# 17<sup>th</sup> October 2021 29B Psalter Week 1

So embarrassing – failing exams. Especially when your friends are doing well. I know to my cost. Failing 'A' levels, so no university place. I felt so powerless. Painful. But thank God, one or two kind and wise people helped me along. I was told to try to find God and his will in this. I began to work with people with disabilities, while re-taking, and re-taking exams until I finally I got there. Not easy. I feel sure God wanted to introduce me to the world of disability, so I needed to fail, or no introduction. God was in my failure, my powerlessness, my pain. So real.

Jesus always sides with those whose lives are "failures". In fact, this is the perspective of the whole Bible. To read the Bible from the perspective of "establishment" is to completely miss the point. Just feel Jesus' frustration with his disciples as he is trying to teach them the way of powerlessness, the way of descent. They just don't get it. Too much for them, too much for us, if like them, we continue to look for status, trying to climb the ladder of success.

Interestingly, the philosopher Neitsche hated Jesus because of Jesus' teachings on powerlessness. He concluded, *European civilisation must be strong and powerful so it can triumph, we must be Supermen! God is dead!* Whilst we do not agree with his conclusions, he understood Jesus. Yet Jesus' own disciples do not. Hitler came soon after Neitsche, followed his teachings, the rest we know.

Jesus teaches that the only power we can trust is in those who have experienced powerlessness – learned from it, and found God right there. Found meaning. Hence the cross. In our powerlessness, God can really use us, not so if it is all about social climbing, status, success etc. No-one likes failure, or descent. But that is mainly where we find God. We all need one or two kind and wise friends to nurse us through. The disciples miss the point. Do we? They want importance, self-ambition. Do we? Where in life do we feel **un**important, rejected, inferior, hurt, betrayed, a failure etc? That's where God can really be found. Would you rather listen to someone who is "powerful", or someone whose power comes through experiencing powerlessness, hurt and failure and then won through?



### Afghanistan.....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. <u>https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/</u>

Caritas Brentwood is recognised as a "Lead Sponsor" which will eliminate some of the hurdles.

# Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.



<u>Stopping Adult Sexual Exploitation</u> This month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. The victims are smuggled into the UK illegally and are If you have any information about possible organised crime, victims of such crime or vulnerable people subject of exploitation, please inform Essex Police or CrimeStoppers on 0800 555111 Organised Crime Newsletter forced into prostitution in order to pay off their debts. 2. The victims are vulnerable UK citizens and the Organised Crime Groups pray upon their vulnerabilities through threats of violence or by supplying them drugs or alcohol. Signs of Sexual Exploitation • A longer-term rent of more than 2 weeks and less than 2 months of any premise. • Frequent visitors throughout the day and night • Rubbish full of condoms and massage oil • Curtains closed permanently during the day and night • A variety of cars parked up on the drive during the hire period. • Evidence that numerous people have been staying at the address, not just the number listed (modern day slaves could be kept 4 or more to a room meant for just 1 person) • Occupants not seen to leave the premise during the time of the hire • Complaints by neighbours of an increased level of noise or anti-social behaviour •

# ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

**Category 2** - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.
