11th June 2023 The Body and Blood of Christ A

Do you love someone such that you have promised them your body? Maybe at your wedding? It's an intimate, unique and deeply personal promise being made. Of course, it is a mutual promise of your flesh.

Jesus seems to be talking this way in bringing his divinity to a fleshly level. It's an intimacy he wants with us. So much so it shocks many people and they walk away in disgust. It's meant to shock us too. But it doesn't. Mass becomes harmlessly repetitive rather than a life-changing ritual. Does it change us? Does it shock and rattle us? Even a little? If not, maybe we've lost something important.

Eat me, drink me Jesus says. Digestible chewable human flesh. Shocking! Such fundamental bodily actions, eating and drinking - these are so much more primitive than talking or thinking. The soul gets it, not the mind. So, like last week, don't try working it out in our heads. But what have people done? Exactly that! Gone right in to the head. So, they try and fail miserably time after time. So, what happens? We form big fancy words, debate, argue and fall out over it. Such a shame. Yet no surprise!

Ancient religions, including ours, had God wanting human or animal sacrifices to appease Him. We see what Jesus does – turns it all upside down – now God has given himself as food for us. God in Jesus is sacrificed on the cross. He is the one sacrificial victim so as we don't create other victims.

And we worry about how 'worthy' we are because of what's happening in our lives or the state of our lives. Marriages, divorces etc. Yet the prayer we say just before Holy Communion — 'Lord I am not worthy'.... is the very prayer that makes us worthy, irrespective of what's going on in our lives. We are worthy because God has made us so, not by our own merits. Our judgements are classic wrong and wicked statements of who's in and who's out, some of which is sadly enshrined in our traditional teaching. Yet it cannot be what Jesus really intended. Jesus never intended such exclusivity. As our Pope reminds us too, Holy Communion is not just a reward for good, or those who conform, but food for our human journey, medicine for the sick. We don't deprive the sick of medicine. We come forward because life has wounded us in some way — as Jesus said, he came for the sick, not the healthy. Holy Communion is for healing, a hospital for us sinners, not a country club for the 'supposedly good or those who 'supposedly conform'. We all in need of this medicine.




