
Psalter Week 1

When the wise person points to the moon, the fool sees only the finger. (An ancient Eastern proverb). We are called to see the moon, the bigger reality. Do we see the moon, or just the finger?

For Jesus, going to heaven is about having a different kind of wisdom than any popular idea of wisdom. He talks of the broad and narrow door, and we should try to enter through the narrow one. This needs clarification.

The broad door (or gate) is NOT just about the way of wickedness, murder, stealing, abuse, corruption etc. Of course, these are despicable and depraved acts, but this is not the broad door. Nor is it just about other sinful stuff, like disobedience, adultery, greed etc.

The broad door is much more about the way most people appear to live their very conventional lives. Business as usual, everything taken for granted. We are so driven by our usual conventions, no questions are asked. No wonder it is called 'conventional wisdom'.



Jesus wants us to be delivered from this common, agreed-upon way of life. St. Paul says similar when he writes about "principalities, the things of the air". All this is just seeing the finger. Rather, we are to stand out against this conventional wisdom, and be part of Jesus' own 'subversive wisdom' that turns conventional wisdom upside down. Not the usual conventions of achieving, attaining, succeeding, but of 'letting go' of these drives. Think of Our Lady "letting

go" of her wedding plans and her own agendas. That is the narrow door, it's the way to truly follow Our Lord. Not conventional ways that society dictates. Society dictates upward mobility, Jesus dictates a downward journey; "follow me", which ultimately becomes the way of the cross. Isn't that far harder and demanding? Who really wants to go there? But it is finally the way of life, love, forgiveness, sacrifice and peace, the stuff of the soul, not the stuff of conventional norms (prestige, power, money and possessions). Are we looking at the finger, or the, bigger reality - the moon?

Jesus points to, and leads us to His bigger reality. His Kingdom. "Follow me". So it's not about how often I have been to Mass, how many prayers I've prayed, or even just doing nice things, often such people do not know Our Lord, "I do not know where you come from", but being prepared to enter through this narrow door. Letting go of at least some social norms to follow this downward journey, thus making space for Our Lord. Authentic Christianity is never easy. Can we enter this way?



Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is an internationally recognised training course which teaches people how to spot the signs and symptoms of mental ill health and provide help on a first aid basis.

MHFA England training won't teach you to be a therapist, but just like physical first aid, it will teach you to listen, reassure and respond, even in a crisis.

Adult MHFA England courses are for everyone aged 16 upwards. Every MHFA England course is delivered by a quality assured Instructor Member who has attended our Instructor Training programme accredited by the Royal Society for Public Health, and is trained to keep people safe and supported while they learn.

What will I learn?

Learning takes place through a mix of group activities, presentations and discussions. What you learn will depend on the length of course you attend:

Two Day - Mental Health First Aiders

A practical skills and awareness course designed to give you:

- A deeper understanding of mental health and the factors that can affect people's wellbeing, including your own
- Practical skills to spot the triggers and signs of mental health issues
- Confidence to step in, reassure and support a person in distress
- Enhanced interpersonal skills such as non-judgemental listening
- Knowledge to help someone recover their health by guiding them to appropriate support

How will attending an MHFA England course help?

Research and evaluation shows that taking part in an MHFA England course:

- Raises awareness and mental health literacy
- Reduces stigma around mental ill health
- Boosts knowledge and confidence in dealing with mental health issues
- Promotes early intervention which enables recovery



BIKE FOR LEPROSY IN SUPPORT OF THE PEOPLE LIVING AT MUTEMWA LEPROSY CARE CENTRE IN ZIMBABWE

A charity bicycle ride will take place this August in support of the people living with leprosy at Mutemwa Leprosy Care Centre where John Bradburne (the next potential English Saint) cared for them.

Alex Macpherson and John Paynter, teachers based in Surrey and Bristol who are supporters of the John Bradburne Memorial Society, are embarking on a sponsored 600 mile bike ride from Bristol to Liverpool along the Welsh Coast in August. They will be raising awareness about leprosy and support of the people living at Mutemwa.

The John Bradburne Memorial Society was founded as a charity in 1995 in honour of it's late warden, John Bradburne who spent the last 10 years of his life caring for those living with leprosy in Zimbabwe.

The society continues to support the Mutemwa Care Centre, whilst also spreading information about Bradburne's Saintly life and prolific poetry writing. The donations JBMS receives goes towards the centre's running expenses, salaries of workers, food, water and medicine.

John Bradburne was born at Skirwith in Cumbria on June 14, 1921 and was the son of an Anglican vicar. He served with the Gurkhas and Chindits in the Second World War and after a conversion experience in Malaya, he became a Catholic in 1947.

After many years wandering England, Italy and the Middle East, he finally found his calling as a lay Franciscan missionary in Zimbabwe and he devoted the latter part of his life to helping forgotten leprosy patients at the Mutemwa Leprosy Care Centre.

He refused to leave the settlement during the Zimbabwean civil war and was abducted and shot dead on September 5, 1979.

Since Bradburne's death, the settlement has become a major pilgrimage centre, with thousands gathering for Mass each year on the anniversary of his death.

In 2019, the Congregation for the Causes of Saints in Rome formally began the cause of John Bradburne's beatification.

Bradburne is also in *the Guinness Book of Records* as the most prolific poet ever, having written in verse throughout his life.

"John has been nominated for sainthood because of his amazing selfless work

at Mutemwa with leprosy patients" Kate Macpherson, secretary of the John Bradburne Memorial Society. "John was the pilgrim who eventually found the meaning of his life not in the solitude he had long searched for, but in living alongside, and trying his best to achieve justice so that people living with leprosy – amongst the world's most marginalised people of his day, like the migrants and asylum seekers of our world today – could, like us, live enriching and meaningful lives. And praising God as he did."

The Ride for Leprosy will start in Bristol on the 12th August, cycling along the Welsh Coast and finally finishing in Liverpool on the 19th August.
