the goods.

TOP TIPS

- Arrange an instant payment consider using cash or using an instant payment service.
- Wait for the payment to go through most transfers should be quite quick, don't let the item go without knowing you have received the payment.

CENSUS SCAMS STILL CIRCULATING

Residents are reminded to be aware of 2021 Census scams which continue to circulate following the closing date of March 21st.

Various emails and text messages have been received, including this one stating that there is missing information on the census submission and failure to correct this could result in a large fine.

CENSUS: There is missing information from your application. Failure to update your details may result in a £950 penalty. Visit: https://census.mvinfo-ref.com

Remember - you will never be issued with a fine by text message, phone call, email, or on social media and you will not be fined for a mistake on your census. Please see the below information from Action Fraud and the Office for National Statistics (ONS) regarding Census scams.

Fake Cannabis Sweets or "Edibles"

Warning- there are in circulation fake branded sweets which contain high levels of cannabis oil. These sweets are used to attract teenagers into trying cannabis.

Each sweet contains THC (Tetrahydrocannabinol - the main psychoactive ingredient in cannabis) and affect the central nervous and cardiovascular systems. It can take up to an hour for ingested THC to have any effect. THC is normally inhaled through smoking, but edibles can give longer lasting effects, including:

- Loss of coordination
- Hallucinations
- Nausea/vomiting
- Lethargy, collapse or loss of consciousness
- Cardiovascular.





Adults have more body mass and therefore the effects of a couple of sweets are mild, however if children eat these sweets the effects are more severe and may require medical treatment. Some children have been hospitalised after eating a whole bag, of what they thought were sweets.

It was noticed in October 2020, there was an increase in empty packets of these sweets around educational premises, especially when lockdown lifted. Now that lockdown restrictions are being lifted once more, it is believed there might be a surge in Organised Crime Groups involved in drugs dealing, supplying these sweets at schools and colleges in an attempt to recruit more cannabis users.



Both the possession and supplying of cannabis sweets is illegal.

How can I tell cannabis sweets from the real ones?




Look out for the "THC" sign and an "Activation Time"

Scams.... Social Media. INNOCENT OR CRIMINAL TOOLKIT?

Essex Police are reminding residents that what appear to be innocent games posted on social media have the potential to allow criminals access to your personal data—ultimately allowing them to get their hands on your money.



Local policing teams have recently identified an increase in Facebook posts encouraging users to post their 'Film Star Name' using a pet's name and mother's maiden name, or asking questions such as what was number one in the charts when you were 10. These seemingly harmless questions can provide criminals with lots of personal information that can assist them with stealing your identity. For example:

What is your favourite film star's name? First Pet? Mother's Maiden Name?

What was number one in the charts when you were 10? Allows criminals to work out your Date of Birth

What car did you pass your driving test in? Details of first car

Describe the city you were born in with a clue? Town of birth

All of these are potentially answers to bank account security questions. Remember to Take Five before posting personal details on social media and make sure to check your security settings so that your posts can only be seen by those who you want to see them!

Holiday Scams.

Please be careful when booking holidays. Be vigilant.

Fraud is on the increase. Criminals are becoming increasingly sophisticated through impersonating companies and flight



comparison websites. Fake accommodation is rising.

ALWAYS check the address is legitimate, make sure logos (pictures) or names are not slightly altered eg. going from .uk.co. to .org .

Please (online) research and don't just rely on one review. Make sure as far as you can the company is credible. Is it an ABTA/ATOL member? Does it have the proper logo/name?

Check their websites if in doubt. Pay safe, preferably by credit card where possible. Avoid paying individually into anyone's personal bank account. Check paperwork. Study receipts, invoices and terms and conditions.

Be wary if the company doesn't provide any paperwork at all when you book.

If a holiday club or time share, get a solicitor to thoroughly vet the contract first. Especially if first time.

Use your instincts: if a deal sounds too good to be true, it probably is!

For information: £2.2 (million pounds) was lost to fraudsters in 2020/1. An average of £1,242 a per person (victim).Ouch!

Police - call 999 – if you cannot respond due to danger, tap the mobile handset or cough, then when prompted press 55 (this takes you straight through to the police)

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.
