Psalter Week 3

"But Father, I don't need to go to church to pray, I can pray at home....

Oh dear! Still today many people hold this seriously mistaken attitude. What happens if I just stay at home? Our private thoughts so easily drift in to fantasy without us knowing it. Our prayer becomes unfocussed. We remain unchallenged, become spiritually withdrawn, spiritually not stretched, and unfulfilled.

Going to Church grounds us. We realise we are part of other peoples' lives, they can take us beyond our private little cocooned selves, to realise that there is something wonderfully bigger going on. We begin to see ourselves as part of a wholeness of all God's people – the Body of Christ. How can we do this if we just stay at home? A good community will be steadying, have a good rhythm, a routine and regularity that can be so calming. Our lives take on a fresh meaning, and purpose, because of other people and mutual needs. Together we reinforce and strengthen each other as Christ's Body. Of course, arguments, fall-outs happen, breaking down community life. They need correction and reconciliation, which, when authentic, is so powerful. It strengthens and restores community life.

"Where two or three meet in my name, I am there with them" – two or more people equal community. Jesus is clearly pushing community involvement over the individual. The therapy of being part of church community life, with all its inherent wonderfulness and, sometimes, silly behaviours of some, according to some studies, results in people largely being steadier, emotionally healthier and less obsessed.

We see why gossip and tittle-tattle are so evil, they utterly destroy community life and reputations. (By the way, most people who pride themselves on not being gossips are often the biggest ones of all. They just can't or daren't believe it of themselves).

Who knows how much we help each other by our prayerful presence in community. It certainly happens. Can all this happen if we stay at home?

So we see why going to church, and going weekly has its importance. Does our example encourage others to go to church and feel part of community?

SVP Conference Report 2022-2023

Our Conference

Our Lady of Ransom Rayleigh Conference was started in 1932 and has been active ever since, undertaking a range of work in the Parish, Hockley and Rochford. We undertake this work within and outside the Catholic community.

We currently have 8 active members plus 3 auxiliary (non-visiting) members. Members attend the fortnightly meetings and undertake to visit those in need and to offer help and friendship without discrimination. New members are always welcome.

We also provided 60 cash grants, 1 energy grant, 1 electrical appliance, help with household repairs, shopping and transport, including to/from Mass, on 89 occasions. Hopeworx food bank again received our full support. 80 food parcels were obtained and delivered, mainly to families.

Highlights of the Year

As the cost-of-living crisis has developed we have been happy to be able to provide support for more young families. Small gifts have been given to our beneficiaries at Easter and Christmas. Going forward, we are now in a position to resume our tea parties for beneficiaries and other elderly parishioners.
