

OUR LADY OF RANSOM

Fifteenth Sunday 10th July 2022 Psalter Week 3



Leicester Square was busy. Some years ago, I was walking along and came across a little stall by the Odeon. Flyers read: “repent, the end is nigh, “Jesus is Lord”... I glanced briefly. The elderly lady there scolded me “that’s right sonny, you’ll burn in hell like the rest of them - you youth have no idea”. I don’t think I’ve ever been condemned to hell! What had I done?! I replied that I practise my faith as a Catholic. To which the elderly man (her husband?) replied, “that’s even worse”! How quick some people like to judge, condemn, separate, divide.

Our Catholic Church has never condemned anyone to hell, only “canonised” them for heaven. The ability to condemn through hatred, exclusion and separation is part of the sad history of many religions. Many love to see themselves as the only ones “saved”. Only ‘they’ are pure and have all the ‘correct’ answers. All other people are excluded. Condemned. A people divided. All so very childish!

In this wonderful story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus is clearly moving us beyond any kind of narrow-minded worldview of who’s in or out. So often it is the outsider (Samaritan) who understands Jesus far more than the insider (priest and levite).

Holiness is never found through separation or exclusion of others, only through radical inclusion. To include those we think are dirty, smelly, those who are ‘different’, not like me. Any exclusionary system lays the very foundation for violence, either in what we think, speak, or do. Just look at the world around today. The ‘hated’ Samaritan, (the Jews and Samaritans mutually hated each other), the very one we expect to run away or finish him off, helps out, and, pays for the man’s help. Radical inclusion.

Jesus removes any ability to separate according to peripheral issues such as race, politics or religion. He leaves us no basis for ethnic hatred or creating victims whatsoever. In fact, this anticlerical story heavily criticises any dominant and dominating group in society. Ever true. Compassion, forgiveness and inclusiveness are part of the answer. Just nice sentiments? No. Jesus is clearly commanding us to live them out, ‘go do the same’. Radical stuff. But do we?

If you are interested in hosting a Coffee Morning after 10am Sunday Masses to raise money for a charity of your choice, please contact the parish office by midday on Thursdays.




Coffee Morning – 10th July
