

4th June 2023 Holy Trinity A

Psalter Week 1



This continual flow of emptying and filling, giving and receiving water, without hindrance, is how some experts visualise the Holy Trinity. Total, unhindered self-giving and receiving between the three persons of Father, Son and Spirit. A continual, mutual, perfect flow of love, a receiving of love perfectly, and a giving of love perfectly, a movement that never ends. Unhindered relationship.

The ancient fathers of our church used an interesting word for this. *Perichoresis*, meaning 'a dance', or 'a dance around'. *Choresis* led to our word *choreography*. God himself is the dance, the dance around – this is pure traditional orthodox teaching. (Probably largely untaught). Jesus' mission was to invite us into, and include us in this dance, this flow, this mutual giving and receiving of love, so that any knowledge of God and His love is an experience through taking part in God's love. Only faith and inner experience really get this. No logic or reasoning can. So don't try working it out in your heads! We must experience the flow for ourselves. Either, we allow ourselves to experience taking part, and enjoy; or we don't.

Like the flow of the hypnotic watermill that is suddenly stopped; it upsets, it jars. Or, beautiful rhythmical dancing that is suddenly stopped, equally quite jarring – both for the dancers, and those watching and enjoying. So blocking or interfering with the flow of God's love, the mutually giving and receiving; stopping the emptying of ourselves and so being refilled with God's love, blocking the mutual giving and receiving between each other – all this 'blocking the flow' is what we can call 'sin'. It can lead to stupid and unnecessary things happening. Sins such as greed, self-centredness, being

judgemental and critical, the flow doesn't happen. Barriers between ourselves and others - and God, simply stop the flow - sin.

Is the Blessed Trinity challenging us to loosen barriers between ourselves and God, and between each other, to allow a greater flow of mutual love and care?
