OUR LADY OF RANSOM



8th Sunday of the Year - Year C Psalter Week 4 – 26th /27th February 2022

Tim was a bitter, angry, self-righteous young lad. He came from a difficult family set-up. So maybe no surprise. In Tim's eyes, he was always correct, never admitted his mistakes, (although you felt sure he secretly did know), he wanted to make others look silly, basically everyone else was a fool. He knew it all, always had an answer. Does that maybe sound familiar in someone else we know? Please read on, slowly, carefully and thoughtfully.

Today psychologists and psychiatrists are recovering much of Jesus' teaching with more scientific understandings using words like 'projection', 'scapegoating', 'denial of the shadow'. Tim was clearly all these. Jesus' language talks of splinters and planks in the eye.

'Denial of the shadow' is the dishonesty about our own weaknesses and faults. We're only prepared to show our 'good' side, even if it means lying and deceiving, just like Tim. 'Projection' – having denied my own faults, I project them on to others, then I accuse them, make them suffer, make them pay a price. All because I just cannot admit that these are already my own issues. We see why Jesus says do not judge. The reality is that the problem is already living in me, not so much the other person. Now I have 'scapegoated' them. Unconsciously putting my faults on to them so I can ridicule them. All because of the bitterness, anger, self-righteousness that is already malignant in me. Stuff I refuse to deal with. Jesus' splinter and plank brilliantly says it all.

What if Tim were adopted by a lovely family, who really came to healthily love him, and were committed to him? Might he change for the better? Wouldn't such love allow for a greater sense of trust, faith, self-worth and dignity? Now, any self-righteousness, bitterness, and anger would make no more sense? Such ghastly emotions probably disappear before too long.

And so God's love for us allows us to change. With God's love. any criticising of others, and gossip make no sense, as we don't feel so horribly unworthy ourselves; judging others makes no sense as judgement is already a bad judgement on ourselves; negative anger makes no sense as we see it is already an unhealthy self-anger. Denial of the shadow, projection, scapegoating – in other words, planks and splinters, all blocking out the extraordinary love God is pouring in to us.

All this prevents God's love from getting through. So which is it to be? Tim's issues in our lives, (however similar)... or God's love?

You too can be part of this journey. Starting in Samoa, travelling westwards across the Globe, across the Pacific, on through Asia, countries of Africa and the Middle East before reaching the shores of Europe. Then across to the Americas, ending the day as the sun sets over American Samoa. Thousands of people will be taking part in World Day of Prayer.

It all began in the 19th Century, in North America, when Christian women started praying with one another, making a difference to their lives, and the support and help they could give each other. So, we share hopes, fears, joys, sorrows, needs and opportunities of women around the world, praying with them and for them, to turn prayers into positive action. Gradually, over the years this spread over the World, and the decision to use ONE specific day a year was begun. There are now around 120 countries taking part. For several years it was known as Women's World Day of Prayer. But this interdenominational, ecumenical event is for EVERYONE, Men and Women, Youth and school children. So now it is known as WORLD DAY OF PRAYER.

It takes place on the first Friday in March each year. Each country uses the same Order of Service, but in their own language. Every Year the service is written by women of a different country, focusing on their country's social problems, as well as the joy from worshiping together.

It takes time to organise these services, and many years of hard work are involved in putting it together.
