1st Sunday of Advent 28th November 2021 (Year C) Psalter Week 1

Enemy number one – time. Strange how, with all our sophisticated time-pieces – there's never enough time! Timetables, diaries, calendars, smartphones - always full. So much worry, always rushing around. We stress, we panic. Do we really need to?

Time. Every second lost is gone, and gone forever. We can never make it up. Other things — we can. Hence *time* is the most precious gift we can give. Jesus urges us to *stay awake*. Buddhism means "I am awake". Be alive, attentive, aware, alert, awake — advent is a call to this full consciousness. Jesus and Buddha both urging us to stay awake, to use our time well. Time only goes forward. Backwards time is the stuff of stories and films. We know time can never be retrieved.

I realise I have offered this reflection before, I offer it again as it may help:

To realise the value of 10 years; ask a newly divorced couple.

To realise the value of 3 years; ask a graduate.

To realise the value of 1 year; ask a student who has failed an exam.

To realise the value of 9 months; ask as mum who's just given birth to a still-born.

... of 1 month; ask a mum who's given birth to a premature baby.

To realise the value of 1 week; ask an editor of a weekly newspaper.

To realise the value of 1 hour; ask lovers who can't wait to meet.

To realise the value of 1 minute; ask someone who's missed a flight, bus or train.

... of 1 second; ask someone who has narrowly survived an accident.

(...and my favourite...)

To realise the value of 1 millisecond; ask the person who has had to settle for second place – the silver medal in the Olympics.

As Jack says to Rose in the film 'Titanic' make it count. People who do, awake/alive people are hardly afraid of death. Their lives are fulfilled. The more afraid we are, so the less is our faith, the more we fear the end, our demise. No. As Jesus says, be confident about life, faith and God. So, stay awake. Don't be asleep to all the beauty, goodness and truth around. Use our time well. We only have one shot at it. Again, Jesus reminds us....you never know....

Sunday Obligation. The Sunday Eucharist is a gift; as God's holy people we are called to praise and thank God in the most sublime way possible. When the Church speaks of the Sunday obligation, it reminds us that attending Mass is a personal response to the selfless offering of Christ's love. At this time, we recognise that for some people there may be certain factors which hinder attendance at Sunday Mass. The pandemic is clearly not over. The risk of infection is still present. For some, there is legitimate fear in gathering together. As your bishops, we recognise that these prevailing circumstances suggest that not everyone is yet in the position to fulfil the absolute duty to attend freely Sunday Mass. Responding to the Gift We now encourage all Catholics to look again at the patterns which they have formed in recent months with regard to going to Mass on Sundays. This would include consideration and reflection about what we might do on Sundays, such as sports or shopping, or other leisure and social activities. This review, and the decisions which arise from it, fall to every Catholic and we trust this will be done with honesty, motivated by a real love for the Lord whom we encounter in the Mass. 
A few printed newsletters will be left on the shelf outside the presbytery after each weekend Mass. These are primarily designated for anyone who has no email access.

Who are the Prevent & Protect (P&P) Team?

The Essex Police Prevent & Protect team work in support of the Serious Organised Crime Strategy. We seek to deliver best practice in building the highest levels of defence and resilience in our community.

Prevent

This is about stopping the problem at source, by identifying and supporting those at risk of engaging in criminality. We will develop and use preventative methods and education to divert more people from a life of serious and organised crime and reduce reoffending.

Protect

This is about building the highest levels of defence and resilience in vulnerable people, communities, businesses, property and systems. By reducing these vulnerabilities, we provide criminals with fewer opportunities to target and exploit. We also aim to ensure our communities better recognise the techniques of criminals and take steps to target harden and protect themselves.



The National Crime Agency leads the UK's fight to cut serious and organised crime, protecting the public by targeting and pursuing those criminals who pose the greatest risk to the UK.

NCA officers work at the forefront of law enforcement, building the best possible intelligence picture of all serious and organised crime threats; relentlessly pursuing the most serious and dangerous offenders; and developing and delivering specialist capabilities on behalf of law enforcement and other partners.

The aim of our ROCU is primarily to identify and disrupt organised criminals operating across the

Eastern Region Special Operations Unit -

The aim of our ROCU is primarily to identify and disrupt organised criminals operating across the eastern region.

They are one of 10 ROCUs operating across England and Wales providing specialist capability to tackle the increasingly complex threat posed by organised crime.



Regional Organised Crime Unit

Officers and staff in the unit tackle a range of crime – from child sexual exploitation and modern slavery to county drugs lines and cybercrime.

The unit also has an economic crime team which tackles offences such as fraud and money laundering, as well as using the latest Proceeds of Crime Act legislation to ensure crime never pays.

