Can we recognise Christ being born, breath by breath, in our own hearts, deep within, so we can play our own part, however big or small, in bringing some integrity, peace and dignity to the chaotic world outside? At least, that should make for a genuinely happy and peaceful Christmas and a peaceful new year. And our future too. On that note -
