Why did the girl keep a bike by her bed? She was "two tyred" of walking in her sleep! *Groan.....*! 'Get it'? Of course we 'get it'...!

Isn't it a pain if we need to explain a joke? The moment is totally lost. When we 'get' a joke, there is an interpretive key working in us, which happens through intellect, experience or whatever. As we 'get' the joke, there is a spontaneous click, the interpretive key is working, and we laugh. Because our intellect or experience allows the needed connection and understanding.

There seems to be an interpretive key missing at the beginning of today's Gospel. The disciples didn't 'get it'. No connection. Yes, they appreciated all the facts, that Jesus was the prophet, powerful, healer etc, but something was clearly missing. It didn't click. It didn't make sense. Hence their depressed state.

Yes, Jesus was all these, but these are basic facts. Facts can be interesting. But they can also be academic, sterile and clinical. And some might reply, 'so what'?

The interpretive key missing for them was the key of 'relationship', their faith in Him. This relationship was rekindled as they saw him doing his familiar thing that they had experienced so often – breaking bread. Experience allowed them to realise it was Him, the one they loved - now, they 'got it'. The connection happened. Recognition. Now suddenly, everything had meaning, depth and soul.

And for us. Once our faith has meaning, depth and soul, we too are set alight. Our souls burn within. Or our faith is simply not real; just a collection of heady facts about Jesus? Yes, he is love, yes he is forgiveness etc...so what! Just facts. Sterile religion! Until we develop an authentic relationship with Him, a real connection, our supposed faith may be interesting, but it lacks meaning, soul and depth.

Experiencing Our Lord for ourselves. Not just many facts. Whether through silent prayer, great love or even, sometimes, suffering, we need to do this for ourselves. Develop our relationship with Him. Then we will have that interpretative key so needed. Then, we 'get it'. Like the disciples today en route to Emmaus, *our* souls will truly burn within. Do we want faith? Or just a collection of sterile beliefs?

#### Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and not obligatory. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "selfintinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality. I hope this helps.
