OUR LADY OF RANSOM

26th November 2023 Christ the King A - Psalter Week 2



Sam was not a very nice person. He died and went to hell. He was missed by old friends. His work's manager went to hell's gates to see if he could bring him back. He pleaded profusely, no luck. So his football captain went to hell's gates, he begged that he may play football for one more season. No joy. His parish priest went and declared that he wasn't that bad, so please give him another chance! Nothing. Many others did the same at hell's gates, begging Satan to *let him out*. Still no joy. Then his mother went. She spoke no word of his release. Quietly, and with a sense of inner authority, she said to Satan, *let me in*. The gates opened, and immediately she found herself redeeming her son. Only love can penetrate the gates of hell and redeem the lost.

Perhaps this image may help us understand Jesus' own descent into hell, enticing us away from any choice of personal destruction. Our God is <u>so</u> loving that he will wait for however much time it takes, he will suffer painfully with us, (compassion) until we make a choice for Him.

Our Jesus, as Christ the King, during his earthly ministry, walked among the poorest, most sick, most underprivileged and brought so many out of the hell they were experiencing.

If an alien were to come to earth and ask where our Jesus is, would you point this creature to a palace, or a cathedral or basilica? No; you would point him to rather odd sanctuaries such as slums, refugee camps, back alleys, prisons, hospitals. And you would add, those who are the blessed of God are also found there, following Our Lord, feeding, welcoming, clothing, visiting and being attentive to so many needs. Judged on our treatment on human needs, not on religious piety. How we are to the least of our sisters and brothers — Jesus totally and unequivocally identifying Himself with the most underprivileged. Ground breaking for His time when people thought otherwise. This is a key comment Our Lord makes on Last Judgement. And we see the criteria for entry to Heaven. How do we respond?

In other words, to go to Heaven, we may well need a letter of reference from the Poorest of the Poor.

To experience God's overwhelming love creates our own Heaven, where, like the mother above, there is the desire to enter other people's hell, following Our Lord in enticing them away from it. Not just a call at the gates or from a distance. Yes, rolling up our sleeves and going in.

Our loving Christ is redeeming <u>"everything - everyone"</u> and infinitely waits patiently for everyone to true desire for Redemption. Surely that is why he is Christ <u>the Eternal King</u>, the Servant King of the Universe.

'Each of us has a mission. Each of us is called to change the world'.


That is as true today as it was 10 years ago and it will still be true tomorrow. The Missio family helps Churches too poor or too young to support themselves, and you play a major part in that.


