18th December 2022 Advent 4A Psalter Week 4



Six year old Billy was in the restaurant with his parents and asked if he could say grace. Bowing their heads Billy said, God is good. God is great. Thank you God for the food, and I would thank you even more if I could have ice-cream. And peace to the world. Amen. Customers around affectionately laughed. Except one elderly woman who remarked: "what's wrong with this country, children don't even know how to pray. Fancy asking God for ice-cream....really!" Hearing this Billy burst out crying. "Is God angry with me, what did I do wrong"?, he asked. As his mum and dad were consoling and reassuring him, an elderly man approached. Winking at little Billy he said he happened to know that God thought it was a great prayer. "Really?" said Billy. "Cross my heart," said the man. Then gently pointing to the woman he said " it's too bad **she** never asks God for ice-cream. A little ice-cream is good for the soul". Winking again, he walked away. Smiling, his parents bought Billy some ice-cream. Billy stared at the ice-cream, picked up the plate, and without a word, placed it in front of the woman. With a big smile he told her, "this is for you. Ice-cream is good for the soul, and my soul is good already".

I offer this lovely story again, it is worth re-telling as it asks the all-important question — what really is good for our soul? What truly moves our soul? What moves the deeper parts within ourselves? Will this Christmas affect us deeply in a new way? Or will it just be another Christmas — routine, business as usual, leaving us wondering if it was all worth it! Wondering what it all meant! No! Rather, do we listen to the movements in our souls? This is the stuff of prayer. Silent, centering prayer. Joseph and Mary listened to their souls, the deeper resonances going on inside, and they had no-one in authority to talk to, to check the validity of their intuitions. They simply trusted these deeper intuitions. The Angel Gabriel will have spoken to Mary's soul. Today we see Joseph trusting in his dreams, suggesting he was listening to his deeper intuitions. His soul. No rationale, no logic explains all this — only faith. And with this, the honourable, upright and just man, Joseph, goes beyond the law. He doesn't walk away from Mary - he should have according to strict law - but stays with her, sharing her worries and concerns. Compassion. Empathy. All because of faith. Authentic faith allows us to do amazing things, we can even amaze ourselves.

Do we give time to listen to our deeper resonances, our souls, where God may be speaking? Will this Christmas be a little different because we have?

Christmas Eve Family Mass- Come and Join in the Nativity Tableau!


