OUR LADY OF RANSOM

4th December 2022 Advent 2A Psalter Week 2



What an odd dress sense!! And peculiar diet! He calls a spade a spade. He is not a company man. He does not fit in. Probably, no self-respecting Christian denomination today would allow him in. He is not afraid. He doesn't care who he upsets - welcome John the Baptist.

John comes from a wealthy class. So why is he like this? Largely because he has had a genuine experience of the divine. We only need one experience of the absolute, the divine, in our lives and everything becomes relativized around this central experience. We can then find it hard to deal with others whose lives seem centred on a kind of wishy-washy mediocre-ness. These prophets so much want for everyone to have similar divine experience so as people can know for themselves.

Such prophets stand on the edges of the tradition, system, society or religion, inside just enough to say 'I am one of you', but not seduced by its power, status, promotions, pay-offs and rewards at the centre. Both inside and outside at the same time. It's a narrow road, and Jesus later refers to this narrow road saying that few have the spiritual maturity to walk it. To be totally loyal, yet utterly and positively critical at the same time. Real prophecy. We see how John is truly a great prophet.

He lives in the desert presumably so as not to be seduced by the power games of the system at the centre. Maybe he felt if he returned to the centre of town, he might be tempted back to his old wealthy ways. But his message is clear. If you call yourself a Christian and say you know God, then produce the results. Anyone can say 'I'm Catholic or Christian'. John rages against this hypocrisy, people calling themselves Godly, Christian etc, and yet are so seduced by power, status and pay-offs. John urges us rather to show some fruit. Is our life-style different to non-Christians? How? If not, could that be why our Christianity is under threat or decline? (Has this shown itself in the recent news surveys?) People are wise to double-standards. Too much talking and not enough walking (life-style).

Is John right? Are we seduced by power and status at work, or in our groups? Can we be utterly loyal yet critical without either compromised? Today, our Christianity appears to be under threat/decline. The recent news surveys/polls suggest this. What fruits is our Christianity producing as different to those who claim not to be religious? That is surely, in part, the litmus of how genuine our faith is.


