Seventeenth Sunday 24th July 2022 Psalter Week 1



As God calls to us, how might He be re-assuring us:

My Child who art on earth, worried, lonely, tempted; I know your name perfectly, and I pronounce it to make it holy, because I love you. No, you are not alone, but lived in by me, and together we are building the kingdom which you are going to inherit. I like you to do my will, because my will is that you should be happy, for my glory is you fully alive. Always count on me and you will have bread for today; do not worry, I only ask that you should get used to sharing it with your sisters and brothers. You know that I forgive your trespasses even before you commit them; that is why I ask that you should do the same to those who trespass against you. So that you should never fall into temptation, take my hand tightly and I will deliver you from evil, for you are my child and I love you more than you can ever imagine. Amen. (Source unknown).

Some call this the 'Lord's Prayer in Reverse'. For authentic prayer is allowing God's spirit to pray through us (as St. Paul says). It's what God wants. This needs a calming of the mind and heart as I mentioned last week. Many techniques exist for calming ourselves. When this happens, we begin to develop some form of union with God and His will, now we realise we are already receiving what we are asking for and doors are already opening where we have been knocking. If on the other hand, our prayer is only about telling God what I think I need, this becomes the stuff of judgements, resistance, criticisms and control, now prayer is not real - but says more about a person's self-centredness and greed. No-one can manipulate God, he knows what is best, He sees the bigger picture.

Allow God's spirit to flow through. After all, he already lives in us. He created us. Let our prayer be much more of a dialogue instead of us only "reading" prayers or making announcements. Rather, just calmly sit and spend more time listenening. Far more enjoyable. This is the ancient form of prayer, it is clearly the "Jesus" way of prayer. Try and see. Make it a practice and enjoy the extraordinary benefits – doors open everywhere, and we receive so much.

Children's Liturgy


Children's liturgy will continue on 24th and 31st July at the 10am mass, for age groups 3-8. (Any further adjustments will be included in the newsletter).

Tuesday 9 August Hockley Woods: Nature walk and Picnic. Details to follow.




Bob Walker Memorial Mass
