Solemnity of Christ the King 21st November 2021 Psalter Week 2

Six years of training for the Priesthood in Rome allowed me to study books, journals, papers, articles. Studying the faith - theology, philosophy. Reasoned, logical and intellectual arguments. Great and interesting stuff. All good and necessary towards "knowing a lot" about the faith. But "living it out?" Living out the nitty-gritty day to day life of faith. That's a different question. Our beliefs are so much more about a relationship and a following that evolves into faith and trust. Something deeply personal, <u>never private</u>. Faith and love can never be reduced to logic, philosophy or intellect. It is way <u>way</u> beyond. Faith and love are so much more about relationship and trust.

We begin to realise that Jesus becomes a way of living. A way of love, a way of faith. Jesus is Jesus because he is the second person of the Blessed Trinity. To remove him from the Trinity is to do Him great injustice. He then simply becomes God, or just the "Son of God" – only to be worshiped - we lose his humanity. Hence we see so many "unchristian Christians". (Or we lose his divinity, and Jesus just becomes another "good man", nothing extra special). We are called to form a relationship and follow his humanity? It's why we celebrate Christmas. -God has given himself in humanity for us to follow, not just worship. Historically, it seems people have been taught more to "say their prayers, get to church, go to confession", a little bit of worship and you're OK. So wrong! That becomes ingrained as 'all we need'. No wonder so many 'so-called' Christians act no differently to anyone else and themselves can be so "unchristian"..

Jesus is not just the Son of God. Read the prophet Daniel chapter 7 ; read last week's Gospel and see how Jesus best describes himself. Countless times he refers to himself as the "Son of Man". The Human One. In other words I am one of you, just like you. (we often say – "like us in all ways but sin"). Jesus is the "everyman". He becomes the one who represents everyone, the personification, the archetype, the prototype human who sums up in himself what God is doing everywhere and all through history. Jesus is what humanity is at its best. Jesus is humanity all coalesced into one small moment, (33 years in Palestine, 2000 years ago). He is the blueprint of what God is doing through all history - the first image, in this way he is our King. He becomes the ultimate and safe reference point so we all have access to what it is to be truly human.

He is one of us, leading the great parade as St. Paul says - the great parade is us. The parade is being led by Jesus back to God himself. The best thing we can do is develop a relationship and follow his path. Follow Christ the King. Copy him. That is human, that's what gives life, it leads us to the divine.



The BCYS also supports our catechists and school lay chaplains. 

Protect



The National Crime Agency leads the UK's fight to cut serious and organised crime, protecting the public by targeting and pursuing those criminals who pose the greatest risk to the UK.

NCA officers work at the forefront of law enforcement, building the best possible intelligence picture of all serious and organised crime threats; relentlessly pursuing the most serious and dangerous offenders; and developing and delivering specialist capabilities on behalf of law enforcement and other partners.



The aim of our ROCU is primarily to identify and disrupt organised criminals operating across the eastern region.

They are one of 10 ROCUs operating across England and Wales providing specialist capability to tackle the increasingly complex threat posed by organised crime.



Regional Organised Crime Unit

Officers and staff in the unit tackle a range of crime – from child sexual exploitation and modern slavery to county drugs lines and cybercrime.

The unit also has an economic crime team which tackles offences such as fraud and money laundering, as well as using the latest Proceeds of Crime Act legislation to ensure crime never pays.



ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks. You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.
