25th September 2022 26th Sunday Year C Psalter Week 2



Jane was busy and successful; flying all over the world, now tired, she wanted a little peace and quiet. Waiting for her next flight, she decided to find a secluded spot to read her book. Moments later, an elderly lady shuffled over, sat next to her and said “I bet it’s cold in Oslo”. Uninterested in her chat, Jane relied bluntly “I suppose so”. But all the while the lady kept chatting and asking questions. Jane’s answers would be curt and cold. The lady had said that she was going to Oslo to bring back her husband of 53 years who had just died there. Bringing his body home. Jane was still curt and short. Relief came when they were called to board the plane. While boarding, she saw a young man sit down next to the elderly lady a few rows in front. The lady said “I bet it’s cold in Oslo”, and the two of them chatted. His compassion for her was strong and evident, obviously strengthening her for her impending ordeal.

Jane suddenly realised that she hadn’t really noticed the woman’s loneliness and sadness, her simple need to chat. She was just not aware. Could Jane have engaged and given a lonely, sad, new widow some dignity and company, so much needed, even just a little?

Today we hear about a wealthy man who doesn’t notice the poor man’s (Lazarus) desperation. We don’t know if the wealthy man actually “did” anything wrong, just that he didn’t care to notice. He appeared indifferent. His desire to not notice is what condemns him. Maybe if he had noticed, he might have cared, and acted differently—who knows?

Where are the ‘Lazaruses’ in our lives? Our Lord calls us to see them in the contexts of our daily lives. Maybe someone is desperate and asking for help, the clue may be them saying something like “I bet it’s cold in Oslo”. Do we engage, or are we curt and cold for fear of getting involved – even if just a little? Maybe just a chat.

As hinted at last week, maybe in a different way, God’s kingdom is in the everyday affairs of our lives, often disguised as Lazaruses. Again, Jesus gives us something to seriously ponder. Do we truly sense what is going on around us, and engage? Is someone saying to me.... ‘I bet it’s cold in Oslo...?’

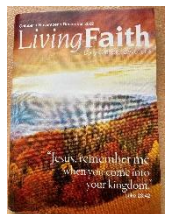

Upcoming Local Baby Loss Support Service

Saying Goodbye, (part of the Mariposa Trust) are returning to Chelmsford in October with a Baby loss remembrance and support service (part of a Nationwide chain of events). We are delighted to be able to return to a full program of events following the effects of Covid-19. The Mariposa Trust's core objective is to support people who have lost babies at any stage of pregnancy, at birth, or in infancy. It was founded in 2012, by Zoe and Andy Clark-Coates, who saw a critical lack of support for people like them, who had gone through baby loss. With over 258,000 babies being lost yearly in the UK alone, the charity needed to be able to offer not only a comprehensive package of befriending and support but also national baby loss remembrance services (called Saying Goodbye Services), for people to join together and remember the children they had lost. 6 years on, over 130 services have taken place at Cathedrals and Minsters across the UK, US, and France, and 2022 will see 20 services across England, Wales, Scotland and Ireland. On the 16th October at 6.30 pm, in Chelmsford Cathedral we will be hosting one of our Saying Goodbye Services.

So who is the service for?

Anyone who has either personally lost a baby at any stage of pregnancy, at birth, or in early years, or who has been affected by family members or friends' loss. Whether the loss was recent or 80 years ago, everyone is welcome to attend. We have also extended the services, and gladly welcome anyone who is grieving the fact that they haven't had children. This may be due to circumstance, infertility, or for other reasons - but all are welcome. Babies and children are also invited to come with their families, as the Saying Goodbye service is truly a family event for all.

We know that as 1 in 4 women suffer miscarriage and baby loss, you will have contact with a significant number of people who have either personally suffered baby loss, or who have a partner or family member that has, so we wanted to ask if you would help us in promoting the service.

Our Lady of Ransom Rayleigh Conference was started in 1932 and has been active ever since, undertaking a range of work in the Parish, Hockley and Rochford. We undertake this work within and outside the Catholic community.

We currently have 8 active members, 5 men and 3 women, plus 3 auxiliary (non-visiting) members. Members attend the fortnightly meetings and undertake to visit those in need and to offer help and friendship without discrimination. New members are always welcome.

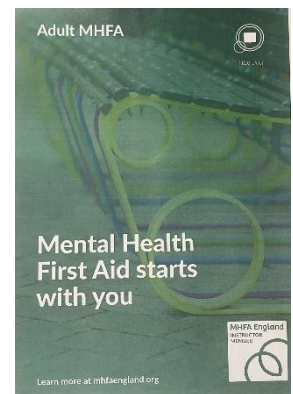

What is Mental Health First Aid?

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is an internationally recognised training course which teaches people how to spot the signs and symptoms of mental ill health and provide help on a first aid basis.

MHFA England training won't teach you to be a therapist, but just like physical first aid, it will teach you to listen, reassure and respond, even in a crisis.

Adult MHFA England courses are for everyone aged 16 upwards. Every MHFA England course is delivered by a quality assured Instructor Member who has attended our Instructor Training programme accredited by the Royal Society for Public Health, and is trained to keep people safe and supported while they learn.

What will I learn?

Learning takes place through a mix of group activities, presentations and discussions. What you learn will depend on the length of course you attend:

Two Day - Mental Health First Aiders

A practical skills and awareness course designed to give you:

- A deeper understanding of mental health and the factors that can affect people's wellbeing, including your own
- Practical skills to spot the triggers and signs of mental health issues
- Confidence to step in, reassure and support a person in distress
- Enhanced interpersonal skills such as non-judgemental listening
- Knowledge to help someone recover their health by guiding them to appropriate support

How will attending an MHFA England course help?

Research and evaluation shows that taking part in an MHFA England course:

- Raises awareness and mental health literacy
- Reduces stigma around mental ill health
- Boosts knowledge and confidence in dealing with mental health issues
- Promotes early intervention which enables recovery
