Psalter Week 2

Pregnant. The mother's womb. In her tiny world, the baby girl is content. The baby cannot see her mother, neither can she imagine her mother's existence. But she is content. Content with the tininess of her little life. But...What if this baby could speak? And had some self-awareness? Might she be sceptical of life beyond the womb? Might it be difficult to convince her she will be born in to an immense and very different world and existence? Would she lack the tools to imagine a world beyond the womb? Would the baby struggle with all this? Would the baby have doubts?

Might this be part of our own struggles to let go of the umbilical cords of security, routine, and the familiar? Our own tiny contentedness. Faith here comes into its own. The baby would need faith to believe in life after birth, we also need faith to believe in the immense and different world of a life beyond final death.

Maybe our world is a womb, small and constricting in terms of potential, yet pushing us to eternal life. There is something bigger than our tiny selves. Like the baby, we find it difficult to imagine life beyond our own experiences. Similar to St. Thomas, we doubt. Doubts that can drive us crazy. Poor 'doubting' Thomas, gets saddled with doubts we all struggle with. Again, like Thomas, we clutch to what we know, to our umbilical cords of predictability and security. We doubt anything that urges us to lose grip, to let go.

We gestate in this great womb until we are elderly, or sadly for some, not so elderly. However long we gestate, one day, a 'new thrust' occurs, a second birth, we are pushed into a beauty, a magnitude, a love beyond all imaginings. It leaves us awestruck and open-mouthed. The agonies a mother can go through when giving birth may parallel any agonies gone through as we are re-born into this new existence. Birth and death both need acts of faith, a letting-go. Faith.

Resurrection is telling us there is a fuller life for us beyond this womb. Jesus goes there, yet returns to this womb (this existence) to tell us it's OK, it's real, He gives us the tools, ie. faith, life, love, forgiveness and compassion, and so urges us not to be afraid. But are we afraid?

We all identify with Thomas and his doubts. His doubts, like our own, can paralyse us. Faith and love drive doubts out. So we must hold on. Through eventual faith, Thomas lets go, but 2000 years on, can we?
