

Psalter Week 3



Politics comes from the old Greek word *polis*,(where we also get 'police' from) which means public forum, people coming together. By the way, I am <u>not</u> addressing *partisan politics* here, which would be about labour/conservative/lib-dem issues etc. but the real essence of politics with religion.

The wise French poet Charles Peguy brilliantly said" it all begins in mysticism and ends in politics" Wow! In other words, it all begins with deep movements of the soul and ends in how we act in the world. But - does the world go backwards? Do we start with politics and then try to fit any religion in, and then use religion to bolster our position? If that's true, could this be why political power is often corrupt? Shouldn't any engagement in politics be rooted in God's love? Would that stance improve things? I suspect so. And drastic improvements I strongly suspect.

Jesus' way did not fit into any conventional political system of his day. Yet he clearly had a political system which looked to radical social and economic transformations, rooted in the Father's love, for both in his time, and for all times. What if politics today was rooted in the Father's love?

How can we possibly be agents of transformation in our world without being somehow political, engaging in civic matters? Those who remain silent are actually saying something. Their silence actually either affirms or criticises the status quo. So, we cannot be non-political. Silence often supports hugely unjust systems, from human trafficking, to the unjust treatment of the poor. Lenin called these silent people *useful idiots*, and used them to get what he wanted, knowing they would say nothing. Many useful-*idiot-Christians* are not even aware they are being manipulated in this way, simply for the purposes of getting unjust issues (that give leaders even more despotic power), enshrined into law. We see it all over.

Are any of us church goers "useful idiots'? We must use the power of the Gospel to affirm and criticise both the left and the right in our political system, this is starting with the heart where we experience God's love, moving forward into political civic engagement. What if our political leaders everywhere operated this way? Then, and only then, would we witness a fairer, more just political system

Children's Liturgy Appeal - please read

We are appealing for people to consider coming forward as leaders, so that we are able to continue providing two age group sessions on a weekly basis.

Our aim each week is to help the children to engage with the Gospel in a way that is meaningful in their lives.

We read the Gospel in age appropriate language, and spend time exploring its message through talking, sometimes music, and a variety of activities.

We have 2 groups:

- 1) Younger group age 3 years up to school year 2. We ask that children come independently, after a settling in session or two, as this enables the group to focus.
- 2) Older group school years 3 to 6.

Each group has 2 adults in the room - a leader and an assistant -so that requires 4 adults per week for the rota. This is why we need to expand our team, to share the load.

To be a leader, you don't need to be a teacher, or be a parent or an expert on the Bible.....you just need an enthusiasm to share Jesus' message.

We especially need leaders, but assistants are also welcome. Committing to one Sunday per month in term time would make a huge difference to our team.

We would love to diversify our team – it's good for our children to see both male and female leaders. For example, young adults would be such a good role model for our children.

We have a wealth of our own resources to give ideas, and we can direct you to trusted online resources too. You would not be alone, you would be well supported and eased in. You would be able to choose the age group you feel comfortable working with. Perhaps you might even consider doing this in a pair, with a friend.

We know that the children and young people are the future of the church......but you can't be the future unless you are fully part of the present.

We should be so grateful if you would think about this....pray about this.....and if you have any thoughts or questions, please come and talk to any of the team, without any pressure. (or call/text 07801 888787)

It has been both my and Linda's absolute pleasure to have had the opportunity to share our faith with the children of our parish, many of whom bring their own children now. We are not teachers. We are members of the parish who believe that leading the children in prayer and explaining the Sunday Gospel in a way that captures their attention and speaks directly to them, and most importantly allows them to express their thoughts, questions and prayer requests, is essential. We have found joy in sharing our faith with the children of our parish.

Please consider leading the children. You gain as much from them as they do from you and there are many occasions to smile with some of their innocent comments and accounts.

"I want to pray for my nanny."

I asked if she was ill.

"No she's dead."

"No she is out of her wheelchair and better now!"


