Corpus Christi – Year B – Divine Office Wk 2 – 5th /6th June 2021

"Could my son make his First Holy Communion please?, asked the mother of a twelve year-old with severe physical and learning challenges. "But he won't understand a thing" replied Father. "How can we communicate?" "I suppose so" the mother sighed. Then, watching her son one day at Mass when the priest was saying "this is my body", she noticed the boy's eyes staring at the Host, then flick quickly up to stare at the cross, then back to the raised host. Back and forth between Host and cross. Same with the Chalice. Noticing this often, mum told the priest, the priest himself noticed when another priest was celebrating – now there was no question. Yes, of course the boy was more than ready, and made his First Holy Communion shortly afterwards.

Like much of our faith, to appreciate the "Real Presence" of Christ in Holy Communion is the language of the soul. The boy got it. So many others don't as they try to over-rationalise it in their heads and be smart. And we can't. Theologians have tried over the centuries and made little progress. We only sense something special is happening at Holy Communion. Surveys on lapsed Catholics show that what they miss most about practising the faith is....Holy Communion.

Interestingly, Jesus never said, take this, debate and argue and fall out over it. He simply said "take and eat, take and drink". For centuries we haven't taken and eaten, but taken and argued and fallen out over it. Because we have got over-heady and too smart over it all. Why don't we just listen to Jesus more carefully!

The head will never get it. The soul will - like the boy. Real Presence. Receiving this Real Presence" is saying, "I'm in Communion" I am doing all I can to serve and build up the community/communion of God, this people, the Body of Christ. I am receiving what I am — because I am a part of the Body of Christ and am being transformed through it. We so much need this truth — that we belong to Christ and his love. Maybe we have to receive thousands of times for this wonderful truth to sink in. Hence, in part, our need for weekly Mass. If it has sunk in, we enjoy and are strengthened in living it out. What does Holy Communion <u>really</u> mean for me?

Safe Spaces is a free, independent support service, providing a confidential, personal and safe space for anyone who has been abused by someone in the Church or as a result of their relationship with the Catholic Church of England and Wales, the Church of England, or the Church in Wales.

Who can we help?

Safe Spaces is open to people aged 18 or over, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the perpetrator is living or deceased. You do not have to have reported the incident to the Church authorities or the Police in order to access support.

You do not need to be a current active member of the Church to access support.

Our service is for people who have experienced any kind of abuse – this includes (but is not limited to) sexual violence, inappropriate sexual behaviour, physical abuse, financial abuse or exploitation, psychological abuse (including spiritual abuse), domestic abuse, coercive and controlling behaviour.



How we can help

Remote support is provided nationally through our FREE Helpline and Live Chat for as long as our clients feel they need it and it is deemed to be helpful.

We can help with advocating with authorities and other agencies, giving you emotional support, providing information (including information on church and police procedures), understanding your needs and working together on individual support plans. If face-to-face support is wanted local to where you live, we will try to make contact with appropriate agencies depending on need.

CENSUS SCAMS STILL CIRCULATING

Residents are reminded to be aware of 2021 Census scams which continue to circulate following the closing date of March 21st.

Various emails and text messages have been received, including this one stating that there is missing information on the census submission and failure to correct this could result in a large fine.

CENSUS: There is missing information from your application. Failure to update your details may result in a £950 penalty. Visit: https://census.mvinfo-ref.com

Remember - you will never be issued with a fine by text message, phone call, email, or on social media and you will not be fined for a mistake on your census. Please see the below information from Action Fraud and the Office for National Statistics (ONS) regarding Census scams.

MY INFO? I DON'T THINK SO!

Residents are reminded to keep their personal documents safe after a number of reports of scammers asking for copies of passports and driving licences.

Essex Police have seen a recent trend in scammers requesting personal details which can be used to steal someone's identity. This has been linked to a number of different scams including:

- HMRC/National Insurance fraud where the criminal claims they need your personal details to prevent prosecution or reinstate your NI number.
- Computer software frauds where the criminal claims to be from your internet provider. They take control of your computer and say they need to take a photo of you and your driving licence/passport to confirm your identity.

