Reflection - November 7th Week 32B Psalter Week 4

"Get Clive to sing", the Educational Psychologist suggested. So I did. I played guitar, and he sang beautifully, solo, self-conscious but in tune and with a certain clarity. We shared lumps in throats and tears of joy. For Clive had severe learning and physical challenges and a terrible nervous stammer. Not a single stammer when he sang. And yet with all his issues, his kindness and generosity shone through. If another child became upset, he would want to show his warmth and concern and console them, sometimes with a hug.

I understood that largely due to his disabilities Clive was abandoned by both parents and others. They couldn't cope. He was mainly brought up by his aging grandmother who herself found it all pretty difficult. My question is 'how was he able to be so thoughtful and loving, and yet he was so abandoned? Wouldn't you expect some kind of deep-rooted anger?

But no. Something else is happening here. I am certain that Clive had a "preconscious" knowledge and experience of the divine. The divine allowed him to show his generosity and concern. He was open. No formal teaching, but he knew. Maybe as a result of his vulnerability, his powerlessness. What else had he?

Nature made Clive that way. Why? Who knows? Yet in all that, he gave much.

So many of the young people I worked with, young people facing so many challenges, displaying experiences of the divine, because no other constraints, (or at least very few,) get in their way.

Most "mainstream" people have to harshly re-learn something through vulnerability, failure, betrayal and powerlessness to really experience the Lord's power. What social and emotional constraints are in our way? How can we get them out of the way so the divine can shine through us? Today we see a widow, at the bottom of the social heap, who gives all she had. She is free of all these constraints so is free enough to allow God to work through her. Society wrongly made her that way. She gave her all. It's not the quantity of the giving, but proportion. In that sense, she is the most generous of all.

God is in our own vulnerability? That is finally where His power lies. How far are we prepared to empty ourselves to find His power? So it's not about us, but Him.

Assisted Dying Bill. What can we do?

This 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.

Marriage Care is looking to recruit those who would be interested in training as counsellors to support those in need – regardless of their ability to pay.

This CRC Course: The 2 year Certificate in Relationship Counselling course will start in Spring 2022 and will be delivered via a programme of face to face and online training weekends. This training opportunity has been made possible in thanks to the generous support of the Diocese of Westminster Cardinal's Lenten Appeal Fund and the voluntary commitment of Marriage Care's training team and Centre members.

Whilst there is no charge to trainees for the course itself, if selected there is a non-refundable deposit of £150 to secure your place and we invite trainees to set up a monthly donation (suggested amount of £40) for the first 12 months - towards costs of accommodation and meals at training weekends. Afghanistan.....what can we do?

As the tragedy unfolding in Afghanistan fills the news, adding to the miseries of those who have fled Syria, Iraq, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in recent years, it may well be that parishioners ask, "what can we do?"

There is now a wealth of experience within the Diocese to support any parish (or, more realistically – as part of the scheme requirement is to fundraise £9,000 – group of parishes) who wishes to look into this more deeply. I would be happy to help, and have the Chelmsford application as a template. The section of the Home Office that deals with this (known as "Reset") is also immensely supportive, with excellent briefings and training, and – via CSAN (Caritas Social Action Network) nationally, there are further networks and resources to draw from.

In Redbridge and in Colchester Catholics have been part of ecumenical projects that have welcomed families. It would also be an ideal project for an embryonic Parish Partnership to look into.

There is also excellent initial information on the CSAN website. Salford Diocese were the first to welcome a family via Community Sponsorship, and their learning has been a huge help. https://www.csan.org.uk/community-sponsorship/

Caritas Brentwood is recognised as a "Lead Sponsor" which will eliminate some of the hurdles.





Stopping Adult Sexual Exploitation This

month's newsletter is to coincide with a law enforcement campaign, which started on 6th September 2021, to increase awareness of Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking, in particular focusing upon Adult Sexual Exploitation.

As part of our commitment to tackling organised crime, we are asking for your support in identifying properties that may be being used in this way so that we can work together to protect our Community. You will undoubtedly be aware of the detrimental effects, misery and harm that modern slavery, trafficking and sexual exploitation bring, not only to our wider communities but, in particular, to those vulnerable individuals within society who are often forced, coerced or exploited into carrying out this illegal activity on behalf of organised gangs Types of Adult Sexual Exploitation

There are 2 main ways in which victims become involved in Adult Sexual Exploitation: 1. The victims are smuggled into the UK illegally and are If you have any information about possible organised crime, victims of such crime or vulnerable people subject of exploitation,

The victims are vulnerable UK citizens and the Organised Crime Groups pray upon their vulnerabilities through threats of violence or by supplying them drugs or alcohol. Signs of Sexual Exploitation • A longer-term rent of more than 2 weeks and less than 2 months of any premise. • Frequent visitors throughout the day and night • Rubbish full of condoms and massage oil • Curtains closed permanently during the day and night • A variety of cars parked up on the drive during the hire period. • Evidence that numerous people have been staying at the address, not just the number listed (modern day slaves could be kept 4 or more to a room meant for just 1 person) • Occupants not seen to leave the premise during the time of the hire • Complaints by neighbours of an increased level of noise or anti-social behaviour •

Criminals continue to target the elderly

Essex Police is warning the public to protect their loved ones as criminals cheat older and vulnerable victims out of cash and high value items through courier fraud.



Data from Action Fraud, reveals that £10,325,133 has been lost by victims to courier fraud since the start of this year – an increase of almost two thirds (63 per cent) compared to the same period last year.

- Stop: taking a moment to stop and think before parting with your money or information could keep you safe.
- Challenge: could it be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore any requests. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to
- Protect: Your bank or the police will never call you to ask you to verify your personal details or PIN by phone, or offer to pick up your bank card by courier. Hang up immediately if you receive a

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.
