6th August 2023 Transfiguration of Our Lord Psalter Week 2

Several times I have said Mass at this very place of Our Lord's Transfiguration. Each time is of course a wonderful experience. I like to offer similar important suggestions along with Jesus' command today coming from the very same spot. That is to <u>not</u> talk about any spiritual experiences received - especially from such a special time like a pilgrimage together - at least not too quickly. Why? Several reasons. As I mentioned last week, spiritual 'God-experience' goes beyond words, so to use words to describe the experience can easily weaken, trivialise or cheapen the whole thing. We cannot use words to describe God who is infinite, he is beyond words, so words will never do 'God-talk' any justice. Thus we talk of the "mystery" of faith. Neither can we really describe falling in love. Also beyond words. Again, there is a danger of others misinterpreting the experience if spoken about too quickly. Time is needed to absorb or internalise it. Wait patiently for its real meaning and essence to show itself or we mess up. If it's real, there will always be inner transformation, and this will show itself in action. No words would be needed.

Unwise, unspiritual or materialistic people may well want to mock you or your experience – it is so off their radar. It's all they can do. At best they will misinterpret. The only people who may appreciate what you are saying are the wise ones who know how to let-go of the many unspiritual illusions that we think make us happy. Not easy. They are the ones you can trust with these deeper realities.

Not talking about these things too quickly is Jesus' own command. Peter has a spiritual experience in today's Gospel, and Jesus' commands are clear – again possibly for the reasons I mention above. It's often known as "the Messianic Secret". For Jesus, all will make sense *after* the Resurrection, all the jig-saw pieces will fit together – and <u>only then</u>. Until then, say nothing, or run the risk of mockery, cheapening something precious, plus misinterpretation. You just feel when the time is right. We see Peter doing exactly this in our 2nd reading, which of course is some time after today's Gospel.

Words will never adequately describe real spiritual experience (except possibly in good poetry). Words can also tend to lead to dogmas and doctrines, which people argue about and divide over. History shows this. Paying attention to our inner experiences that bring about true transformation will do the

trick. No words, just experience, then action. No arguments needed. It's all too real. Maybe that's partly why "the Word" became flesh...

6th August 2023 Transfiguration of Our Lord Psalter Week 2

Several times I have said Mass at this very place of Our Lord's Transfiguration. Each time is of course a wonderful experience. I like to offer similar important suggestions along with Jesus' command today coming from the very same spot. That is to <u>not</u> talk about any spiritual experiences received - especially from such a special time like a pilgrimage together - at least not too quickly. Why? Several reasons. As I mentioned last week, spiritual 'God-experience' goes beyond words, so to use words to describe the experience can easily weaken, trivialise or cheapen the whole thing. We cannot use words to describe God who is infinite, he is beyond words, so words will never do 'God-talk' any justice. Thus we talk of the "mystery" of faith. Neither can we really describe falling in love. Also beyond words. Again, there is a danger of others misinterpreting the experience if spoken about too quickly. Time is needed to absorb or internalise it. Wait patiently for its real meaning and essence to show itself or we mess up. If it's real, there will always be inner transformation, and this will show itself in action. No words would be needed.

Unwise, unspiritual or materialistic people may well want to mock you or your experience – it is so off their radar. It's all they can do. At best they will misinterpret. The only people who may appreciate what you are saying are the wise ones who know how to let-go of the many unspiritual illusions that we think make us happy. Not easy. They are the ones you can trust with these deeper realities.

Not talking about these things too quickly is Jesus' own command. Peter has a spiritual experience in today's Gospel, and Jesus' commands are clear – again possibly for the reasons I mention above. It's often known as "the Messianic Secret". For Jesus, all will make sense *after* the Resurrection, all the jig-saw pieces will fit together – and <u>only then</u>. Until then, say nothing, or run the risk of mockery, cheapening something precious, plus misinterpretation. You just feel when the time is right. We see Peter doing exactly this in our 2nd reading, which of course is some time after today's Gospel.

Words will never adequately describe real spiritual experience (except possibly in good poetry). Words can also tend to lead to dogmas and doctrines, which people argue about and divide over. History shows this. Paying attention to our inner experiences that bring about true transformation will do the

trick. No words, just experience, then action. No arguments needed. It's all too real. Maybe that's partly why "the Word" became flesh...

6th August 2023 Transfiguration of Our Lord Psalter Week 2

Several times I have said Mass at this very place of Our Lord's Transfiguration. Each time is of course a wonderful experience. I like to offer similar important suggestions along with Jesus' command today coming from the very same spot. That is to <u>not</u> talk about any spiritual experiences received - especially from such a special time like a pilgrimage together - at least not too quickly. Why? Several reasons. As I mentioned last week, spiritual 'God-experience' goes beyond words, so to use words to describe the experience can easily weaken, trivialise or cheapen the whole thing. We cannot use words to describe God who is infinite, he is beyond words, so words will never do 'God-talk' any justice. Thus we talk of the "mystery" of faith. Neither can we really describe falling in love. Also beyond words. Again, there is a danger of others misinterpreting the experience if spoken about too quickly. Time is needed to absorb or internalise it. Wait patiently for its real meaning and essence to show itself or we mess up. If it's real, there will always be inner transformation, and this will show itself in action. No words would be needed.

