The Assumption of Our Lady into Heaven, Body and Soul

'Bible thumpers' told me off! .Why? Because I was going to Lourdes. Eh! Yes, they expressed concern as they felt Catholics put Mary before Jesus. Some people, arguably appear to do so in the way they pray, so I quite understood their point, and, for them, Lourdes was a typical place where this happens. They called it idolatry. They were not happy with me.

So what is it about this lady, Mary of Nazareth, that we Catholics hold in such esteem and honour. Many reasons, too many to go into here. Nevertheless, let's check out just a few.

She is clearly a prophetess of the highest calibre and quite a radical revolutionary in her own way as we see in today's Gospel. The Angel Gabriel incident, we call the Annunciation shows her to be a true listener in prayer. Today's visitation shows her to be a woman of action, totally self-confident and self-possessed, yet knows God is in charge, leading the way. And the extraordinary prayer we hear today called the Magnificat, shows her to be a prophetess second to none. So what does she prophesy?

1) Religious freedom, his mercy reaches from age to age, God's love is available to <u>everyone</u>. Religiously bigoted people may not like this. 2)*Social freedom, routing the proud of heart*, God doesn't respect class or status, yet we can so easily think of ourselves as better than another because of title, power or money. 3)*Political freedom, pulling the mighty from their thrones, raising the lowly,* does Our Lady have communist tendencies? Equality for all? Is that our God? And, 4) *Economic freedom, filling the hungry with good things, sending the rich empty away.* God is always on the side of the victim, especially victims of both war and an unjust society. That kind of God pleases no-one who has, or looks for worldly power and privilege.

So Mary, Our Lady, is a woman of the world, yet completely open to grace. So she is *full of grace*. We say it often...*Hail Mary*...She struggles, yet she lets <u>neither</u> personal plans (wedding arrangements or otherwise) nor personal needs get between her and God, God's power and love. All this, and so much more, allows her Assumption to make sense. All we can do is follow her example and know the same awaits us all.

Exploring the encyclical Laudato si

CRIMINALS TARGET THOSE LOOKING FOR LOVE WITH BOGUS INVESTMENTS

Action Fraud is warning romance seekers to be cautious when using dating platforms, as new data reveals criminals have already conned over £15 million out of unsuspecting lovers with bogus investment opportunities.

Almost a quarter (23 per cent) of victims were aged 30 to 39 years old, and around two thirds of victims (60 per cent) were aged 30 to 59 years old.



While the vast majority of investments offered are in cryptocurrency, ,money has also been handed over by individuals believing they're investing in other commodities, including stocks and shares and gold.

How to protect yourself:

- Don't send money No matter how long you've been speaking to someone online, if you haven't met them in person, do not send them any money.
- Don't be rushed into making an investment. Be wary if you're being pressured to invest quickly, or promised returns that sound too good to be true.
- Research the person you're talking to Performing a reverse image search can find photos that have been taken from somewhere, or someone, else.
- Be suspicious if you are contacted out the blue about an investment opportunity. Always seek advice from friends or family and consider getting independent professional advice before making a significant financial decision.
- Stay on the site's messaging service until you meet in person. Criminals want to quickly switch to other platforms that are less well regulated and have stronger encryption, so there's no evidence of your conversation.
- Check if it's a scam by visiting the Financial Conduct Authority's (FCA) ScamSmart website.
- Report it! Most online platforms have a reporting tool which you can use if you suspect someone online is using pictures that don't belong to them, you are suspicious of their behaviour, or they have asked you for money. Reporting their profile means it can be blocked, which helps protect others.





Covid vaccine passport scam

Essex Police are warning residents about scam emails purporting to be from the NHS.



The emails – which carry the NHS logo – are being sent out asking for payment in return for a 'Coronavirus Digital Passport' to prove that someone has been vaccinated for Covid-19.

A button takes users through to a fake NHS website, which asks for payment details.

When clicking on the link in the email, it takes you to a convincing but fake NHS website and then asks for personal and payment details. Do not click on this link."

"Your vaccination status is obtained free through either the NHS app, website or by calling the NHS on 119."


Take Five

Always take a moment to stop and think before parting with money or your personal information, it could prevent you from falling victim to fraud. Remember, it's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.

Report It

If you receive a suspicious text message, you can report it by forwarding the message to 7726 free of charge. Suspicious telephone/mobile calls can be reported to Action Fraud via their website: police.uk/report-phishing

Received an email your not sure about?

Cyber criminals won't let up using fake messages as bait to lure you into clicking on the links within their scam email or text message, so that you give away your sensitive information (such as bank details).

These messages may look like the real thing but are malicious. Once clicked, you may be sent to a dodgy website which could download viruses onto your computer, or steal your passwords.

If you have received an email which you're not quite sure about, forward it to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS): report@phishing.gov.uk.

What happens next :



The National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) will analyse the suspect email and any websites it links to.

They'll use any additional information you've provided to look for and monitor suspicious activity.

If they discover activity that they believe is malicious, they may:

- . seek to block the address the email came from, so it can no longer send emails
- work with hosting companies to remove links to malicious websites
- raise awareness of commonly reported suspicious emails and methods used (via partners)

Whilst the NCSC is unable to inform you of the outcome of its review, they can confirm that they do act upon every message received.





Essex Police Fraud Alert System



RUFF TIME FOR ANIMAL LOVERS AS SCALE OF PANDEMIC PET FRAUD UNLEASHED

Action Fraud is reminding animal lovers to take extra care when buying a pet online, as new figures show more than £2.5 million has been lost to criminals through fake pet adverts.



Could you spot the signs of pet fraud?

30th July 2021

Capitalising on the rise in people getting pets due to the national lockdowns caused by coronavirus, criminals have been posting fake adverts on social media, online marketplaces and specific pet-selling platforms.

Unsuspecting victims will be asked to pay a deposit for the pet without seeing it in person first, with many criminals using the restrictions caused by the pandemic as a reason why. After the initial payment is made, more and more funds will be requested to cover additional costs such as insurance, vaccinations and even delivery of the pet.

How to protect yourself

- Do your research especially if you're making a purchase from a website or person you don't know and trust. Look up reviews of the website or person you're buying from. Or check the seller's feedback history
 - Trust your instincts if you're unable to view the animal in person, ask for a video call. If you're buying a young animal, make sure you're able to see the mother and rest of the litter. Any responsible seller will understand why you want to view the animal in person. If the seller declines, challenge them on why. If you have any suspicions, do not pay any money until you're certain it's genuine.
 - Choose your payment method wisely always avoid paying by bank transfer. Credit card or payment services such as PayPal give you a better chance of recovering your money if you become a victim of fraud.
 - If things go wrong Anyone can fall victim to fraud. If you think you've been a victim of fraud, contact your bank immediately and report it to Action Fraud online at <u>actionfraud.police.uk</u> or by calling 0300 123 2040.

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.
