The Emperor's New Clothes. Remember the story? The emperor had no clothes on. What were the people indoctrinated and conditioned to see? Beautiful clothes. A collective and wrong seeing. Until a child who society hadn't yet conditioned....We probably know the story.

However brainy or intelligent we think we are, it is so easy to see what others see. It's what we are taught to see. It's so often what we are expected to see. And that's what we see.

A blind man, not conditioned by society or culture because he is on the edges of society, cries out to Jesus for help. A blind man, not indoctrinated by society uses his wisdom to see. To see the truth of who Jesus is. Those who are conditioned try to silence him. A conditioning that makes them blind to the truth. The man's only possession, a cloak, all he had, he threw aside, such was his faith. Everything he had he threw aside for faith. How much do we throw aside in the search for faith? Result: he could physically see as well as spiritually see.

So we must be careful with our indoctrinations and conditionings that can so easily blind us as to what is really there, what is right in front of us.

So we see that even well-intentioned and educated people are fooled. They cannot see beyond their own self-interests and society's expectations. The Emperor's New Clothes look beautiful! But the child or the blind person sees the truth, and embarrasses those who think they can see.

Like the blind man, we need the gift of wisdom. To go beyond any conditioning, brainwashing and indoctrination. Never easy. So we see truth. We see Jesus for who he really is. Seeing beyond society's lies. To see subtlety, nuances, different shades of meaning – this is the stuff of true wisdom and true seeing so desperately needed in our world today. To see truth. Dare we desire such seeing?

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.

Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/

Caritas Brentwood is recognised as a "Lead Sponsor" which will eliminate some of the hurdles.



Stopping Adult Sexual Exploitation This

month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work

together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. The victims are smuggled into the UK illegally and are If you have any information about possible organised crime, victims of such crime or vulnerable people subject of exploitation, please inform Essex Police or CrimeStoppers on 0800 555111 Organised Crime Newsletter forced into prostitution in order to pay off their debts. 2. The victims are vulnerable UK citizens and the Organised Crime Groups pray upon their vulnerabilities through threats of violence or by supplying them drugs or alcohol. Signs of Sexual Exploitation • A longer-term rent of more than 2 weeks and less than 2 months of any premise. • Frequent visitors throughout the day and night • Rubbish full of condoms and massage oil • Curtains closed permanently during the day and night • A variety of cars parked up on the drive during the hire period. • Evidence that numerous people have been staying at the address, not just the number listed (modern day slaves could be kept 4 or more to a room meant for just 1 person) • Occupants not seen to leave

the premise during the time of the hire • Complaints by neighbours of an increased level of noise or anti-social behaviour •

Criminals continue to target the elderly

Essex Police is warning the public to protect their loved ones as criminals cheat older and vulnerable victims out of cash and high value items through courier fraud.



Data from Action Fraud, reveals that £10,325,133 has been lost by victims to courier fraud since the start of this year – an increase of almost two thirds (63 per cent) compared to the same period last year.

- Stop: taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- Challenge: could it be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to verify your personal details or PIN by phone, or offer to pick up your bank card by courier. Hang up immediately if you receive a

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.

The Emperor's New Clothes. Remember the story? The emperor had no clothes on. What were the people indoctrinated and conditioned to see? Beautiful clothes. A collective and wrong seeing. Until a child who society hadn't yet conditioned....We probably know the story.

However brainy or intelligent we think we are, it is so easy to see what others see. It's what we are taught to see. It's so often what we are expected to see. And that's what we see.

A blind man, not conditioned by society or culture because he is on the edges of society, cries out to Jesus for help. A blind man, not indoctrinated by society uses his wisdom to see. To see the truth of who Jesus is. Those who are conditioned try to silence him. A conditioning that makes them blind to the truth. The man's only possession, a cloak, all he had, he threw aside, such was his faith. Everything he had he threw aside for faith. How much do we throw aside in the search for faith? Result: he could physically see as well as spiritually see.

So we must be careful with our indoctrinations and conditionings that can so easily blind us as to what is really there, what is right in front of us.

