OUR LADY OF RANSOM





You must be joking! No way! Jesus - are you serious? Are you crazy?! Love your enemy! Your enemy! Do good to those who hate you. What! Bless those who curse you. This sounds pretty unreal. Pray for those who treat you badly. Come on! If you only knew how much that person has hurt me...

Again, like last week, unless we have had some glimpse or experience of the divine, our reaction will something like the above. Jesus' wisdom only begins to make sense once we have responded to the divine.

What does this forgiveness stuff really mean? Certainly not the superficial *I'll forgive but not forget* piece of nonsense we often hear about. To forgive is to forget, to let go of the emotional hurt. That's the forgetting. We remember in our minds, but the emotional pain has been let go of, forgotten.

Again, we think maybe of someone being big-hearted saying it's all forgiven. That can be an act of condescension. Big-hearted me! In forgiving, we are not called to look big-hearted, magnanimous or just a nice person. This can demean the other person, and often doesn't make them feel better about themselves. They just see you as being big-hearted in forgiving. Jesus calls us to go a little deeper.

Forgiveness is about affirming the person, believing in them once again so you help them bring out their best selves. Truly believing in another person through forgiveness can prevent that person being destroyed by self-hatred. It helps them recover their self-worth. See how forgiveness takes a great act of love, not duty.

This kind of forgiving, the real way, often does not make us look good, but makes the other person look good. It's Jesus' forgiveness from the cross. Not looking very good, in his broken, bleeding dying body, yet redeeming us all, ensuring us our dignity and self-worth as children of God.

So forgiveness is much more than just being big-hearted. And of course so difficult, seemingly impossible. We see why we need to have had that glimpse or experience of the divine – to really forgive... it really is loving the enemy. And we see how true forgiveness can bring about real transformation and healing in the other person, the enemy, the hated one. That's the nature of God's forgiveness. Can we work at that so it can be ours?



AROUND THE WORLD IN 36 HOURS

You too can be part of this journey. Starting in Samoa, travelling westwards across the Globe, across the Pacific, on through Asia, countries of Africa and the Middle East before reaching the shores of Europe. Then across to the Americas, ending the day as the sun sets over American Samoa. Thousands of people will be taking part in World Day of Prayer.

It all began in the 19th Century, in North America, when Christian women started praying with one another, making a difference to their lives, and the support and help they could give each other. So, we share hopes, fears, joys, sorrows, needs and opportunities of women around the world, praying with them and for them, to turn prayers into positive action. Gradually, over the years this spread over the World, and the decision to use ONE specific day a year was begun. There are now around 120 countries taking part. For several years it was known as Women's World Day of Prayer. But this interdenominational, ecumenical event is for EVERYONE, Men and Women, Youth and school children. So now it is known as WORLD DAY OF PRAYER.

It takes place on the first Friday in March each year. Each country uses the same Order of Service, but in their own language. Every Year the service is written by women of a different country, focusing on their country's social problems, as well as the joy from worshiping together.

It takes time to organise these services, and many years of hard work are involved in putting it together.
