Little Betsy was dying of a disease. But her older brother had recovered from the same disease 2 years previously. Only a blood transfusion from him would save the life of his little sister. "Are you prepared to give your blood" asked the doctor gently to the little lad. His eyes widened in fear, a moment's hesitation and the lad replied, "OK doctor, I'll do it". All went well. About 2 hours after the transfusion, the little lad said to the doctor, "excuse me doctor, when do I die?" Suddenly, everyone trying to look at the world through the child's eyes, realised the enormity of what the child was doing — in the eyes of the child. And all eyes welled up......

Is the child simply naive and innocent? Or is there more to this? Jesus calls us to be more like children. Does that mean we should suck our thumbs? Of course not. Values like simplicity, humility, childlike trust, sense of wonder, playfulness and joy come to mind. All these are pretty well knocked out of us by society, culture and its demands to be competitive, to be superior, in control, powerful and having the most. What Jesus is clearly looking for is a people who can be wise to society, culture and its demands on our souls, without losing any of (or not too much) of those values mentioned above, so our souls, our characters remain healthy.

And yet none of those values mentioned above, wonder, awe, humility, simplicity etc, are achieved by will-power or determination. They are achieved by a genuine awareness of our pride and ego, and then and honest desire to let them go. When we live in the shadowlands of unawareness, we will always play those games of superiority and importance that will stifle our souls. The more we feed our egos, the more we lose or stifle our soul. Ego and soul are largely opposites. To be childlike is to hold on to the characteristics of childhood that are deeply human and permanent. That is feeding the soul. People of soul are always able to compassionately reach out to others, always wanting what is best for them, even before themselves. On the other hand, to be "childish" is to imitate a child's temporary

egocentric qualities that are immature and lack experience. Wisdom and experience teach us who to trust and, maybe, who not to, how we trust in God, how we hold the sense of wonder and awe, playfulness and joy – all using wisdom and experience without having had culture and society knock these childlike values out of us.