So we see that even well-intentioned and educated people are fooled. They cannot see beyond their own self-interests and society's expectations. The Emperor's New Clothes look beautiful! But the child or the blind person sees the truth, and embarrasses those who think they can see.

Like the blind man, we need the gift of wisdom. To go beyond any conditioning, brainwashing and indoctrination. Never easy. So we see truth. We see Jesus for who he really is. Seeing beyond society's lies. To see subtlety, nuances, different shades of meaning – this is the stuff of true wisdom and true seeing so desperately needed in our world today. To see truth. Dare we desire such seeing?

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.

Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/

Caritas Brentwood is recognised as a "Lead Sponsor" which will eliminate some of the hurdles.



month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work

together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. The victims are smuggled into the UK illegally and are If you have any information about possible organised crime, victims of such crime or vulnerable people subject of exploitation, please inform Essex Police or CrimeStoppers on 0800 555111 Organised Crime Newsletter forced into prostitution in order to pay off their debts. 2. The victims are vulnerable UK citizens and the Organised Crime Groups pray upon their vulnerabilities through threats of violence or by supplying them drugs or alcohol. Signs of Sexual Exploitation • A longer-term rent of more than 2 weeks and less than 2 months of any premise. • Frequent visitors throughout the day and night • Rubbish full of condoms and massage oil • Curtains closed permanently during the day and night • A variety of cars parked up on the drive during the hire period. • Evidence that numerous people have been staying at the address, not just the number listed (modern day slaves could be kept 4 or more to a room meant for just 1 person) • Occupants not seen to leave

the premise during the time of the hire • Complaints by neighbours of an increased level of noise or anti-social behaviour •

Criminals continue to target the elderly

Essex Police is warning the public to protect their loved ones as criminals cheat older and vulnerable victims out of cash and high value items through courier fraud.



Data from Action Fraud, reveals that £10,325,133 has been lost by victims to courier fraud since the start of this year – an increase of almost two thirds (63 per cent) compared to the same period last year.

- Stop: taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- Challenge: could it be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to verify your personal details or PIN by phone, or offer to pick up your bank card by courier. Hang up immediately if you receive a

You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.

The Emperor's New Clothes. Remember the story? The emperor had no clothes on. What were the people indoctrinated and conditioned to see? Beautiful clothes. A collective and wrong seeing. Until a child who society hadn't yet conditioned....We probably know the story.

However brainy or intelligent we think we are, it is so easy to see what others see. It's what we are taught to see. It's so often what we are expected to see. And that's what we see.

A blind man, not conditioned by society or culture because he is on the edges of society, cries out to Jesus for help. A blind man, not indoctrinated by society uses his wisdom to see. To see the truth of who Jesus is. Those who are conditioned try to silence him. A conditioning that makes them blind to the truth. The man's only possession, a cloak, all he had, he threw aside, such was his faith. Everything he had he threw aside for faith. How much do we throw aside in the search for faith? Result: he could physically see as well as spiritually see.

So we must be careful with our indoctrinations and conditionings that can so easily blind us as to what is really there, what is right in front of us.

So we see that even well-intentioned and educated people are fooled. They cannot see beyond their own self-interests and society's expectations. The Emperor's New Clothes look beautiful! But the child or the blind person sees the truth, and embarrasses those who think they can see.

Like the blind man, we need the gift of wisdom. To go beyond any conditioning, brainwashing and indoctrination. Never easy. So we see truth. We see Jesus for who he really is. Seeing beyond society's lies. To see subtlety, nuances, different shades of meaning – this is the stuff of true wisdom and true seeing so desperately needed in our world today. To see truth. Dare we desire such seeing?

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.

Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/



month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work

together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. Signs of Sexual Exploitation • A longer-term rent of more than 2 weeks and less than 2 months of any premise. • Frequent visitors throughout the day and night • Rubbish full of condoms and massage oil • Curtains closed permanently during the day and night • A variety of cars parked up on the drive during the hire period. • Evidence that numerous people have been staying at the address, not just the number listed (modern day slaves could be kept 4 or more to a room meant for just 1 person) • Occupants not seen to leave

the premise during the time of the hire • Complaints by neighbours of an increased level of noise or anti-social behaviour •

Criminals continue to target the elderly

Essex Police is warning the public to protect their loved ones as criminals cheat older and vulnerable victims out of cash and high value items through courier fraud.