Intervention . Support . Education

The Illegal Money Lending Team investigates and prosecutes illegal money lenders while supporting those who have borrowed money from a loan shark.

The Stop Loan Sharks team have developed a range of free education resources, free partner tools, and will also deliver free in-house training for partner agencies and the police.

Unseen is a UK charity with its head office in Bristol. They provide safehouses and support in the community for survivors of trafficking and modern slavery. They also run the UK Modern Slavery & Exploitation Helpline and work with individuals, communities, business, governments, other charities and statutory agencies to stamp out slavery for good.





Gangmasters and Labour Abuse Authority

The GLAAs role is to protect vulnerable and exploited workers. Through the intelligence they receive from our inspections, the public, industry and other government departments, they investigate reports of worker exploitation and illegal activity such as human trafficking, forced labour and illegal labour provision, as well as offences under the National Minimum Wage and Employment Agencies Acts.

They investigate all aspects of labour exploitation in England and Wales but they also work with partner organisations such as the police, the National Crime Agency and other government law enforcement agencies to target, dismantle and disrupt serious and organised crime across the UK.

Action Fraud is the UK's national reporting centre for fraud and cybercrime where you should report fraud if you have been scammed, defrauded or experienced cyber crime in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. They provide a central point of contact for information about fraud and financially motivated internet crime.

The NCSC understands cyber security, and distils this knowledge into practical guidance that they make available to all. They respond to cyber security incidents to reduce the harm they cause to organisations and the wider UK. They use industry and academic expertise to nurture the UK's cyber security capability. The NCSC reduce risks to the UK by securing public and private sector networks

ISOLATED DUE TO CORONAVIRUS - HOW TO OBTAIN HELP

The source of your support depends on which category of 'shielding' you fall into. **Category 1** - you have been contacted by the NHS and told to remain at home for 12 weeks.

You are being supported directly from the government. If you were not contacted by the NHS and told this then you do not fall into this category.

Category 2 - anyone over the age of 70, plus anyone under the age of 70 with certain serious health conditions plus pregnant women - you are being supported by Essex County Council through their Essex Welfare Service. Please contact them on 0300 303 9988.

Category 3 - Everyone else.

You are supported by the **new helpline** set up by Rochford District Council in partnership with local faith groups, churches and voluntary organisations. If you have no friends or family close by and you need support during this crisis, or are feeling isolated, please call **01268 779999**.

First Sunday of Advent

My dear People,

On this, the First Sunday of Advent, we embark on a journey together with the Universal Church. Every diocese throughout the world has been invited by Pope Francis to walk the Synodal Pathway. The journey begins now and will conclude in Rome in 2023.

The Holy Father invites us to enter this Synodal Journey, moving towards greater Communion, Participation and Mission within the Church. These three themes reflect both our calling and ultimately our destination as Catholic Christians.

We begin in Advent, a season of listening, reflected in the most perfect example Our Blessed Mother, Mary. Listening was central to the Annunciation. First, God speaks to Mary; she loves God and she listens to him with an open heart and a willingness to participate in His plan. Later, at the Visitation, Mary cares for and listens to her cousin, Elizabeth. Our Lady shows us what it means to be fully attentive to God and to neighbour.

Now it is our turn. We are being asked to pray together, to talk with, and listen to each other, and to share our dreams for a future Church that is enhanced by communion, participation and mission.

The Holy Father has made it clear that each diocese ought to tailor the pathway to their unique, local situation and with this in mind I would like to encourage you to undertake this task within your Parish Partnerships. These were established as part of our Stewards of the Gospel process, which led, three years ago in the Advent of 2018 to the publication of our Vision Document: Shaping Our Future.

As a diocese, we now have some experience of collective discernment of the will of the Holy Spirit, as the common theme of listening together runs between the Stewards of the Gospel process and the Synodal Pathway. Pope Francis puts it beautifully, saying, "Our journeying together is what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God". My hope is that the Synodal pathway will help us to discern and implement our own vision and manifest our missionary nature.

Now I urge you to come together in your parish partnership; to pray and to dream of the future of our church, to listen with care and respect to one another, allowing the Holy Spirit to guide your conversations.

Everyone should be included in this prayerful listening and discernment and there will be notices in your parish bulletin or on social media with further information.

As we journey together in our pilgrimage to the house of God our Father, I invite you to use the Synod Prayer which will be available in print form and also on diocesan and parish web sites. Attributed to St Isidore of Seville (560-636), it has been traditionally used at Councils and Synods for hundreds of years. This version has been designed specifically for the Church's Synodal

Pathway. Please pray it, inviting the Holy Spirit into your busy lives and homes and know that I will be praying for you also.
