Bang! The starting pistol fired. It was Sports Day and the able-bodied children started running their race. Several races were run and the winners were awarded their trophies. Parents duly applauded. Then came the race for children with special needs. Bang! The children started running, all went well, until one child fell. All the other children, in total unity, turned back to help their fallen friend. He was helped up, the children all linked hands, and ran the rest of the race together, crossing the finishing line hand in hand. Tears and a standing ovation followed.

Yes, we award winners in life, we encourage competition, but when true unity and compassion are being lived out, we realize we admire this much more. Losers become winners, winning over our hearts and minds. Why does it take children with special needs to so powerfully make the point? The above story is true.

George Bernard Shaw once said "There is only one religion, and thousands of forms of it". Anyone with any depth will know, that once we go beyond or underneath all the superficial stuff, the trappings, all healthy life-giving religions are striving for the same thing. Get that, and we can work together. Unity happens. A unity Jesus is asking for, as we see today. (Remember Jesus always uses images and metaphors eg. calling people 'sheep'). All the underlying messages that different religions and denominations use are so often in strong agreement. But the images and metaphors we use may be different – just like Jesus himself does, but all are being used to communicate experience of union with God and each other-unity.

We become so brainwashed that our own religious images, trappings and metaphors become the only true ones, the only correct ones – disunity follows. It must do! Yes, we need images and metaphors to be able to go deep, but they are plenty, different and varied. Understand that and unity can happen. Compassion happens. Cooperation happens. Forgiveness happens.

I suspect that many children haven't yet intellectually arrived at the maturity of metaphor and image – which can divide us when we are so brainwashed. Such children just see things as they are, humanly, compassionately, and so unity happens, it happens so freely, so easily. Maybe we adults still have some spiritual homework to do to achieve such unity.

Jesus calls us to be 'one'. Unity. The children above were 'one'. How can we best be 'one' with God, 'one' with each other, as well as 'one' with so many who are different to us?

Children's Liturgy