Data from Action Fraud, reveals that £10,325,133 has been lost by victims to courier fraud since the start of this year – an increase of almost two thirds (63 per cent) compared to the same period last year.

- Stop: taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- Challenge: could it be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to

The Emperor's New Clothes. Remember the story? The emperor had no clothes on. What were the people indoctrinated and conditioned to see? Beautiful clothes. A collective and wrong seeing. Until a child who society hadn't yet conditioned....We probably know the story.

However brainy or intelligent we think we are, it is so easy to see what others see. It's what we are taught to see. It's so often what we are expected to see. And that's what we see.

A blind man, not conditioned by society or culture because he is on the edges of society, cries out to Jesus for help. A blind man, not indoctrinated by society uses his wisdom to see. To see the truth of who Jesus is. Those who are conditioned try to silence him. A conditioning that makes them blind to the truth. The man's only possession, a cloak, all he had, he threw aside, such was his faith. Everything he had he threw aside for faith. How much do we throw aside in the search for faith? Result: he could physically see as well as spiritually see.

So we must be careful with our indoctrinations and conditionings that can so easily blind us as to what is really there, what is right in front of us.

So we see that even well-intentioned and educated people are fooled. They cannot see beyond their own self-interests and society's expectations. The Emperor's New Clothes look beautiful! But the child or the blind person sees the truth, and embarrasses those who think they can see.

Like the blind man, we need the gift of wisdom. To go beyond any conditioning, brainwashing and indoctrination. Never easy. So we see truth. We see Jesus for who he really is. Seeing beyond society's lies. To see subtlety, nuances, different shades of meaning – this is the stuff of true wisdom and true seeing so desperately needed in our world today. To see truth. Dare we desire such seeing?

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.

Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/



month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work

together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. the premise during the time of the hire • Complaints by neighbours of an increased level of noise or anti-social behaviour •

Criminals continue to target the elderly

Essex Police is warning the public to protect their loved ones as criminals cheat older and vulnerable victims out of cash and high value items through courier fraud.



Data from Action Fraud, reveals that £10,325,133 has been lost by victims to courier fraud since the start of this year – an increase of almost two thirds (63 per cent) compared to the same period last year.

- Stop: taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- Challenge: could it be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to

The Emperor's New Clothes. Remember the story? The emperor had no clothes on. What were the people indoctrinated and conditioned to see? Beautiful clothes. A collective and wrong seeing. Until a child who society hadn't yet conditioned....We probably know the story.

However brainy or intelligent we think we are, it is so easy to see what others see. It's what we are taught to see. It's so often what we are expected to see. And that's what we see.

A blind man, not conditioned by society or culture because he is on the edges of society, cries out to Jesus for help. A blind man, not indoctrinated by society uses his wisdom to see. To see the truth of who Jesus is. Those who are conditioned try to silence him. A conditioning that makes them blind to the truth. The man's only possession, a cloak, all he had, he threw aside, such was his faith. Everything he had he threw aside for faith. How much do we throw aside in the search for faith? Result: he could physically see as well as spiritually see.

So we must be careful with our indoctrinations and conditionings that can so easily blind us as to what is really there, what is right in front of us.

So we see that even well-intentioned and educated people are fooled. They cannot see beyond their own self-interests and society's expectations. The Emperor's New Clothes look beautiful! But the child or the blind person sees the truth, and embarrasses those who think they can see.

Like the blind man, we need the gift of wisdom. To go beyond any conditioning, brainwashing and indoctrination. Never easy. So we see truth. We see Jesus for who he really is. Seeing beyond society's lies. To see subtlety, nuances, different shades of meaning – this is the stuff of true wisdom and true seeing so desperately needed in our world today. To see truth. Dare we desire such seeing?

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.

Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/



month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work

together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. Signs of Sexual Exploitation • A longer-term rent of more than 2 weeks and less than 2 months of any premise. • Frequent visitors throughout the day and night • Rubbish full of condoms and massage oil • Curtains closed permanently during the day and night • A variety of cars parked up on the drive during the hire period. • Evidence that numerous people have been staying at the address, not just the number listed (modern day slaves could be kept 4 or more to a room meant for just 1 person) • Occupants not seen to leave

the premise during the time of the hire • Complaints by neighbours of an increased level of noise or anti-social behaviour •

Criminals continue to target the elderly

Essex Police is warning the public to protect their loved ones as criminals cheat older and vulnerable victims out of cash and high value items through courier fraud.



Data from Action Fraud, reveals that £10,325,133 has been lost by victims to courier fraud since the start of this year – an increase of almost two thirds (63 per cent) compared to the same period last year.

The Emperor's New Clothes. Remember the story? The emperor had no clothes on. What were the people indoctrinated and conditioned to see? Beautiful clothes. A collective and wrong seeing. Until a child who society hadn't yet conditioned....We probably know the story.

However brainy or intelligent we think we are, it is so easy to see what others see. It's what we are taught to see. It's so often what we are expected to see. And that's what we see.

A blind man, not conditioned by society or culture because he is on the edges of society, cries out to Jesus for help. A blind man, not indoctrinated by society uses his wisdom to see. To see the truth of who Jesus is. Those who are conditioned try to silence him. A conditioning that makes them blind to the truth. The man's only possession, a cloak, all he had, he threw aside, such was his faith. Everything he had he threw aside for faith. How much do we throw aside in the search for faith? Result: he could physically see as well as spiritually see.

So we must be careful with our indoctrinations and conditionings that can so easily blind us as to what is really there, what is right in front of us.

So we see that even well-intentioned and educated people are fooled. They cannot see beyond their own self-interests and society's expectations. The Emperor's New Clothes look beautiful! But the child or the blind person sees the truth, and embarrasses those who think they can see.

Like the blind man, we need the gift of wisdom. To go beyond any conditioning, brainwashing and indoctrination. Never easy. So we see truth. We see Jesus for who he really is. Seeing beyond society's lies. To see subtlety, nuances, different shades of meaning – this is the stuff of true wisdom and true seeing so desperately needed in our world today. To see truth. Dare we desire such seeing?

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.

Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/



month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work

together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. The victims are smuggled into the UK illegally and are If you have any information about possible organised crime, victims of such crime or vulnerable people subject of exploitation, please inform Essex Police or CrimeStoppers on 0800 555111 Organised Crime Newsletter forced into prostitution in order to pay off their debts. 2. The victims are vulnerable UK citizens and the Organised Crime Groups pray upon their vulnerabilities through threats of violence or by supplying them drugs or alcohol. Signs of Sexual Exploitation • A longer-term rent of more than 2 weeks and less than 2 months of any premise. • Frequent visitors throughout the day and night • Rubbish full of condoms and massage oil • Curtains closed permanently during the day and night • A variety of cars parked up on the drive during the hire period. • Evidence that numerous people have been staying at the address, not just the number listed (modern day slaves could be kept 4 or more to a room meant for just 1 person) • Occupants not seen to leave

Criminals continue to target the elderly

Essex Police is warning the public to protect their loved ones as criminals cheat older and vulnerable victims out of cash and high value items through courier fraud.



Data from Action Fraud, reveals that £10,325,133 has been lost by victims to courier fraud since the start of this year – an increase of almost two thirds (63 per cent) compared to the same period last year.

- Stop: taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- Challenge: could it be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you

The Emperor's New Clothes. Remember the story? The emperor had no clothes on. What were the people indoctrinated and conditioned to see? Beautiful clothes. A collective and wrong seeing. Until a child who society hadn't yet conditioned....We probably know the story.

However brainy or intelligent we think we are, it is so easy to see what others see. It's what we are taught to see. It's so often what we are expected to see. And that's what we see.

