Psalter Week 2



Do you feel special? Empowered? Chosen? I hope so, especially if your faith is authentic. God chooses many people, in the Bible and today. Are they more worthy? No. Or more superior? No. Or better? No. In fact "chosen" whether people from the Bible, great Saints, our heroes, all are *flawed, ordinary* people – just like us. (Of course except Jesus and Our Lady who were without sin.)

Being chosen means to *communicate "chosenness" to everybody else*. To lead people to a depth to which you have been led. You can only lead others as far as you have gone. How can you genuinely communicate to someone that they are special until you know it strongly for yourself? Once you know it for yourself, (your own "quick egocentric fix" if you like), then you stop worrying about being centre stage and give plenty of time and energy to promote other people's specialness or chosenness.

To be chosen implies big responsibility. God needs usable images of himself to pass himself on. The stuff of real faith. To know that you are a beloved child of God so you can pass on that belovedness to others. God calls Jesus *his beloved Son*. And Jesus beautifully passes on that belovedness to everyone else. Hence the cross. Nothing for himself, everything for everyone else, especially the "sinner".

To think He loves us (even more) in our own brokenness and sinfulness. Wow!

Such chosenness is always *inclusive* - or religion becomes smug and exclusionary - always excluding the apparent *non-chosen, unworthy* or *impure*. Does that need much proof? Religion becomes a belonging system, everything Jesus instructs us *not* to do, instead of good news, specialness or chosenness for the world.

The main difference between Jesus and ourselves is that Jesus knew his chosenness definitively. He knew his *beloved* status. And we hear God affirming that today and are told to listen to Him and Jesus beautifully communicates that to us all. We are <u>in fact</u> beloved Daughters and Sons of God too. But be honest, do we <u>really</u> believe that? Do we <u>really</u> recognise that truth? Do we <u>really</u> listen? It would

be life-transforming if we did. And then we help

transform others.

Isn't that worth it?