Requests for personal details should always be a red flag. You should never provide this information unless you have confirmed who you are dealing with. To protect you information and your money, Take Five:

- STOP Taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- CHALLENGE Could it be fake? It's ok to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.
- PROTECT If you have provided personal details to someone over the phone and you now believe this to be a scam, contact your bank, building society and credit card company immediately and report it to Action Fraud at www.actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040.

Fake Cannabis Sweets or "Edibles"

Warning- there are in circulation fake branded sweets which contain high levels of cannabis oil. These sweets are used to attract teenagers into trying cannabis.

Each sweet contains THC (Tetrahydrocannabinol - the main psychoactive ingredient in cannabis) and affect the central nervous and cardiovascular systems. It can take up to an hour for ingested THC to have any effect. THC is normally inhaled through smoking, but edibles can give longer lasting effects, including:

- Loss of coordination
- Hallucinations
- Nausea/vomiting
- Lethargy, collapse or loss of consciousness
- Cardiovascular.





Adults have more body mass and therefore the effects of a couple of sweets are mild, however if children eat these sweets the effects are more severe and may require medical treatment. Some children have been hospitalised after eating a whole bag, of what they thought were sweets.

It was noticed in October 2020, there was an increase in empty packets of these sweets around educational premises, especially when lockdown lifted. Now that lockdown restrictions are being lifted once more, it is believed there might be a surge in Organised Crime Groups involved in drugs dealing, supplying these sweets at schools and colleges in an attempt to recruit more cannabis users.



Both the possession and supplying of cannabis sweets is illegal.

How can I tell cannabis sweets from the real ones?




Look out for the "THC" sign and an "Activation Time"

Scams.... Social Media. INNOCENT OR CRIMINAL TOOLKIT?

Essex Police are reminding residents that what appear to be innocent games posted on social media have the potential to allow criminals access to your personal data—ultimately allowing them to get their hands on your money.



Local policing teams have recently identified an increase in Facebook posts encouraging users to post their 'Film Star Name' using a pet's name and mother's maiden name, or asking questions such as what was number one in the charts when you were 10. These seemingly harmless questions can provide criminals with lots of personal information that can assist them with stealing your identity. For example:

What is your favourite film star's name? First Pet? Mother's Maiden Name?

What was number one in the charts when you were 10? Allows criminals to work out your Date of Birth

What car did you pass your driving test in? Details of first car

Describe the city you were born in with a clue? Town of birth

All of these are potentially answers to bank account security questions. Remember to Take Five before posting personal details on social media and make sure to check your security settings so that your posts can only be seen by those who you want to see them!

Holiday Scams.

Please be careful when booking holidays. Be vigilant.

Fraud is on the increase. Criminals are becoming increasingly sophisticated through impersonating companies and flight



comparison websites. Fake accommodation is rising.

ALWAYS check the address is legitimate, make sure logos (pictures) or names are not slightly altered eg. going from .uk.co. to .org .

Please (online) research and don't just rely on one review. Make sure as far as you can the company is credible. Is it an ABTA/ATOL member? Does it have the proper logo/name?

Check their websites if in doubt. Pay safe, preferably by credit card where possible. Avoid paying individually into anyone's personal bank account. Check paperwork. Study receipts, invoices and terms and conditions.

Be wary if the company doesn't provide any paperwork at all when you book.

If a holiday club or time share, get a solicitor to thoroughly vet the contract first. Especially if first time.

Use your instincts: if a deal sounds too good to be true, it probably is!

For information: £2.2 (million pounds) was lost to fraudsters in 2020/1. An average of £1,242 a per person (victim).Ouch!

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.

Reflection for Corpus Christi



"This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you." (Cor 11:23). These words from St Paul's account of the last supper give us two significant phrases which illuminate our baptismal vocation; 'Receive' and 'passed on.' Here St Paul is specifically speaking of the Eucharist, but this is true also of our faith. The gift of faith, received in baptism, is the faith of the Church which we receive individually, but is something which we are called to pass on to others. What we celebrate in the sacramental life of the Church we are commissioned by our baptism to pass on to others by the witness to our living faith.

