Remembrance Sunday

The vicar stood in front of his congregation and said that next week's sermon would be on the sin of "lying". He encouraged the people to read Mark chapter 17. The following week, he asked for a show of hands as to who had read Mark 17. Most hands were raised. He then said "Mark's Gospel has only 16 chapters...now for the sermon..."

All lies need exposing. It can hurt, but then truth hurts. Jesus' truth got him crucified. But we know that truth frees us. We are called to think how we live truthfully, a call to think about how we are living – right here, right now. Jesus always calls us to live in the now. When we can live in the present, rather than worry about the future, or keep replaying the past, 'if only...', then our lives are far more peaceful and calm, and all around us reap the benefits.

So the call is to ask ourselves what we might do differently here and now. How it is now is how it will be. So if we need to make changes, we need to make them now. What might we need to change?

Today's Gospel challenges us to ask as to who is our real master? What or who do we really follow although maybe we hate the thought? The usual suspects – money, status, power? Letting go is painful.

How truthfully are we living? If change is needed, it must be now. How it is now, is how it will be. Do we have the faith and the courage to make changes, that deep in our hearts we know we should? Maybe painful at first, but it does set us free – because truth sets us free - and we'll always be grateful.

Today we rightly salute the outstanding heroisms of those who died in all wars, despite war's inherent lie and depravity. To be inspired by, and learn from their martyrdoms. Do we? Furthermore, we also acknowledge the psychological and emotional battles, the terrors, fears and grief agonised by survivors. Traumas lingering over decades, maybe generations, long into marriages, families, and friendships, all causing utter emotional and spiritual chaos. And it all starts with the inability to expose and counteract the lie - from the personal to the national to the international. Yes, they are with us...

With us, to inspire and give us fresh hope. Urging us, screaming, "stop it, enough is enough". Their deaths remind us of the evils of war, fighting.... Lives heroically sacrificed teaching us a valuable lessons about the evils, angers, and terrors war promotes. Do we learn? Its venom of bitterness biting into our very depths, creating agony and turmoil. All victims of war, shout at us, stop - surely peace is the only way. Again, how can we do things differently as a people who learn and live by faith and truth?

So we must have faith in resurrection, resurrection that is happening NOW. Faith, so we can fight evil and war with peace; fight the urge for revenge with forgiveness; fight the urge for worldly power, status and possessions with true humility; fight lies with truth. Can we? Do we?




