OUR LADY OF RANSOM

Easter 6C 22nd May 2022 Psalter Week 1



Little 16 year-old Andrew had had a serious back operation. He was off school for several months. His friends wrote letters and cards, supporting him in every way they could. His first day back he made a grand entrance into class, the applause, the hugs and delight of his friends was electric. Tears of sheer joy. Especially from his mum. But Andrew was now confined to a wheelchair. And yet, like so many of the youngsters with special needs that I worked with – no way did it get him down.

Always happy despite setbacks. Like so many of my students, I firmly believe they were in touch with the Holy Spirit. Many of us others can be far more distracted – finances, exams, schools, making a living – we lose focus. Understandably so. But Jesus reminds us that God has planted a bit of himself in all of us that yearns for its source - we call it the 'Holy Spirit'. Like a homing device living within, the spirit agonisingly longs to 'home-in' or return to himself - God. Giving in to worldly distractions, the focus is lost, so the more unfulfilled we stay. Painful. No focus. Confusion. The homing-device is not homing-in! I sense my youngsters, without many of our 'customary' distractions, were far more in touch with this 'homing-device', the Spirit, allowing them to 'home-in' to God, hence their constant joy. It can be ours too. We need to make contact within. Challenging, it's the stuff of real prayer.

Jesus wants us to be in touch. <u>Without being in touch</u>, prayer becomes a functional, selfish agenda. Church becomes a problem-solving, practical, brownie point system. The Sacraments become strategies for school entrances, ticking 'catholic' boxes etc. The Bible and church teaching become ammunition for an 'I am right' and exclusive scenario. Authority becomes domination. Politics becomes control, and religion becomes a membership system defining who's in or out. How ghastly can you get!

However <u>being in touch</u>, or <u>inside the Holy Spirit</u>, prayer becomes intimate union with God to be relished. Church becomes a place that shows itself as a real life-giving vibrant community. The Sacraments become authentic manifestations of what is going on within and so make complete sense. The Bible and church teaching become totally inclusive and uplifting. Authority becomes servant-hood. Politics becomes leadership through example, and religion becomes 're-ligios' — re-binding or reconciling us back to God — immense joy. We see why the Holy Spirit makes all the difference, and why Jesus wants us to be in touch. He doesn't send his Holy Spirit for nothing. How is our homing device?

Returning to Mass at Pentecost. An invitation from the Bishops of England and Wales.

This is the bread come down from Heaven (John 6:58) A beautiful hallmark of the Catholic faith is the profound desire to participate in the Holy Mass and share in the Eucharist. We do so with deep gratitude and joy. The Eucharist gives the Church her identity - "The Eucharist makes the Church, and the Church makes the Eucharist." It enables us to worship Almighty God, to support each other on our journey of faith, and to be a visible sign of faith in the world. This hallmark is supported and strengthened by the precept that our fundamental Christian duty is to worship God by participating in the celebration of Mass. Attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days is the greatest of all privileges, sometimes referred to as "the Sunday Obligation."

Since the beginning of the Covid pandemic, until the present time, we have shared with you our judgment that the situation of the last two years has meant that the Sunday Obligation has been impeded and has needed to be fulfilled in other ways. We thank God that this situation has now changed. The pressing challenges of the pandemic have lessened significantly. Most people have resumed the wide range of normal activities, no longer restricted by the previous Covid measures. We therefore believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply.

We understand there will still be some members of our congregations who, for reasons of health, do not feel safe enough to return to Mass. It has always been the understanding of the Church that when the freedom of any Catholic to attend Mass in person is impeded for a serious reason, because of situations such as ill health, care for the sick or legitimate fear, this is not a breach of the Sunday Obligation. Our Catholic people and parishes have benefitted during these difficult times from the online streaming of Mass and other services. "Virtual viewing" of Mass online does not fulfil the Sunday Obligation. It may, however, be a source of continual spiritual comfort to those who cannot attend Mass in person, for example those who are elderly and sick, for whom the obligation does not apply. In this context, we recognise gratefully the ministry of those who administer Holy Communion to the elderly, sick and housebound. We are grateful to our clergy, religious and lay faithful who have served our parishes, schools and communities with dedication and distinction throughout this pandemic.

Now we look forward with renewed faith and confidence. In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the Lord's Supper, the Lord Jesus entrusted to us the precious gift of Himself. With humility, we glory in being a Eucharistic people for whom attendance at Mass is essential. Looking forward to the forthcoming feast of Pentecost, we now invite all Catholics who have not yet done so to return to

attending Mass in person. As the Church needs the witness of the presence of each person, so too each believer needs to journey in faith and worship with their fellow disciples. Nourished by our encounter with the Risen Lord Jesus, fed with His Word and His Body and Blood in Holy Communion, and supported by the presence of each other, we receive strength week by week, to serve the Lord and glorify Him with our lives.
