6th Sunday of the Year - Year C Psalter Week 2 – 12th /13th February 2022

Partygate. Do people trust politicians? Do people trust in their moral authority? Why? Why not? Many say moralities are not honoured, too many promises and manifestos are too easily broken. Maybe they are. Others say not so.

Today Jesus produces his manifesto. He has called his disciples, and now summarises what he will preach, setting out his vision. Often called the "Sermon on the Mount", or the "Beatitudes". Jesus is saying that if we have had a glimpse or experience of God, these teachings will make total sense. If not, then we still have a way to go before we can even begin to understand these Beatitudes.

The difference between Jesus and any politician is that Jesus lives out his manifesto, lives out his vision in every sense, in his very body. Ghandi thought that these Beatitudes were Jesus' "piece de resistance". He got it. So many (Christians) do not, they yawn and skip over it. Pious platitudes? No! Be poor now, so you will be happy in the next world? No - absolutely not! Jesus' equivalent to the Ten Commandments - definitely not! Definitely not a list of laws.

Something hugely deeper. Maybe too threatening for many, so they are avoided. In this vision, Jesus is subverting the whole social world order, turning everything as previously understood upside down. Too threatening to anyone who wants to climb the ladder of success, wealth, and power – or if already at the top. Often better to pretend it is just a piece of nice rhetoric, or nice poetry –or that "Jesus never really said that", or "we have misunderstood". I'm afraid he did say it and intended it to be threatening – Jesus always tries to de-stabilise our previous way of thinking and replace it with a totally upside-down new kind of meaning.

In short, Jesus is saying that those who are not unhealthily attached to worldly things, like prestige, power, possessions, money, personal reputation, self-satisfaction – such people are the fortunate ones, for they are free enough to experience God in their lives. These worldly things are not coming between themselves and God, as Jeremiah suggests, so they know true happiness – directly from God. Jesus lives this truth out in his very life, to the very end. No compromise. How much can we live this truth?

How blessed, fortunate, (happy) are you, when you are not addicted to the things of the world, now you are free enough to fully let God into your life and follow his will. You are truly blessed.

You too can be part of this journey. Starting in Samoa, travelling westwards across the Globe, across the Pacific, on through Asia, countries of Africa and the Middle East before reaching the shores of Europe. Then across to the Americas, ending the day as the sun sets over American Samoa. Thousands of people will be taking part in World Day of Prayer.

It all began in the 19th Century, in North America, when Christian women started praying with one another, making a difference to their lives, and the support and help they could give each other. So, we share hopes, fears, joys, sorrows, needs and opportunities of women around the world, praying with them and for them, to turn prayers into positive action. Gradually, over the years this spread over the World, and the decision to use ONE specific day a year was begun. There are now around 120 countries taking part. For several years it was known as Women's World Day of Prayer. But this interdenominational, ecumenical event is for EVERYONE, Men and Women, Youth and school children. So now it is known as WORLD DAY OF PRAYER.

It takes place on the first Friday in March each year. Each country uses the same Order of Service, but in their own language. Every Year the service is written by women of a different country, focusing on their country's social problems, as well as the joy from worshiping together.

It takes time to organise these services, and many years of hard work are involved in putting it together.
