OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

trying to listen for the one true voice, the one presence, our regular practice? Wouldn't that make us and the world around us somewhat happier and a better place to live?

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.

OUR LADY OF RANSOM



The dinner party was going well. The famous actor was cajoled by the gathering to give a soliloquy. So, with great eloquence, intonation and diction, he recited *The Lord's My Shepherd....*On finishing, the gathering gave him a great round of applause. Now, an elderly priest also at the party was also cajoled in to reciting the same thing, Psalm 23. Nervous, yet confident, with great reverence and obvious inner conviction, he shakily recited the same thing. On finishing, with a slight pregnant pause, the crowd similarly applauded him. Following the applause, the actor came back and asked the assembled party whether anyone had spotted a fundamental difference between the two of their recitals.

To the confused group he explained with obvious humility, "Yes, I am a professionally trained actor, I know how to deliver recitals and monologues, I know Psalm 23 - *The Lord's My Shepherd...*"Yes", he said, "I know the psalm, but Father here clearly knows the Shepherd".

<u>Major major difference</u>. We can know our prayers, say them by heart, and even say them many times. Very good - but do we know the Shepherd? Jesus is often seen admonishing people who think they know Him because they 'say' lots of prayers. And they do not appear to know Him at all. We are called to know and experience the Shepherd - for ourselves. Like last week - no-one can do this for us.

To listen to his voice alone. So we see the importance of silent prayer. How can we even hope to sense His voice if we are continually babbling, using lots of words or thinking lots of things?

Many voices compete for our attention. But there will be one, deep down in our deepest intuitions that we will simply know is Our Lord. But if our mental energies are taken up with thinking and even more thinking, saying lots of things, reading this and reading that, we can never really sense the voice of the one true Shepherd? The voice is found at our deepest intuitions. So we are called to silent prayer, and make it a regular practice so we get in touch with these deeper intuitions. It is surely the finest way to 'discern our vocation (Our Lord's calling)' in life. This is today's challenge - the 'Good Shepherd'.

Yes, to 'know' our prayers is one thing - to 'know' the Shepherd is quite another. Our deepest intuitions will always bear out the voice — the presence of the Shepherd, where we just know we are being led to truth, forgiveness, building each other up, peace and love. Fulfilment. Any negative energies such as revenge, greed, jealousy - we know them - is simply not the true shepherd, and we remain empty, unfulfilled, angry and frustrated. In fact, all alternative voices leave us feeling similar. Shall we make

Holy Communion from the Chalice

The Bishops of England and Wales have said that Communion from the Chalice—the Precious Blood—may be resumed from Easter. Our Bishop has stated that this is a permission and <u>not obligatory</u>. The Chalice was suspended at the start of the pandemic to prevent the spread of the virus. Many of us are understandably still being vigilant with regard to further contagion, especially if we are vulnerable. The teaching of the Church is that when we receive Holy Communion, Christ is present whole and entire—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity—under either kind. By receiving under one species we do not receive less of Christ or less grace. Receiving from the Chalice obviously emphasises the sacramental sign—of eating and drinking the Body and Blood of The Lord. The counsel we are receiving is that we should reintroduce the Chalice prudently and cautiously once it is clear that the majority of parishioners are content that Covid, Influenza and other diseases are not communicable. It would seem unwise to reintroduce this practice and then have to withdraw it with the approach of winter. I have communicated this with our extra-ordinary ministers of Holy Communion to ensure that they feel satisfied that this is once again safe, since they will need to purify and consume what remains in the Chalice; I am not happy asking others to do something that I, for sure, would not be prepared to do myself, given the potential attendant health risks. I, too, am fairly vulnerable. The Southend Deanery has also discussed this and have jointly made this decision too for their Parishes.

The question of the possibility of Intinction (when the Host is dipped into the Precious Blood so that a communicant receives both together) has been raised. The Bishops' Conference has decided to affirm the practice found in *Celebrating the Mass* which states that this form of the reception of Holy Communion "is not recommended in England and Wales." It restricts the possibility of the communicant to receive the host reverently in their hands. Likewise, communicants are not permitted to receive Holy Communion by "self-intinction" where having received the Sacred Host in the hand, they proceed to the Precious Blood and "dip" the host themselves into the chalice. Sacraments are never taken, but received, and the gesture of "self-intinction" denies this reality.

I hope this helps.
