Fun fairs. Hall of Mirrors? Remember? Which mirror reflects the real me? My real identity? So many different 'me' reflections. Which is the most real me? So, many different reflections, fat, thin, tall, short, squat, just like so many different opinions...all about 'me'. Opinions largely based on other peoples' personal influences, upbringings and education. All relative. Who is really right? So why take other opinions too literally. How then, do we find our real identity?

Real identities are found once and for all in the Lord. He is the only solid, eternal, unmovable rock, the solid, eternal, un-movable, un-distorted mirror in which we can base who we are. Our true mirrored reflection. With him, we have continuity, consistency, nothing wavers or distorts—so it makes sense to base who we are in him. No fat or skinny reflections. Just real ones.

We see today so many people, especially young people, who base their identities on celebrity, sports stars etc. But these chop and change, fade away. So people look for someone else. Hence their identities are so changeable, fragile and brittle. So confusing! Changing with every new fad, new pop star etc. Political correctness has evolved because people are so fundamentally fragile. They have no 'rock', no solid ground or true mirror on, or in whom they can base an unmovable identity, their real reflection.

We have help – believing in the Eucharist as Real Presence is one sure way. Christ, the real mirror, reflecting who we really are, behind all the pretence and relative identities we put on. The Incarnation that happened 2000 years ago, is repeated in microcosm at every Mass, to help us along the way. A real touchstone to help find ourselves in God. Our real mirror. Maybe we need thousands of Communions before we get it, then we start to realise God really is everywhere, not only in the Bread and Wine at a Catholic Mass. So we can find truth everywhere, if we choose to. That is the only mirror that reflects who we really are. Without distortion, without confusion

The cure for loneliness and meaninglessness is not about having more and more people to talk to, that can be just more halls of mirrors, much more about being in contact with reality. Holy Communion...Real Presence. Real. Reality. Our authentic mirror. Does Holy Communion help us along the way in finding out who we really are and allow us to be happy in what we find?



Afghanistan.....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.



The Cry of Creation Exploring the encyclical Laudato si

As the United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP 26), to be held in Glasgow in November, draws nearer, and at a time of unprecedented danger for the world, the 2015 encyclical of Pope Francis, Laudato si, on care for our 'common home', could not be more relevant. CRYPTOCURRENCY:

AN INVESTMENT NOT A PURCHASE

Earlier this year NatWest issued a warning to its customers to beware of cryptocurrency scams after they received a record number of reports.

Residents are reminded that cryptocurrency should be viewed as an investment and not a purchase due to it's volatile nature - its value can fluctuate by up to 40% in one month. As with investments, make sure you protect yourself by using services provided by the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) to identify whether the firm or individual is authorised to offer financial services.

Common scams can involve celebrity endorsement or a "get rich quick" opportunity. Potential investors will often be asked to fill in a contact form and set up a cryptocurrency 'wallet' over the phone. Unbeknown to them the criminal will also have installed software that also allows them access to the wallet. Investors will then be encouraged to invest increasingly large amounts of money until such a time as the criminal then empties the wallet of their savings.

Cryptocurrency—how to protect yourself:

- Be suspicious of anyone who contacts you out of the blue. Particularly if they claim to be a "trader" who offers to help you invest in cryptocurrency and promises big returns.
- Ensure you have access to your wallet always try to set up your wallet yourself. If you did not set it up yourself, or cannot get access to it, it is likely to be a fraud.



Do your research - many cryptocurrency sellers are not registered with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA). Use the searchable FCA register to check whether the seller is registered or temporarily registered in the UK. If a company is not registered, there is little protection for your finances if something goes wrong.

CRIMINALS TARGET THOSE LOOKING FOR LOVE WITH BOGUS INVESTMENTS

Action Fraud is warning romance seekers to be cautious when using dating platforms, as new data reveals criminals have already conned over £15 million out of unsuspecting lovers with bogus investment opportunities.

Almost a quarter (23 per cent) of victims were aged 30 to 39 years old, and around two thirds of victims (60 per cent) were aged 30 to 59 years old.



While the vast majority of investments offered are in cryptocurrency, ,money has also been handed over by individuals believing they're investing in other commodities, including stocks and shares and gold.

How to protect yourself:

- Don't send money No matter how long you've been speaking to someone online, if you haven't met them in person, do not send them any money.
- Don't be rushed into making an investment. Be wary if you're being pressured to invest quickly, or promised returns that sound too good to be true.
- Research the person you're talking to Performing a reverse image search can find photos that have been taken from somewhere, or someone, else.
- Be suspicious if you are contacted out the blue about an investment opportunity. Always seek advice from friends or family and consider getting independent professional advice before making a significant financial decision.
- Stay on the site's messaging service until you meet in person. Criminals want to quickly switch to other platforms that are less well regulated and have stronger encryption, so there's no evidence of your conversation.
- Check if it's a scam by visiting the Financial Conduct Authority's (FCA) ScamSmart website.
- Report it! Most online platforms have a reporting tool which you can use if you suspect someone online is using pictures that don't belong to them, you are suspicious of their behaviour, or they have asked you for money. Reporting their profile means it can be blocked, which helps protect others.

Covid vaccine passport scam

Essex Police are warning residents about scam emails purporting to be from the NHS.



The emails – which carry the NHS logo – are being sent out asking for payment in return for a 'Coronavirus Digital Passport' to prove that someone has been vaccinated for Covid-19.

A button takes users through to a fake NHS website, which asks for payment details.

When clicking on the link in the email, it takes you to a convincing but fake NHS website and then asks for personal and payment details. Do not click on this link."

"Your vaccination status is obtained free through either the NHS app, website or by calling the NHS on 119."



Always take a moment to stop and think before parting with money or your personal information, it could prevent you from falling victim to fraud. Remember, it's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.

If you receive a suspicious text message, you can report it by forwarding the message to 7726 free of charge. Suspicious telephone/mobile calls can be reported to Action Fraud via their website: police.uk/report-phishing

RUFF TIME FOR ANIMAL LOVERS AS SCALE OF PANDEMIC PET FRAUD UNLEASHED

Action Fraud is reminding animal lovers to take extra care when buying a pet online, as new figures show more than £2.5 million has been lost to criminals through fake pet adverts.





POLICE

Capitalising on the rise in people getting pets due to the national lockdowns caused by coronavirus, criminals have been posting fake adverts on social media, online marketplaces and specific pet-selling platforms.

Unsuspecting victims will be asked to pay a deposit for the pet without seeing it in person first, with many criminals using the restrictions caused by the pandemic as a reason why. After the initial payment is made, more and more funds will be requested to cover additional costs such as insurance, vaccinations and even delivery of the pet.

How to protect yourself

- Do your research especially if you're making a purchase from a website or person you don't know and trust. Look up reviews of the website or person you're buying from. Or check the seller's feedback history
- Trust your instincts if you're unable to view the animal in person, ask for a video call. If you're buying a young animal, make sure you're able to see the mother and rest of the litter. Any responsible seller will understand why you want to view the animal in person. If the seller declines, challenge them on why. If you have any suspicions, do not pay any money until you're certain it's genuine.
- Choose your payment method wisely always avoid paying by bank transfer. Credit card or payment services such as PayPal give you a better chance of recovering your money if you become a victim of fraud.
- If things go wrong Anyone can fall victim to fraud. If you think you've been a victim of fraud, contact your bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud online at actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040.

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.
