A mugger. The supermarket bags were heavy. She had only gone to get a few bits, but like so many of us, she bought more. But then she only lived a hundred yards from the supermarket. As she walked home, carrying the heavy bags, she sensed an unsavoury character following her. She had noticed an unpleasant looking person while she was at the checkout. 'Maybe he saw her credit cards and cash as she was paying' she thought. 'A mugger'? She glimpsed him out of the corner of her eye. Definitely him. Panic. What choice did she have? Outrun him? No chance. Confront him? He would easily overpower her. Then a third choice dawned on her. She suddenly swung round, thrust the bags of shopping into his arms and thanked him for offering to carry the bags, his 'kindness' and that she was only going across the road. The man was so stunned he carried the bags for her back to her house. She gave him £2 for his 'assistance...!'.

She found the third way. Not fight, not flight, (that is, direct confrontation or running away scared), but a third alternative. This is exactly what Jesus is asking in today's Gospel. We should never violently give back like for like, (eye for eye), that just perpetuates violence, nor should we run away (go two miles). It appears that today's Gospel has been for centuries misunderstood as saying good Christians should simply tolerate abuse. <u>No. Never. Never. Never.</u> Never be a passive victim of abuse. Never be a doormat. That is never what Jesus asks or has ever asked. How we have so misunderstood Jesus!

When someone tries to upset or humiliate us, Jesus is inviting us to find a creative, nonviolent way to resist. Even in situations we may not be able to change, we can at least hold on to our power to choose our response. Ghandi called it "non-cooperation with everything humiliating". This way, we maintain our dignity and humanity in having the freedom and power to choose how we act.

The desired outcome may or may not happen - granted - the woman with her shopping could still have been attacked – but she chose her response and held on to her dignity and freedom. Not cooperating with, nor being controlled by evil.

Jesus demonstrates this beautifully from the cross. "Father, forgive them...".The third way. Not fight, not flight – but dignity, humanity and always, our freedom.