A blind man, not conditioned by society or culture because he is on the edges of society, cries out to Jesus for help. A blind man, not indoctrinated by society uses his wisdom to see. To see the truth of who Jesus is. Those who are conditioned try to silence him. A conditioning that makes them blind to the truth. The man's only possession, a cloak, all he had, he threw aside, such was his faith. Everything he had he threw aside for faith. How much do we throw aside in the search for faith? Result: he could physically see as well as spiritually see.

So we must be careful with our indoctrinations and conditionings that can so easily blind us as to what is really there, what is right in front of us.

So we see that even well-intentioned and educated people are fooled. They cannot see beyond their own self-interests and society's expectations. The Emperor's New Clothes look beautiful! But the child or the blind person sees the truth, and embarrasses those who think they can see.

Like the blind man, we need the gift of wisdom. To go beyond any conditioning, brainwashing and indoctrination. Never easy. So we see truth. We see Jesus for who he really is. Seeing beyond society's lies. To see subtlety, nuances, different shades of meaning – this is the stuff of true wisdom and true seeing so desperately needed in our world today. To see truth. Dare we desire such seeing?

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.

Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/



Stopping Adult Sexual Exploitation This

month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work

together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. Criminals continue to target the elderly

Essex Police is warning the public to protect their loved ones as criminals cheat older and vulnerable victims out of cash and high value items through courier fraud.



Data from Action Fraud, reveals that £10,325,133 has been lost by victims to courier fraud since the start of this year – an increase of almost two thirds (63 per cent) compared to the same period last year.

- Stop: taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- Challenge: could it be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you

The Emperor's New Clothes. Remember the story? The emperor had no clothes on. What were the people indoctrinated and conditioned to see? Beautiful clothes. A collective and wrong seeing. Until a child who society hadn't yet conditioned....We probably know the story.

However brainy or intelligent we think we are, it is so easy to see what others see. It's what we are taught to see. It's so often what we are expected to see. And that's what we see.

A blind man, not conditioned by society or culture because he is on the edges of society, cries out to Jesus for help. A blind man, not indoctrinated by society uses his wisdom to see. To see the truth of who Jesus is. Those who are conditioned try to silence him. A conditioning that makes them blind to the truth. The man's only possession, a cloak, all he had, he threw aside, such was his faith. Everything he had he threw aside for faith. How much do we throw aside in the search for faith? Result: he could physically see as well as spiritually see.

So we must be careful with our indoctrinations and conditionings that can so easily blind us as to what is really there, what is right in front of us.

So we see that even well-intentioned and educated people are fooled. They cannot see beyond their own self-interests and society's expectations. The Emperor's New Clothes look beautiful! But the child or the blind person sees the truth, and embarrasses those who think they can see.

Like the blind man, we need the gift of wisdom. To go beyond any conditioning, brainwashing and indoctrination. Never easy. So we see truth. We see Jesus for who he really is. Seeing beyond society's lies. To see subtlety, nuances, different shades of meaning – this is the stuff of true wisdom and true seeing so desperately needed in our world today. To see truth. Dare we desire such seeing?

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.

Afghanistan....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/



month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work

together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. Signs of Sexual Exploitation • A longer-term rent of more than 2 weeks and less than 2 months of any premise. • Frequent visitors throughout the day and night • Rubbish full of condoms and massage oil • Curtains closed permanently during the day and night • A variety of cars parked up on the drive during the hire period. • Evidence that numerous people have been staying at the address, not just the number listed (modern day slaves could be kept 4 or more to a room meant for just 1 person) • Occupants not seen to leave

the premise during the time of the hire • Complaints by neighbours of an increased level of noise or anti-social behaviour •

Criminals continue to target the elderly

Essex Police is warning the public to protect their loved ones as criminals cheat older and vulnerable victims out of cash and high value items through courier fraud.



Data from Action Fraud, reveals that £10,325,133 has been lost by victims to courier fraud since the start of this year – an increase of almost two thirds (63 per cent) compared to the same period last year.

- Stop: taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- Challenge: could it be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to verify your personal details or PIN by phone, or offer to pick up your bank card by courier. Hang up immediately if you receive a

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.
