Psalter Week 1

A bright, sunny, calm day, Jan was walking by the lakeside. She stopped to gaze into the lake. Seeing her reflection she wondered: *Is this who I am?* The next day, she returned. But overnight a strong winds had ruffled the water and her reflection now seemed distracted and disturbed. *Or Is this who I really am?*, she pondered.

Again she returned the next day, but it was raining. Her image was blurred and indistinct. A confused distorted version of herself stared back at her from the water. Yet again, a few days later, a huge storm blew up and she was eager to see her refection now. She saw an image full of anger, raging at the dark skies overhead. *Or could this be the real me? Hmmm...!*

Watching her all the while, the sly fox laughed. You foolish woman, he said. Your reflection changes with every passing mood of the weather. How can you believe this is the real you? Asking the fox where the real her was, he told her to return in the depth of winter, then, Jan may find the 'real her'.

Winter came, the lake froze over, snow fell. Jan returned and gazed at the pristine whiteness of the silent lake. *There is no me, s*he exclaimed to the fox. *Exactly,* said the fox. And the fox taught how she could no longer settle for the passing images or projections of herself. He taught that the lake is an empty canvas inviting us to become the person we truly are. To look deep into our own hearts, beyond our passing moods and words, it is there we discover who we really are. (A traditional fable).

Who am I really? Jesus' tough words of wisdom today are encouraging us to know who we really are. A more modern way of understanding Jesus' message is about not becoming dependent, overly-attached or co-dependent on anyone or anything. Except God himself as he is constant and eternal. Everything and everyone else eventually passes away or changes. Like the continual changes in the reflection because of the passing moods of the weather.

For healthy friendships, relationships and marriages to flourish, we must have a sense of who we really are. Then we have a sense of what we are giving away of ourselves to others. Or we can create

unhealthy attachments. Maybe co-dependencies. Jesus strongly advises against all this by his tough words today. Away from family, people, things – anything or anyone - do I have a sense of who I really am?