Unwise, unspiritual or materialistic people may well want to mock you or your experience – it is so off their radar. It's all they can do. At best they will misinterpret. The only people who may appreciate what you are saying are the wise ones who know how to let-go of the many unspiritual illusions that we think make us happy. Not easy. They are the ones you can trust with these deeper realities.

Not talking about these things too quickly is Jesus' own command. Peter has a spiritual experience in today's Gospel, and Jesus' commands are clear – again possibly for the reasons I mention above. It's often known as "the Messianic Secret". For Jesus, all will make sense *after* the Resurrection, all the jig-saw pieces will fit together – and <u>only then</u>. Until then, say nothing, or run the risk of mockery, cheapening something precious, plus misinterpretation. You just feel when the time is right. We see Peter doing exactly this in our 2nd reading, which of course is some time after today's Gospel.

Words will never adequately describe real spiritual experience (except possibly in good poetry). Words can also tend to lead to dogmas and doctrines, which people argue about and divide over. History shows this. Paying attention to our inner experiences that bring about true transformation will do the

trick. No words, just experience, then action. No arguments needed. It's all too real. Maybe that's partly why "the Word" became flesh...

6th August 2023 Transfiguration of Our Lord Psalter Week 2

Several times I have said Mass at this very place of Our Lord's Transfiguration. Each time is of course a wonderful experience. I like to offer similar important suggestions along with Jesus' command today coming from the very same spot. That is to <u>not</u> talk about any spiritual experiences received - especially from such a special time like a pilgrimage together - at least not too quickly. Why? Several reasons. As I mentioned last week, spiritual 'God-experience' goes beyond words, so to use words to describe the experience can easily weaken, trivialise or cheapen the whole thing. We cannot use words to describe God who is infinite, he is beyond words, so words will never do 'God-talk' any justice. Thus we talk of the "mystery" of faith. Neither can we really describe falling in love. Also beyond words. Again, there is a danger of others misinterpreting the experience if spoken about too quickly. Time is needed to absorb or internalise it. Wait patiently for its real meaning and essence to show itself or we mess up. If it's real, there will always be inner transformation, and this will show itself in action. No words would be needed.

Unwise, unspiritual or materialistic people may well want to mock you or your experience – it is so off their radar. It's all they can do. At best they will misinterpret. The only people who may appreciate what you are saying are the wise ones who know how to let-go of the many unspiritual illusions that we think make us happy. Not easy. They are the ones you can trust with these deeper realities.

Not talking about these things too quickly is Jesus' own command. Peter has a spiritual experience in today's Gospel, and Jesus' commands are clear – again possibly for the reasons I mention above. It's often known as "the Messianic Secret". For Jesus, all will make sense *after* the Resurrection, all the jig-saw pieces will fit together – and <u>only then</u>. Until then, say nothing, or run the risk of mockery, cheapening something precious, plus misinterpretation. You just feel when the time is right. We see Peter doing exactly this in our 2nd reading, which of course is some time after today's Gospel.

Words will never adequately describe real spiritual experience (except possibly in good poetry). Words can also tend to lead to dogmas and doctrines, which people argue about and divide over. History shows this. Paying attention to our inner experiences that bring about true transformation will do the

trick. No words, just experience, then action. No arguments needed. It's all too real. Maybe that's partly why "the Word" became flesh...

6th August 2023 Transfiguration of Our Lord Psalter Week 2

Several times I have said Mass at this very place of Our Lord's Transfiguration. Each time is of course a wonderful experience. I like to offer similar important suggestions along with Jesus' command today coming from the very same spot. That is to <u>not</u> talk about any spiritual experiences received - especially from such a special time like a pilgrimage together - at least not too quickly. Why? Several reasons. As I mentioned last week, spiritual 'God-experience' goes beyond words, so to use words to describe the experience can easily weaken, trivialise or cheapen the whole thing. We cannot use words to describe God who is infinite, he is beyond words, so words will never do 'God-talk' any justice. Thus we talk of the "mystery" of faith. Neither can we really describe falling in love. Also beyond words. Again, there is a danger of others misinterpreting the experience if spoken about too quickly. Time is needed to absorb or internalise it. Wait patiently for its real meaning and essence to show itself or we mess up. If it's real, there will always be inner transformation, and this will show itself in action. No words would be needed.

Unwise, unspiritual or materialistic people may well want to mock you or your experience – it is so off their radar. It's all they can do. At best they will misinterpret. The only people who may appreciate what you are saying are the wise ones who know how to let-go of the many unspiritual illusions that we think make us happy. Not easy. They are the ones you can trust with these deeper realities.

Not talking about these things too quickly is Jesus' own command. Peter has a spiritual experience in today's Gospel, and Jesus' commands are clear – again possibly for the reasons I mention above. It's often known as "the Messianic Secret". For Jesus, all will make sense *after* the Resurrection, all the jig-saw pieces will fit together – and <u>only then</u>. Until then, say nothing, or run the risk of mockery, cheapening something precious, plus misinterpretation. You just feel when the time is right. We see Peter doing exactly this in our 2nd reading, which of course is some time after today's Gospel.

Words will never adequately describe real spiritual experience (except possibly in good poetry). Words can also tend to lead to dogmas and doctrines, which people argue about and divide over. History shows this. Paying attention to our inner experiences that bring about true transformation will do the

trick. No words, just experience, then action. No arguments needed. It's all too real. Maybe that's partly why "the Word" became flesh...