What is it that we receive and in turn pass on? Wisdom offers a generous hospitality to those who respond to the call of the maid servants to come. Her house is a symbol of the Church, built on the seven sacraments and those who come need not be the "learned and the wise" (Matt 11:25) but the "ignorant," the ones with open hearts to receive in love what is offered; not just bread and wine, but that which brings insight, the meeting with the Lord. When we gather as a Church, we are offered these precious gifts which lead to deeper understanding of our faith and our lives.

Therefore, when we share in the Eucharist, we receive nourishment for the journey which helps us to perceive, or put another way, to discern more clearly the pathways of the Lord. We become like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, who not really understanding what had just happened at the events of the first Easter are drawn into the Lord's presence through listening to the Word of God and sharing in the Breaking of Bread. Hopefully, when we are at Mass, we can enter ourselves into their experience and be able to say that our hearts too are burning because we have realised all that the Lord has done for us, and like them, be spurred into action to tell of this to others (Luke 24:33) We, then, pass on to others what we ourselves have received from the Lord's generosity, like the two from Emmaus.

When the Catholic community gathers to celebrate the Sunday Mass it does this so as to 'relive with particular intensity the experience of the Apostles on the evening of Easter when the Risen Lord appeared to them as they were gathered together. This close connection between the appearance of



the Risen Lord and the Eucharist is suggested in the Gospel of Luke in the story of the two disciples of Emmaus, whom Christ approached and led to understand the Scriptures and then sat with them at table. The gestures of Jesus in this account are his gestures at the Last Supper with the clear allusions to the "Breaking of Bread", as the Eucharist was called by the first generations of Christians.' (*Dies Domini* 33).

This gathering of the community Sunday by Sunday, according to Pope St John Paul II is so that in each place where the Eucharist is celebrated, the Church is truly present and, in this way, Sunday becomes the day of the Church where the People of God are nourished by the Lord in his Word and in his Eucharist. Through the gathering of the people, their experience of being fed in Word and Sacrament, they in their turn, become disciples and witnessed to him. Sunday is the day where each parish community is united in this great sacrament of love and draw deeply from this fountain of the Lord's goodness. The weekly gathering for Mass, its celebration and the sending forth of all present, becomes the very heartbeat of the Church. "Renewed and nourished by this intense weekly rhythm Christian hope becomes leaven and the light of human hope." (Dies Domini 38)

Pope St John Paul expresses how we are to be the light of hope and leaven for the world when he says that; "With the offering of the Sunday Eucharist, the Church crowns the witness which her children strive to offer every day of the week by proclaiming the Gospel and practising charity in the world of world of work and in all the many tasks of life; thus she shows forth more plainly her identity 'as a sacrament, or sign and instrument of intimate union with God and of the unity of the entire human race'" (Dies Domini 38). When we see it in this way, we know how dependent we are on this spiritual food for the work of Christian witness, bringing the message of hope and mercy to the world.

This sense of hope is extended when we come before the Lord for a prolonged moment of adoration. Further, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament can also give us the opportunity to come into the Lord's Eucharistic presence and quietly speak to him, to listen to what he says to us in silent contemplation, to be enfolded in his abundant love and to offer him the joys and sorrows of our daily life. Jesus speaks to our hearts, and we become conformed to him united in prayer to his passion, cross and resurrection.

How can we not fail to be in awe of the one before whom we kneel? How can we not be humbled by his generous love and mercy for us? Can anything stop us from bringing his love to others? "To contemplate Christ involves being able to recognise him wherever he manifests himself, in the many forms of presence, but above all in the living sacrament of his body and blood. *The Church draws her life from Christ in the Eucharist;* by him she is fed and by him she is enlightened. The Eucharist is both a mystery of faith and a mystery of light. Wherever the Church celebrates the Eucharist, the faithful can in some way relive the experience of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus: their eyes were opened, and they recognised him." (*Ecclesia de Eucharistia* 6).

Present to the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, we can pray that our eyes will be opened to know truly all that the Lord has done for us and pray for the courage to pass on to others the goodness that we have received.

Come, then, good Shepherd, bread divine,
Still show to us thy mercy sign;
Oh, feed us, still keep us thine;
So we may see thy glories shine in fields of immortality.
O thou, the wisest, mightiest, best,
Our present food, our future rest,
Come, make us each they chosen guest, Co-heirs of thine, and comrades blest
With saints whose dwelling is with thee.
