21st April 2024 - Easter 4B – Good Shepherd (Vocations) Sunday Psalter Week 4

Abusive and foul language - the drunken yob is disturbing the peace. The police are called. Using force to try and stop and arrest him, he only hurls even more abuse back. Suddenly "sir" appears. "Sir" is a well- respected and loved retired teacher who taught this young man. Loving with discipline, he would discipline the children with love. No surprise -he had fewer discipline problems.

"Gerry, come on young man, and let's get you home" sir says. "Good evening sir" says Gerry, he apologises to everyone and 'sir 'calmly escorts him home. Do we prefer force or authority?

Clearly there is a big difference between using force and using authority. Using force can increase negative energies, sending us deeper into our fears and anxieties. Look at some of the political leaders in our world today who use force. Look at their peoples. Do we need more proof? Sir", on the other hand, had authority, an authority that came from within. Authority is the ability to "author" other people's lives, to help people write the direction of, and find meaning to their lives. Leadership, service, authoring with respect and dignity.

This is Jesus' way. Watch Jesus carefully. He never appeals to other priestly/rabbinical authority; never to other sacred texts, nor to anyone else – and certainly never force. His power and truth come from within, from his life-style. A life-style that simply reflects – truth. And pure goodness. He is simply - the Good Shepherd. Shepherding us, tough yet tender; discipline yet love.

Power without or outside the Holy Spirit becomes force, domination, oppression. Again, look at some world leaders. And their peoples. Where is the Holy Spirit in this scenario?

Power inside and with the Holy Spirit becomes service, authority, leadership, truth. Look at Jesus. Or sir, maybe. The Holy Spirit alive and active.

Life-style must reflect this Jesus-authority - Good shepherd authority.

The Jesus-authority is the authority that casts out demons, calms abusive people down, an authority that can surprise others. Service and true leadership. An authority that enables people to come alive,

excited with life's opportunities and with life itself. Don't be surprised at the authority we can have with other people's lives, when our life-style simply reflects – Good Shepherd life-style.
