The Most Holy Trinity 12th June 2022 Psalter Week 3



“Strictly Come Dancing” has drawn big audiences. I guess there is something compelling in watching dancing that is beautifully rhythmical, complementary, and graceful. Where movements are wonderfully reciprocal, exactly to time, it is inherently and aesthetically pleasing. In the very old days, this is how the church Fathers described God. God is the dance. Not a dancer, but the dance itself. In God, there is perfect reciprocal movement, towards and away, giving and receiving. This is about as best as we can do to try and grasp the ungraspable concept of the Trinity – as a perfect, graceful, exact complementary movement - or dance - between three persons. A perfect relationship between three.

It’s all about relationship. Scientists today, looking through telescopes and microscopes, at atoms and planets, are finding that the power and energy of things is not in the atoms or particles themselves, not in the planets or stars themselves – but in the very orbits they make with each other. The power and energy comes from the relationship ‘*between*’. So we have an entirely relational universe. And our Holy Trinity was saying that all along! All reality is based on relationship. How we intuit so well, but explain so poorly. This is old Trinitarian language, maybe with a new, fresh and vital re-appreciation. God is relationship so God must be love, since love is the basis of all healthy and right relationship.

So if God is love and where all healthy and right relationship is, surely God is two (if you love, there must be another to love)? Yet we say **God is three**. Why?

When two people really love each other so much, they know their relationship is, and has something bigger than the two of them put together. And it holds them together. That something bigger is the Holy Spirit, the 3rd person, a 3rd entity in that relationship. In Christian language, that 3rd something is the Holy Spirit; the shared, mutual, explosive, overflowing love between Father and Son. The 3rd entity, the 3rd person. Overflowing love bringing supreme joy inviting and alluring us in. So God must be three. A perfect relationship of three. And Jesus’ mission as the 2nd person of the Trinity is to bring us into this supreme overflowing joy of the Trinity, into the ecstatic dance. So Jesus commands us ‘strictly, come dancing’. So let’s be sure to join the dance, and let the dance go on...

Rotas for Readers, Eucharistic Ministers, Coffee Morning etc.

Please note. It is so wonderful to have volunteers to be part of a rota in the volunteering for the various projects of our church community such as the ones mentioned above and others of course.

We must make it **abundantly clear** that personal details such as email addresses and phone numbers **MUST NEVER** be given out indiscriminately as part of a rota. It is a breach of confidentiality, data protection and in some cases possibly a breach in the protection of our children. Is that right?

The convenience of having a list of people that can swap on a rota on our email data is evident, but it is the responsibility of the person themselves to obtain email or contact addresses of others so they can swap, not to have them indiscriminately given out as part of a list. Whilst this may be inconvenient, this is in order to protect our children, and protect one another's personal details – data protection. It is the law.

When organising a rota or a list, **ALWAYS, ALWAYS, ALWAYS,** blind-copy the list where it says Bcc, and send it to yourself, that way individuals only see what pertains to themselves alone.

This is not being fussy or picky, over-dramatic nor a laughing, jokey matter. This is deadly serious, who knows who could pick up a child's email...and

then... Do you want to be responsible for that? Or anyone else's email...you've heard of cyber-bullying....

If you are responsible for rotas, adult individuals will have given you their contact details, that is fine. But these details **MUST** be blind-copied to anyone else. They must be treated as completely confidential. Of course, most especially if adults have given you their children's email addresses as a rota organiser.

This may be fairly new to some, opinions are irrelevant, it is the law and we need to protect our children and one-another. Ignorance is no protection.

Please adhere to this important request. Thank you.
