

OUR LADY OF RANSOM

29th January 2023 4th Sunday of the Year. Psalter Week 4



Today Jesus produces His manifesto. He has called his disciples, and now summarises what he will preach, setting out his vision. Often called the "Sermon on the Mount" they are the Beatitudes, the 'be-autiful attitudes', that truly followed are the key to authentic happiness. St Luke's more accurate translation is much tougher.

The difference between Jesus and any politician is that Jesus lives out his manifesto, lives out his vision in every sense, in his very body. Ghandi thought that these Beatitudes were Jesus' "pièce de resistance". He got it. Many, including Catholics, do not. They yawn and skip over it. Pious platitudes? No! Be sad now, so you will be happy in the next world? No - absolutely not! Jesus' equivalent to the Ten Commandments - definitely not!

Something infinitely deeper. Maybe too threatening for many, so it is avoided. In this vision, Jesus is subverting the whole social world order, turning everything as previously understood upside down. Too threatening to anyone who wants to climb the ladder of success, wealth, and power – or if already at or near the top. Often better to pretend it is just a piece of nice rhetoric, or nice poetry – or that "Jesus didn't really say that", or "we have misunderstood". I'm afraid he did say it and intended it to be threatening – this is consistent with Jesus' teaching generally.

In short, Jesus is saying that those who are <u>not</u> unhealthily attached to worldly things, prestige, power, possessions, craving attention and approval – they are the fortunate ones, the blessed ones, for they are free enough to experience God in their lives. These worldly things are not coming between themselves and God so true happiness is experienced – directly from God. Jesus lives this truth out in his very life, to the very end. No compromise. How much can we live out this truth?

How blessed, (happy)) are you, when you are not obsessed by the things of the world, and so are free enough to fully let God into your life and follow his will?

Following a number of setbacks they have recently been successful in agreeing terms to rent a flat for themselves. The father has been working since a few days after their arrival in the UK but since they fled Ukraine with only a small backpack each, as you can imagine they do not have basic items to set up home.... so if you have any items which you are about to dispose of/update etc, for example kitchenware such as crockery, cutlery, pans, kettle, toaster, iron, ironing board, clothes airer, etc please would you get in touch. They will have to investigate washing machine and fridge/freezer for themselves. They will also need beds, bedding, table, chairs, sofa, and so on - we shall take them to Hopeworks in Rayleigh to see what they have in store. They would be so grateful for any help people can give.
