Divorce, re-marriage, separation. Highly sensitive issues. People so wrongly and unjustly stigmatised. Understanding and encouragement are always needed, not the raising of eyebrows in quiet criticism. So many good, decent people have been badly hurt by marriage break-ups, and are making an admirable job in putting their lives back together again. Yes, we live a very secular world that doesn't appreciate our teachings on marriage, relentlessly imposing its own problems, agendas and challenges to married couples, which leaves us wondering about God's will for us. Hard, often for married couples, so it is with the priest.

Yes, a couple commit themselves to each other in love for life at God's altar, with families and friends as witnesses. This must of course be the genuine intention of both. It is a partnership that involves the full weight of both personalities, this is God's desire, no lightweight thing. A priest lies prostrate before God at his ordination and commits himself for life to prayer and serving the people of God with love in his heart. He must intend this. Priesthood and marriage both need regular re-commitment. The couple continually remind each other of their mutual love through telling each other and by their actions. The priest regularly re-commits himself through prayer along with a sound and balanced service of the people. Both these vocations need working at. Life is not easy, nor is it meant to be, challenges, hard as they can be, help us to grow, develop, learn, deepen.

Yes, marriage between baptised people is of its nature indissoluble, that is our church teaching and Catholic tradition as it is. I am not offering this as personal or pastoral advice. Individual cases are not being addressed here. It is only right that adequate consideration to church teaching be given. Equally; the church must be fair and compassionate about the results of the harsher, maybe unjust blows life throws at us. In all people's and couples' troubled lives, how can we work and struggle together to find growth, life, grace, mercy, peace and God himself – in these people in their unique and troubled situation, right here, right now. That is, and must always be the church's mission.

We need to strike a fair balance. Fairness and consideration must work both ways.

Letter from Bishop Alan:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, in today's first reading, from the Book of Genesis, we heard about the creation of Eve, from the rib of Adam. In the Gospel Jesus tells us, "Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them, for it is to such as these that the Kingdom of God belongs."

These two images chime deeply this pivotal moment in the life of our planet. God's creation was gifted to us in that same Book of Genesis. Adam and Eve are asked to "till" and "keep" the earth – to steward it, care for it, and cherish it. Yet as we consider the children in the Gospel, so precious in Jesus' sight, we have to ask ourselves what kind of world we are handing on to our children, and children yet unborn? This summer has seen wild fires raging in Southern Europe, traumatic flooding in India, Pakistan and America, and a devastating earthquake in Haiti. There can be no doubt that weather patterns are shifting,

and it is the poorest people in the world who are often the ones that are suffering the most.

So how can we respond? Our faith roots us in a Biblical landscape full of natural images – lakes and mountains, fish and sheep, fig trees and olive groves, wheat and lambs. Pope Francis says, "The Lord was ... in constant touch with nature, lending it an attention full of fondness and wonder." The Pope wrote those words in 2015, in a letter addressed to the whole world. It is called Laudato Si' and these are the first words of a prayer of St Francis of Assisi – they translate as, Praise Be.

"Praise Be to brother sun and sister moon," writes St Francis as he continues referring to all creation as brother and sister. In those simple words he reminds us that we are all interconnected. St Thomas Aquinas, the great Philosopher and Theologian, said "In every living creature there is a trace of the Trinity." In Laudato Si' Pope Francis draws together these centuries of prayer and wisdom, and asks us urgently to "Listen to the Cry of the Earth, and the Cry of the Poor."

Now, in the autumn of 2021, we find ourselves at a moment which will define how human beings respond to the challenges of Climate Change. In less than a month world leaders gather in Glasgow, and the decisions they make will affect us all. So today you are receiving information about what the Diocese is doing, and what you are invited to do, as individuals and as a parish. As part of this, each of us are asked to make three personal pledges, three ways in which we will act differently. This is not just another environmental campaign; it is an integral part of our faith. In making your personal pledges – in working to heal the planet, and in striving for justice for the poorest people in the world – you are a living witness to Jesus Christ: do not be afraid to tell people why you are doing whatever you choose to do.

Let me now offer some very personal words. I have been deeply blessed in my life to explore mountains, often in Scotland. Mountains are part of the Biblical landscape, where they are places of encounter with God. For me, they are places where I see the immense scale, detail, force and wonder of God's creation. There are moments when I have savoured the stillness and peace of an unparalleled view from a mountain peak. I sense God, and such moments inspire me to pray. So as I see the destruction of God's creation due to the effects of climate change, I take the pledges that I make today very seriously. I will be eating less meat; I will be walking more often; I will be praying much more regularly on the challenges to God's Creation and the urgent issues around climate change.

Today, I am also mindful of my role as Shepherd of the Diocese. It is a feature of our Church that much good work can remain hidden. This weekend, unusually, we are shining a light on what we do, so that you know about it and can share

it. For over thirty years Brentwood Diocese has firmly refused to invest in tobacco or weapons manufacturers, into addition to those who produce pornography, or those who make chemical products that go against our teaching that all life is sacred. Now we have added to this; in the last three months we have divested completely from companies that produce or trade fossil fuel. In 2018 we became an employer that pays the real living wage, lifting families from poverty. The electricity and gas used in almost all our Diocesan buildings now comes from renewable sources.

To reinforce these Diocesan actions, and our personal pledges, today I urgently encourage every school and parish to work towards the Cafod LiveSimply award; this will have a great effect across East London and Essex. The Diocese is full of natural beauty, and we can help to enhance that, creating new havens for wildlife, volunteering with local charities, and growing fruit and vegetables on our land. Personally, I am very pleased to be helping to lead work which will seriously examine our use of energy in the Diocese, most especially in our buildings, and you will hear more about that in your own parish during 2022.

In an interview, Mother Teresa, now a Saint of our Church, was once asked about how her work with the poorest people in Calcutta could possibly make a difference, as there were so many of them. She replied, "Is what I am doing to serve the poor just a drop in the ocean? Yes. It is. But many drops make a different ocean."

Our personal pledges are drops in the ocean – but there are, at least, over 45,000 committed Catholics in our Diocese. That's 135,000 pledges! Making sacrifices; listening to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. In this way, in the name of Jesus Christ, we can help to make a different ocean.

I ask you, with me, to offer it all in prayer: "Teach us afresh, Lord, to care for our common home in the way that you care for us Teach us afresh, Lord, to see 'a trace of the Trinity' in every part of creation Teach us afresh, Lord, the precious truth that each person we meet is a sister or brother of your Son, Jesus Christ."



A few printed newsletters will be left on the shelf outside the presbytery after each weekend Mass. These are primarily designated for anyone who has no email access.


If you are able to print off newsletters yourselves and deliver to anyone who can't get out, that would be a great act of charity. Thank you.

Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.



You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

Signs of Sexual Exploitation • A longer-term rent of more than 2 weeks and less than 2 months of any premise. • Frequent visitors throughout the day and night • Rubbish full of condoms and massage oil • Curtains closed permanently during the day and night • A variety of cars parked up on the drive during the hire period. • Evidence that numerous people have been staying at the address, not just the number listed (modern day slaves could be kept 4 or more to a room meant for just 1 person) • Occupants not seen to leave the premise during the time of the hire • Complaints by neighbours of an increased level of noise or anti-social behaviour •
