# **OUR LADY OF RANSOM**

29th August 2021



Lil and her husband Alf used wheelchairs. Totally paralysed. A dearly lovely couple. I met them in Lourdes. They celebrated 51 years of marriage the week they were with us. But Lil wasn't receiving Holy Communion. I asked why, (long before I was ever a priest). She replied "51 years ago, the Canon said 'no' because Alf is not Catholic". It was her only gripe. Stunned, yet knowing how things were then, I begged her to receive on their actual anniversary day. She did. We were all thrilled. I had reasoned with her, using my then, limited understanding about how laws, rules can be both good, and suffocating. She got it. I'm so pleased. Even managed to get a photo. Sadly, she died a little later. So it was a joy knowing she was back receiving the Sacraments – after 51 years.

People get so trapped by laws, rules, regulations, and structures that in the end they can stifle the very life-force from within us. Rules deeply ingrained Maybe brainwashed. Yes, they are important and need adhering to, but at the cost of love, freedom, compassion, peace and life itself? Surely not. It seems that Jesus so often goes out of his way to flaunt the laws and customs of his own day, as we see today. With almost everything he does, his own people are the bad guys, and the hero is always the outsider. St. Paul is also so critical of his own Judaism and its rules .We cannot be saved by the law, is both their point. As if by doing it right and obeying laws will get us to heaven. No!

We can always do 'nice' things, 'right' things' and 'good' things, but with very questionable deeper motivations. This is why faith is always about purifying our motivations. Doing it 'nice' or 'right' is simply **not** the Gospel. We are already children of the Lord, we have nothing to prove. God loves us anyway. Why do we so feel we need to prove any worthiness by getting it right, obeying laws? Such nonsense. God has already made us worthy, we are already special, once we get that, and it can take a while, then goodness will naturally flow. Think carefully of the prayer we all say before going to receive Holy Communion. *Lord I am not worthy...Lord, You* say the word, *You* sort it, *You* do the business, and I am healed. God does the work and we are sorted. But we have to have hearts open through faith, now we will do good because God loves us, now we have no questionable motivations. No laws or rules will trap us. We honour and respect the rules, but they don't strangle us anymore, because, like Jesus and Paul, when necessary, we know how to peacefully and prayerfully go beyond them.

If you are able to print off newsletters yourselves and deliver to anyone who can't get out, that would be a great act of charity. Thank you.



### Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

# The Cry of Creation Exploring the encyclical Laudato si

In the one illustrated below, please notice that they have tried to make it look realistic by attempting to copy the .GOV.UK email address by entering extra dots in between all the letters as follows, G.O.V. U.K. Please remember that DVLA would never contact you in this way and ask you to





Your vehicle status is showing in our system as untaxed. It appears that some of the billing details associated with you might have expired or were otherwise changed.

#### Start here >

Please note: If you don't pay your vehicle tax on times you can be fined up to £1000, or your details passed to a debt collection agency.

You need

- the vehicle's registration number

CRYPTOCURRENCY:

### AN INVESTMENT NOT A PURCHASE

Earlier this year NatWest issued a warning to its customers to beware of cryptocurrency scams after they received a record number of reports.

Residents are reminded that cryptocurrency should be viewed as an investment and not a purchase due to it's volatile nature - its value can fluctuate by up to 40% in one month. As with investments, make sure you protect yourself by using services provided by the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) to identify whether the firm or individual is authorised to offer financial services.

Common scams can involve celebrity endorsement or a "get rich quick" opportunity. Potential investors will often be asked to fill in a contact form and set up a cryptocurrency 'wallet' over the phone. Unbeknown to them the criminal will also have installed software that also allows them access to the wallet. Investors will then be encouraged to invest increasingly large amounts of money until such a time as the criminal then empties the wallet of their savings.

### Cryptocurrency—how to protect yourself:

- Be suspicious of anyone who contacts you out of the blue. Particularly if they claim to be a "trader" who offers to help you invest in cryptocurrency and promises big returns.
- Ensure you have access to your wallet always try to set up your wallet yourself. If you did not set it up yourself, or cannot get access to it, it is likely to be a fraud.



Do your research - many cryptocurrency sellers are not registered with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA). Use the searchable FCA register to check whether the seller is registered or temporarily registered in the UK. If a company is not registered, there is little protection for your finances if something goes wrong.

# CRIMINALS TARGET THOSE LOOKING FOR LOVE WITH BOGUS INVESTMENTS

Action Fraud is warning romance seekers to be cautious when using dating platforms, as new data reveals criminals have already conned over £15 million out of unsuspecting lovers with bogus investment opportunities.

Almost a quarter (23 per cent) of victims were aged 30 to 39 years old, and around two thirds of victims (60 per cent) were aged 30 to 59 years old.



While the vast majority of investments offered are in cryptocurrency, ,money has also been handed over by individuals believing they're investing in other commodities, including stocks and shares and gold.

### How to protect yourself:

- Don't send money No matter how long you've been speaking to someone online, if you haven't met them in person, do not send them any money.
- Don't be rushed into making an investment. Be wary if you're being pressured to invest quickly, or promised returns that sound too good to be true.
- Research the person you're talking to Performing a reverse image search can find photos that have been taken from somewhere, or someone, else.
- Be suspicious if you are contacted out the blue about an investment opportunity. Always seek advice from friends or family and consider getting independent professional advice before making a significant financial decision.
- Stay on the site's messaging service until you meet in person. Criminals want to quickly switch to other platforms that are less well regulated and have stronger encryption, so there's no evidence of your conversation.
- Check if it's a scam by visiting the Financial Conduct Authority's (FCA) ScamSmart website.
- Report it! Most online platforms have a reporting tool which you can use if you suspect someone online is using pictures that don't belong to them, you are suspicious of their behaviour, or they have asked you for money. Reporting their profile means it can be blocked, which helps protect others.

### ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

**Category 2** - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.
