Psalter Week 1

Maybe you remember the story of The Emperor's New Clothes. The emperor was naked. What were the people indoctrinated and conditioned to see? A collective and wrong seeing. Until a child who wasn't yet conditioned....the truth come out. "Out of the mouths of babes...."

We see a lot of good in the world, but we also see 'good' that is motivated by something more concerning. It may look superficially OK, but we may question the real driving force behind it? Basically, evil gets away with being evil because it disguises itself as good. And we fall for it. Satan is not happy with any lesser mask than that of God himself. So evil has to 'look' religious, 'look' good, 'look' holy, 'look' like it is defending some great cause etc. Then evil can be done and all those without the gift of discernment and wisdom cry out "Great, don't the Emperor's New Clothes look wonderful!

So, we see Solomon asking for the gift of wisdom, beyond anything else, and pleases God (even though he messes up later). The gift of wisdom to see real truth and the real lie. That's true prophecy. Prophets are able to let themselves be <u>de-conditioned</u> and <u>de-indoctrinated</u> so they see the real.

What the great prophets also see, is that evil is not just in a person. Evil seems most well disguised in groups, institutions and cultures. Pope John Paul brilliantly called it "collective sin". It is so much harder to unmask collective evil, so we tend to point the finger at individuals. Much easier, maybe satisfying, but very wrong. The problem is that when you live inside that group that may well be disguised evil, call it communism, capitalism — or whatever; and if you are benefiting from it, why would you want to criticise it? You'll want to protect it, and be rewarded for doing so. So evil gets away with it — disguised as moral and good. Even well- intentioned and educated people are fooled. They cannot see beyond their own self-interest. The Emperor's New Clothes look beautiful! But the prophets see the truth, and like Jesus, are punished for doing so. They are so disliked and not tolerated because they see truth that others would rather not see. Too painful to see the truth.

So we need the gift of wisdom. To remove any conditioning, brainwashing and indoctrination. To be like children – it is a child who sees the truth in the story above? We are called to see truth. To see

beyond the lie. To see subtlety, nuances, different shades of meaning – this is the stuff of true wisdom so desperately needed in our world today. The parables we hear from Jesus require this skill of wisdom to really appreciate them. Then we see truth. Dare we desire those gifts?
